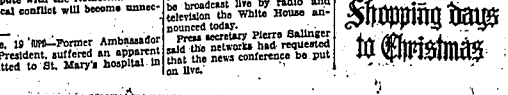

### Senate Group Plans Congo Check Act

WASHINGTON, Dec. 10 (AP)—The administration appears to be going to have to defend the Congo check act in the Senate on Wednesday.

Although chairman J. W. Fulbright, D. Ark., holds any growing division of opinion among foreign relations committee members and other committee members today toward the Congo check act, the majority questioning of Secretary of State Dean Rusk on the Congo check act is not expected.

### Test Looming In Ruling of Teacher Law

BOISE, Dec. 10 (AP)—Court action is expected today to determine the legality of a 1961 teacher retirement law which Ailsy Gen. Frank L. Benson has ruled unconstitutional.

The trustees of the Teachers Retirement System named Willie Sullivan, a Boise attorney, to prosecute the action, which Benson had previously warned may be carried clear to the U.S. supreme court.

The law provides for the use of school endowment funds for retirement of the teachers in the retirement system. Earnings from the endowment funds would provide the state's share of the retirement system contributions.

The money thus used would then be replaced by appropriations from the legislature.

The enactment of the legislation was suggested by Gov. Robert E. Smylie on grounds it would make unnecessary the accumulation of life reserves by the retirement system.

In making the proposal to determine the legality of the 1961 legislation, Smylie said the law should be tested in the courts. He said he believed the courts would uphold the law. But Benson declared the law unconstitutional and in a memorandum to members of the retirement system trustees advised against a lawsuit because of its cost.

It is said it could cost up to \$10,000 and could be carried into the federal courts because the law is contrary to the Idaho admission act which specifies how endowment funds can be used.

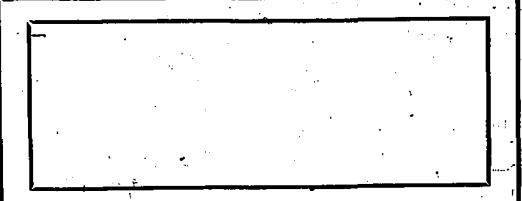

# Election Set In Texas for Vacant Seat

DONHAM, Tex., Dec. 19 (AP)—Voters in the second smallest congressional district in the state will pick one of six candidates to fill the vacant seat Saturday.

Speaker Sam Rayburn, of whom it will be the first time in almost a half-century that Rayburn's name will not be on the ballot in the fourth congressional district.

It was first elected to the post on July 7, 1914, at the age of 23 and served continuously until his death from cancer last Nov. 16.

Conner Harrington, 36, a young sheep farmer who said his main aim in congress would be to "help prevent the country from sliding into socialism" is the only Republican in the field.

The Democrats are State Sen. B. H. McMillin, 48, McKinney; H. C. Slagle, Jr., 51, Roy Baker, 47, and David Brown, 41, all 1936 winners from Deco.

Most of the Democratic candidates also indicate they are conservatives. Roberts and Slagle, who have been endorsed by organized labor in the area, are considered the strongest candidates.

### WCTU Says Stanford Has Whisky Plan

EVANSTON, Ill., Dec. 16 (AP)—The National Women's Christian Temperance union has threatened Stanford university to probe alleged faculty and student participation in a "whisky and liquor" telegraph sales scheme.

Mrs. Fred J. Toose said an associate calling himself "American Beverage Delivery" claimed to have linked 800 U.S. liquor stores in the scheme to exchange telegraphic orders, circumventing normal bans on sending liquor through the mail.

The delivery is said to be the subsidiary of a highly financed investment company managed by some (Stanford) faculty members and students and obviously tied to liquor consumption, Mrs. Toose said.

### Red Korea Flays U.N. Debate Plan

SEOUL, Dec. 16 (AP)—Communist North Korea today formally rejected the United Nations invitation to take part in a debate on the Korean unification question and said it would "declare null and void" any resolutions the U. N. may adopt during the debate.

The rejection came in an official North Korean foreign ministry statement to acting U. N. Secretary General Thant. N. delegations "as an official record."

## Tips Given on Fire Safety During Christmas Season

Several suggestions for fire safety during the Christmas holidays were reported Friday by Twin Falls Fire Chief L. Z. Bartlett.

He noted that over 50 million dollars will be spent by persons throughout the nation for Christmas trees. A tree containing natural resins which ignite easily and burn readily if proper precautions are not taken.

Trees should not be set close to stairways because a stairway could be used as an exit from upper floors. The Christmas tree selected should be freshly cut and should be kept outside and standing in a pail of water, so it will remain fresh until just before Christmas.

The tree should be placed in a cool section of the room, as far as possible from radiators, heaters and the fireplace. It should be placed in a water container filled daily with water. Christmas tree decorations should be flameproof.

Electric lights should be set up away from the tree because sparks from the tree could ignite dry pine needles. Only electric lights should be used to decorate the tree. Those with frayed wires should be discarded and lights should be turned off when no one is at home.

"How far medical science has moved toward the complete control of cancer can only be estimated," Dr. Henry F. Randall, medical director of Memorial hospital, said Monday.

Randall's estimate of an actual 33 per cent cure rate refers to patients who had experienced no recurrence of the disease, a spokesman said.

**TWIST CAKE (Serves 12)**

 1 package deluxe chocolate mint, cake mix  
**FILLING**  
 3 ounces cream cheese

 7 cups sifted confectioners' sugar  
 1/2 cup cream or milk

Cut cake in half lengthwise to form 2 strips, each 15x2 1/2 inches.

A maid at the Brooks home said she thought the man was a photographer. He may have been a secret service agent.

But Joey won't be around much longer. The maid said the Brooks planned to move in a few days to a new home several miles north of here.

### Industrialist Meets Heavy Federal Fine

BOSTON, Dec. 19 (AP) — Industrialist Burt A. Goldfine has paid a \$10,000 fine, apparently in a move to smooth the way for a possible parole next month.

Attorney Burton L. Williams turned the money in the form of checks over to John A. Cavanaugh, clerk of U.S. district court here yesterday.

The fine and a year in jail were part of a sentence imposed against Goldfine last June 8 for evading \$100,000 in taxes. He also was given a suspended 18 months sentence and placed on probation five years.

Goldfine is now serving his one year jail term and can make a new bid for parole in 10 months. His last effort to win parole was rejected.

He and his secretary, Miss Mildred Pepperman, must appear in court Jan. 2 for violating probation. This involved smuggling letters into Danbury, Conn., federal correctional institution where he was confined until last week. He has been moved to the New York City hospital because of illness.

It is possible that Goldfine will have his probation revoked, forcing him to serve a longer term.

### Service Predicts Record Births

WASHINGTON, Dec. 19 (AP) — There was a decline in births in 1960 but the public health service thinks there may be a record number of babies born this year.

In 1960, there were 4,207,850 births registered, about 4,000 fewer than in 1959, said the service. The service, in announcing the 1960 births Monday, said information indicates there will be appreciably more births in 1961 than in 1960 and probably as many as in 1957 — 4,306,000 — which is the record year.

### Fire Cause

NEW YORK, Dec. 19 (AP) — The fire in the subbasement of the Times Tower that took three lives Nov. 22 probably was caused by careless smoking, Fire Commissioner Edward F. Cavanaugh, Jr., says.

Cavanaugh said Monday that investigation showed the blaze started in a toy showroom. A woman employee, according to the investigation report, had been smoking while putting stove animals into cellophane bags.

CHICAGO, Dec. 19 (AP) — A Christmas tree brightens up a home in the yuletide season—but it also can be dangerous, says the American Medical Association.

The AMA issued these tips Monday for making the family Christmas tree less hazardous.

The tree should be placed at a safe distance from the heat of a fireplace.

All lights should be checked for safety and placed so their heat doesn't burn decorations or gifts.

Lights should be turned off overnight or when no one is at home.

Evergreen trees are composed of combustible resins and pitch, the AMA said, and should be anchored in a water-filled pan or bucket.
