Nasser Ends Yemen's Ties To Republic

CAIRO, Dec. 27 (AP)—President Gamal Abdel Nasser's demand that the United Arab Republic be dissolved following severance of the loose federation that joined the little Arabian Peninsula to the United Arab Republic.

Nasser broke the tie with Yemen Tuesday night, apparently because of the opposition of Yemen's feudal ruler, the Imam Ahmad bin Muhammad, Nasser's secretary promised to convert the U.A.R. to a republic.

Benefit, Rate Increases Set For Security

WASHINGTON, Dec. 27 (AP)—Social security tax rates go up 1/2 cent, and the increased revenues help meet the cost of benefit changes which will begin in March 1958.

The hike amounts to one-eighth of one per cent for employers, and one-tenth of one per cent for employees.

Changes effective this year included: giving retired men the option to collect reduced benefits at 62 instead of at 65; increasing dependent widows' benefits by about 10 per cent; increasing the minimum for child support payments from \$3 to \$4 per month; providing more incentive for beneficiaries to work by reducing the amount that can be withheld from their benefits because of earnings above certain levels.

The U. S. command reported that Co. D of the 4th Infantry moved along the autobahn to clear the road of Soviet controls at the Babergh checkpoint outside Berlin and headed west on the 10-mile trip through communist territory.

The communist press, both Soviet and East German, has contentedly complained about such U. S. troop movements.

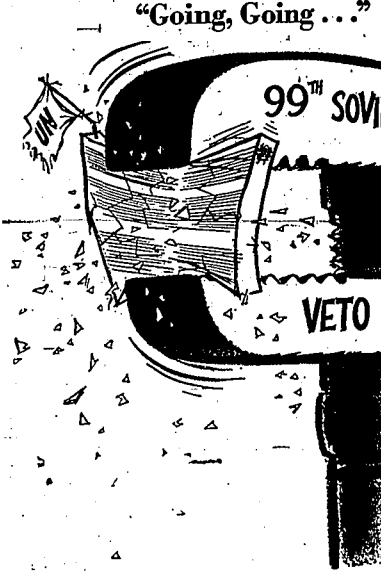

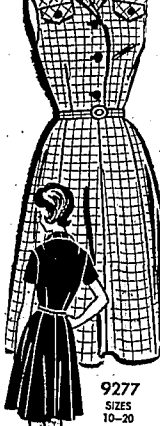

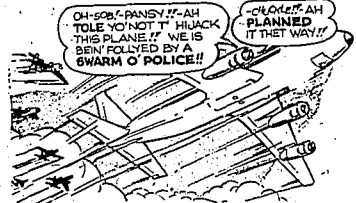
