U. S. Believes Case Possible For U.S. Reds

WASHINGTON, Dec. 21 (AP)—Justice department officials apparently had a case today against each member of the U. S. communist party—about 10,000 persons by FBI estimate.

By the time the zero hour was reached at midnight Wednesday, not one of them had come forward to register as an agent of a foreign power, the Soviet Union, as required by the internal security act, the department reported.

But a spokesman indicated the justice department planned to study the situation carefully before suing against the individual party members.

There still was the possibility that some members may have mailed in registration forms before the deadline. But department officials, noting repeated declarations by party officers that they would not comply with the act, said they expected no such filing.

If convicted, each member could be fined \$10,000 and sentenced to five years in prison for each day of violation.

French Accuse Ex-Legionnaire Of Red Spying

U.S. Revokes Cuba Export Firm Permits

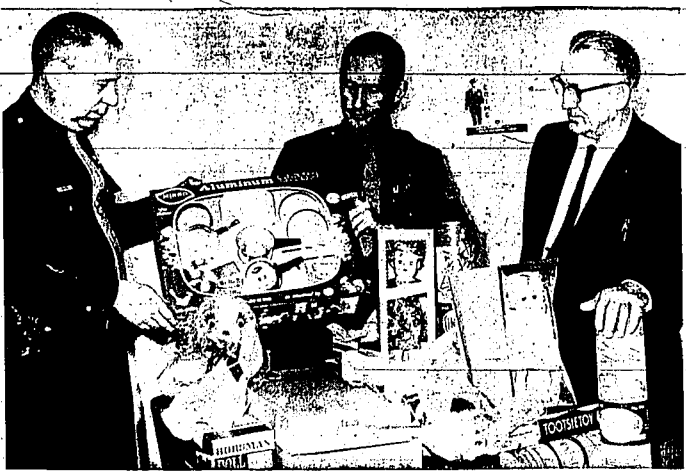
WASHINGTON, Dec. 21 (AP)—The government has moved to halt illegal shipments of U. S. military parts and equipment and license parts and equipment to Cuba after established goods to Cuba through Mexico.

The Commerce department issued a 90-day export suspension order yesterday against five Cuban firms and a Texas businessman. The United States has banned all exports to Cuba, except foods, medicines and medical supplies.

The orders covered three unrelated series of transactions totaling \$200,000 worth of goods which actually reached Cuba and \$400,000 worth which has been seized in Mexico or returned to the United States.

The department said Emde and Export company, Calle, North Hollywood, Calif., Inc. North Hollywood, Calif., Inc. and operated by Victor Mendez Rodriguez, a Mexican national, has been supplying substantial quantities of U. S. military parts and equipment for transportation to Cuba.

The other shipments, the department said, involved marine equipment, aircraft parts and automotive equipment, and were made by a vice president of Transcontinental S. A., of Mexico City, and a vice president of Aero Distribuidora, Mexico City. Aero Distribuidora, S. A.; Cia Impulsora Mexicana, S. A.; and Impulsora B. A.

Death Stops Hart's Career At Age of 57

PALEO SPRINGS, Calif., Dec. 21 (AP)—The playright and actor Hart, a child of poverty who could have written nothing more remarkable than his own success story, is dead of a heart attack.

Hart, whose genius brought him fame as the actor in "The Great White Way," collapsed Wednesday at his winter home in his death resort.

Hart, 57, had been suffering from his jaw and was going to have an operation. Mr. Hart was walking in his car when he fell straight back," said his agent, Irving Lantz. "He was taken to the house and the doctor came to give artificial respiration and an injection. But Mr. Hart did not respond."

His death came only six months after that of George S. Kaufman, with whom he collaborated on such classic theater comedies as "The Men Who Came to Dinner" and the Pulitzer Prize-winning "You Can't Take a Sissy Home." Hart had been director of such Broadway musical successes as "Camelot" and "My Fair Lady," both of which ran since 1954.

This was his third heart attack. He had been ill several days, but that seemed to be troubling him.

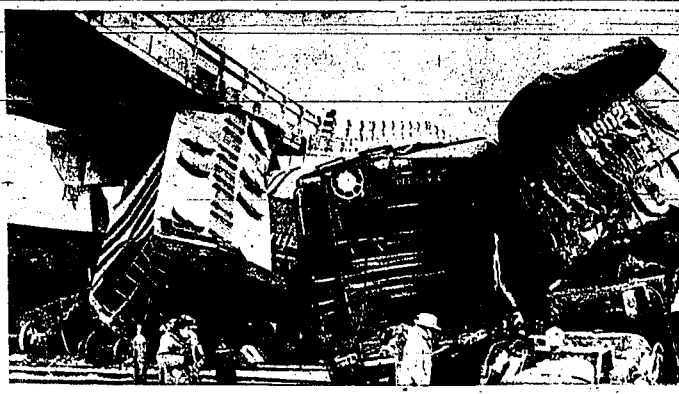

X15 Testing Controls for Space Flight

EDWARDS AIR FORCE BASE, Calif., Dec. 21—A third X15 rocket plane has taken to the air and made the first test of air controls for space flight.

The X15A-1, a modification of the U.S. space agency flew the ship at 2,544 miles per hour and to an altitude of 83,600 feet in an 11-minute mid-air flight Wednesday.

There was no attempt to go higher or faster. The two other X15s hold the world records for both speed and altitude.

The flight tested a computer-like device that automatically operates jets in the nose and wings to correct deviations in space flight faster than a man can think. Hereafter the pilot will be able to operate the controls manually. They are needed because of the rare atmosphere at high altitudes. Armstrong expressed satisfaction with the performance.

Red Chinese Say Push Arms Race

TOKYO, Dec. 21—Communists in China today said the most important thing for newly independent countries is "definitely not disarmament but to build up, expand and strengthen their armed forces."

"The Chinese government supports the proposals for universal disarmament," it added. "But it calls for disarmament without denouncing U.S. imperialism as the ring-leader will not bring the masses into action to struggle for disarmament."

The declaration of policy was made Monday by the Chinese delegate to the communist-dominated World Peace Council in Stockholm, Liu Ning-yi.

Atlas Failure Ends Attempt On Sour Note

CAPE CANAVERAL, Dec. 21 (AP)—A monkey-see-in-the-Atlantic ocean and two other shots that missed largely by hundreds of miles closed out 1961 on a distinctly sour note for the U. S. Atlas rocket program.

"Scrabbed" a four-pound Rheas monkey, was given up for dead yesterday after a 15-hour search by the South Atlantic failed to locate the capsule that carried him 5,000 miles through space aboard an Atlas.

Last night, the air force missed the mark again with a so-called "quick-thing" model of the Atlas. The 48-foot rocket fell far short of its planned target more than 5,000 miles away in what probably was the last test of the year for the famed ICBM program.

It was the second straight mishap for the "F" series of Atlas missiles. A similar rocket launched here Dec. 12, which the defense department called a success—actually missed its target by more than 500 miles, it was learned yesterday.

Brazil Opposes Anti-Castro Act

RIO DE JANEIRO, Dec. 21 (AP)—Foreign Minister Eurico Dutra reacted with opposition to collective action against Fidel Castro's Cuba yesterday, was announced last night.

The text of a statement made "in the record" by Dutra at a luncheon given by newsmen covering the foreign ministry was made public.

The foreign minister also confirmed that President Jose Goulart will visit the United States and Mexico in February.

Former Korean Officials Hang

SEOUL, Korea, Dec. 21 (AP)—Choi Inkyoo, 43, home minister under former President Syngman Rhee, and four others were hanged today. They had been convicted on charges ranging from political terrorism to pro-communist activities.

Those who went to the gallows with Choi were Cho Yong-soo, 31, a newspaper publisher accused of pro-communist activity; Choi Paik-kun, 47, another leftist; Kwak Jung-joo, 39, another bodyguard for Rhee, and Lim Hwa-soo, 40, a hoodlum leader close to Rhee.

Nation Expected To Host Meeting

MONTEVIDEO, Uruguay, Dec. 21 (AP)—The government was expected today to announce that Uruguay is willing to serve as the site of the international foreign ministers' meeting scheduled to start Jan. 10.

At least seven of the nine members of the executive council, including President Eduardo V. Herra, are known to be in favor of the move.

The principal question remaining to be settled is whether the meeting should be held in Montevideo or in Punta del Este, a resort city about 100 miles away. Several councilmen are believed to favor Punta as the site.

Injuries Rise

BOULDER, Dec. 21 (AP)—Idaho's law enforcement department reports that injuries resulting from traffic accidents are increasing more rapidly than are fatalities.

In 1959, the agency said, injuries numbered 5,200. That was the year the state set its record of 270 deaths. This year the number injured reached 6,800, at the end of the 11 months although the death toll at that time was 240.

Minister Dies in Headon Accident

REUBENS, Dec. 21 (AP)—The Rev. Floyd W. Chapman, Moscow, became Idaho's 256th traffic fatality of 1961 when his car and another collided head-on on country road.

Chapman, about 40, was traveling secretary for the Idaho Institute of Christian education with headquarters at the University of Idaho.

Driver of the other car was C. W. Patterson, Reubens. Patterson and his two sons, Joseph, 10, and Billy, 6, were injured as was Haywood Merritt, Moscow, a passenger in the Chapman car.

The fire broke out 10 minutes before midnight at the star of the show, Line Renaud, prepared to mount a tango for the grand finale of the night's second performance entitled "Pleasures."

They were hurt by the falling scenery. Dancers, wardrobe mistresses, mannikins, actors and actresses—many of them clad only in brief costumes—gathered in the cafe across the street to watch flames from five stories pump water into the building.

The blaze was extinguished after about an hour.

The variety theater's safety curtain was rung down and the showgoers—who had been watching a show similar to the one held at the famed Folies Bergeres—were escorted out safely.

Police investigators said the fire was caused by a short circuit in a stage light.

County Pays For Judge's Conditioner

KENOSHA, Wis., Dec. 21 (U.P.)—The long and frequently heated controversy over the county judge's air conditioner has come to a quiet close Tuesday night. The county board approved the \$100 payment due.

Judge Boda ordered the air conditioner for his chambers in Kenosha to be installed in the 90s. The board refused to pay for the conditioner. Boda ordered the bill sent to the board anyway.

A month later, Judge Boda's County Clerk Richard Bode refused to pay the bill. Boda, who refused to pay the bill, called Lindgren, then threatened to jail the sheriff. The sheriff then released Lindgren on a writ of habeas corpus from another judge.

The state attorney general eventually intervened and the state supreme court took jurisdiction. Upholding Judge Boda's authority in the contempt citation, the high court then ordered the county to pay for the conditioner. The high court then returned the matter to Kenosha county, where early this year the board again refused to pay for the cooler.

Boda then ordered the entire bill to court to show cause why it should not be required to pay. The case was transferred to another judge, who found for Boda and ordered the board to pay the bill. The board then ordered the court again.

This time the high court ruled that the county had waived its right to appeal and the order stood.

U.N. Heavily Criticized for Katanga Action, but Most Members Support It

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y., Dec. 21 (U.P.)—Waves of criticism washed against the United Nations in the wake of its armed action to bring Katanga under control, but the organization's 113 members supported the move.

Supporters include the 50-nation African-African bloc, many of them small nations but ranging up to India.

Britain, France, Belgium and other nations with a financial and political stake in Katanga's future have protested over various aspects of the bold initiative that the U.N. secretariat under U.N. Thant has taken in the last two weeks.

Thant's actions also have aroused some members of congress and some American civil organizations, but the Kennedy administration has backed the U.N. operation down the line.

President Dwight D. Eisenhower did from the day the Congo crisis erupted 17 months ago.

The U.S. support of both Thant and the late Dag Hammarskjöld, in dealing with the Congo has placed it at odds with its Western allies more than once.

Diplomats note, however, that none of the dissenters called a security council meeting to halt aggression. The charter sets up a military staff committee, consisting of the joint chiefs of the five permanent council members to assist the U.N. on matters involving peace and security.

Much congressional criticism appears to stem from fear that the U. N. has embarked on a policy that could plunge the Congo still further into chaos and pave the way for a communist takeover.

The U. S. delegation tried to get the security council to authorize action not just against Katanga but against any rebellious movement including that threatened by Soviet-backed Antoine Gizenga in the Congo's Oriental province. The Soviets vetoed the proposal.



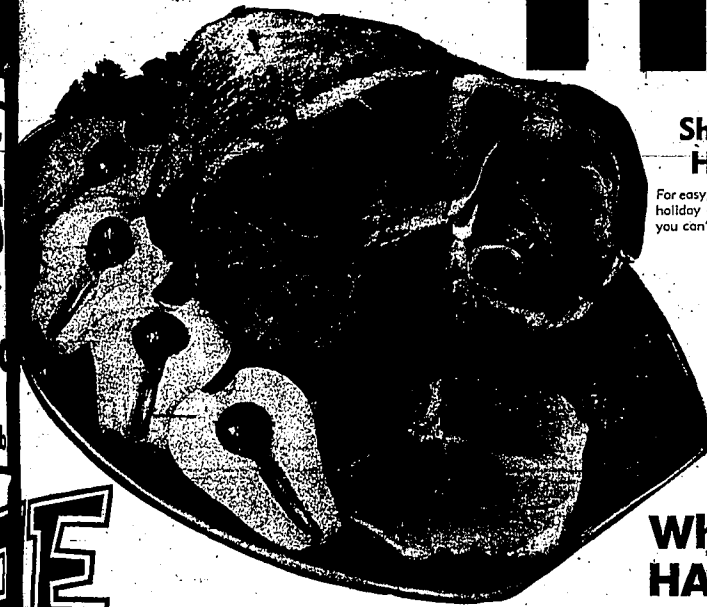

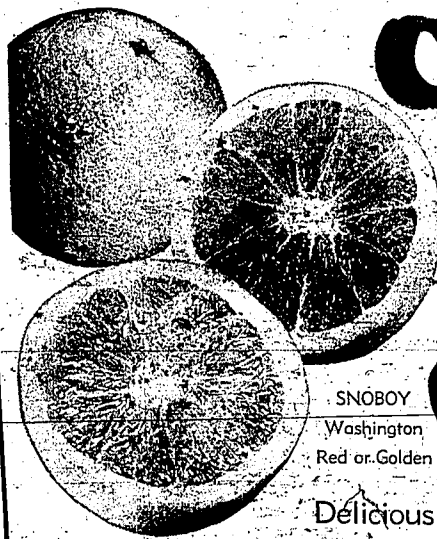
