WASHINGTON, Dec. 4 (UPI)—As an unidentified person passed to Europe for Mildred Paperman, secretary to imprisoned Bernard Goldfine, without her consent and then tipped federal authorities, it was learned today. The disclosure came in U. S. district court where Goldfine and Miss Paperman admitted she smuggled letters to him at the federal correctional institution in Lansing, Conn. They were brought into court on charges of violating probation imposed on both when they were convicted of tax evasion.
