Trade Meet Worried by Farm Tariffs

GENEVA, Nov. 30 (AP)—Trade ministers of the 44 member nations of the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade have agreed to express "great concern" over the continued resistance of agricultural protection, it was reported today.

Indonesian sources said the ministers, who would open a four-day conference today, agreed to express their concern over the continued resistance to reduction of agricultural protection.

The communiqué approved by the ministers was to be released in Geneva today. It includes a two-page annex on ways and means of promoting trade among developing countries.

They said the ministers were worried that the tariff reductions could be continued but that the trade ministers "across-the-board" tariff reductions have not been achieved.

There was some doubt about the position of the United States, where a strong protectionist lobby opposes any change in the tariff structure.

U. N. Ignores U. S., Passes Atom Motion

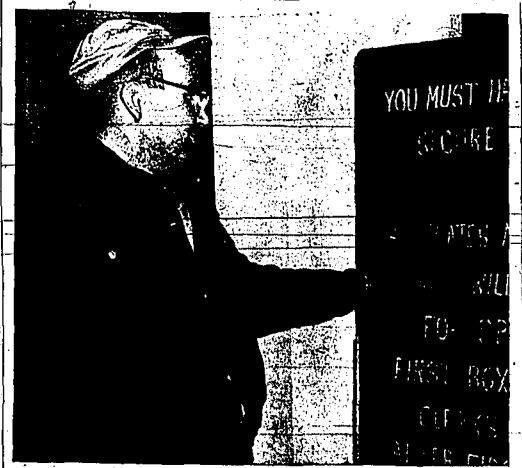

Top U.S., British Delegates Depart Nuclear Ban Talks

GENEVA, Nov. 30 (AP)—The top American and British delegates at the nuclear test ban talks have decided to return home Friday but will leave their deputies to continue the deadlocked conference.

Deputy U.S. representative Arthur H. Dean of the United States and British Minister of State Joseph Goshaw came to today's third session of the continued presence. Officially, Dean is returning to Washington for consultations with the government.

Deputy U.S. representative Arthur H. Dean is returning to New York to resume his post as head of the British delegation at the test ban talks.

The Western side believes the Soviet Union has this time rejected the location on its territory of an international machinery to control nuclear weapons.

Neither American nor British officials would say that the Western delegates' departure resulted from the Soviet refusal to continue meeting Russia's demand for a three-year-old negotiations now deemed to failure in their present form.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 30.—The Republican right, as represented by Sen. Henry Goldwater of R. Ariz., has become a prime political target for the Kennedy administration.

Goldwater drew fire Wednesday from President Kennedy and Vice President Landon B. Johnson.

Kennedy struck back in his new conference at Goldwater's opposition to giving the President broad powers to negotiate tariff agreements with respect to the European common market.

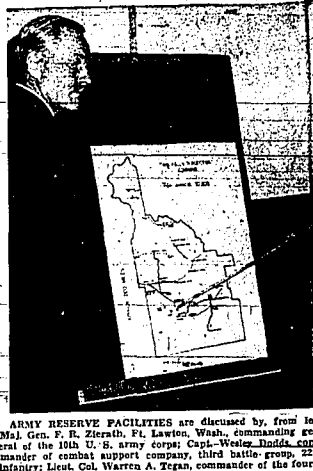
Without specifically naming Goldwater, Kennedy said in a Philadelphia audience that those who are demanding total victory in the cold war should be "frankly" whether they mean we should declare war against the Soviet Union or whether we should declare war against the Soviet Union.

While these same-day assaults on Goldwater's views by the two chief Democratic candidates may have coincided only by accident, they seemed to indicate the mounting case for worried by the Arizona senator concerning a rising tide of conservatism.

If this tide is running, it may threaten several key administration proposals for the next session of congress. These include broad tariff authority, school aid and a number of the Southwest.

Neither Kennedy nor Johnson has made any public attempt to link Goldwater with the political "extremists" both have denounced. "But they have implied that some of his views are similar to those held by the extremists of the far right fringe."

Goldwater is said to be careful to avoid being identified closely with these groups. Nevertheless, many of their members look to him as a potential 1964 presidential candidate to their liking.

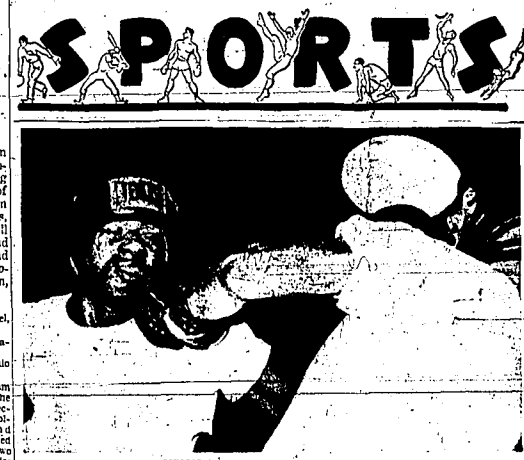

East German Spy School Offers 2-Semester Course

WASHINGTON, Nov. 30—On the outskirts of East Berlin stands one of East Germany's most exclusive training schools, called the "school of administration."

There are 60 students. Classes run six days a week from 8 a. m. to 5:30 p. m. with a lunch-break on Sunday morning there are compulsory sports. Lights are out at 11 p. m.

The first six months are devoted to politics, history of communism, and the class structure of foreign countries.

The second semester is devoted to lock-picking, making copies of

keys, clandestine photographs, wire-tapping and "dead letter drops"—the placement and pickup of intelligence material.

The final exam includes carrying off two secret meetings in East Berlin with Soviet agents, instructors, and taking and developing pictures of secret installations.

The school, according to a state department report released Tuesday, is the training center for East Germany's main administration for intelligence (HVA) of the ministry for state security.

Since the school opened in 1961 it has graduated about 120

agents, the report said. To prepare them for operating in any social circle, pupils are lectured on etiquette, literature, architecture and religion. There also are classes in English, driving, military training and hand-to-hand fighting.

The state department report, released to newsmen, charged that in addition to HVA graduates East Germany has become a "training ground for almost every espionage organization operating in the communist world."

Russia, Czechoslovakia, Hungary, Poland, Romania, Bulgaria, North Korea and Red China all have their own intelligence networks there.

"The state department said East Germany is a training and dispatching area" for agents operating in Europe, Africa, the Middle
