**Politicians Get Top Vote in 'Best-Dressed Poll'**

NEW YORK, Dec. 29 (AP) — The American Wool Council, which worries about such things as who is the best-dressed man, has found out after careful study that it is the man who appears in the Public Eye most often.

It puts the politician at the head of the list, without mentioning President Kennedy and follows with salesmen, ad men, lawyers, bankers, brokers, business executives, suburban real-estate men, real estate men and theatrical and television stars.

The council doesn't mention it, but in New York City there are a lot of other categories ranging from the doctor who dresses in a Rolls-Royce through the downtown financial district wearing formal morning clothes to a handful of radio and television executives who are only slightly less formal in midtown Manhattan.

Madison Avenue is another locally all its own with a heavy jarding of Ivy League types who also turn up in the financial district as well as in Harvard, Yale and Princeton men seem to migrate to the financial district naturally.

The way you can tell a Madison Avenue type from an Ivy League type is that the advertising men are even more heavily dressed men (known as personality caricatures). They are the

conservatives, the individualists, the originators and the Sunday besters.

The conservatives include such people as manufacturers, general managers, treasurers, auditors, efficiency experts and manufacturers. They are well-dressed but conservatively so. They steer clear of new fashion trends and, according to the Wool Council, show a marked preference for wool suits.

The individualists include doctors, scientists, chemists, professors, writers, artists, engineers and architects. They tend to be the trendy, pipe-smoking group with the emphasis on comfort — yet with a keen appreciation of style. The originators usually are the college students, well-dressed and well-dressed. They become conformists when a style spreads to a keen college campus in the land. Right now most students would rather be dead than be caught with something that is not a three-button Ivy suit.

Then there are the Sunday besters. They include electricians, carpenters, plumbers, painters, plant foremen and supervisors. The emphasis here is on neatness more than on fashion. This usually ends up as a navy blue Sunday suit, a white shirt and a red tie. And, horror of horrors, the blue suit sometimes is worn with brown shoes.

## Leftover Scraps Can Add To Child's Rainy Day Box

An extra dividend of the seasonal gift exchange is the collection of leftover bright scraps to add to the "rainy day" box. Glistening ribbons and foil papers, marking pens and scissors, package trimmers and colored bright pens bring fresh excitement to the buttons, yarn, papers, and fabric scraps already in the collection.

The "rainy day" box has nothing to do with the weather. It's actually a basket filled with a variety of materials—to catalogue the first raindrops.

In spite of the embarrassing abundance of toys, television and organ-tube-entertainment, most children will return again and again to poke and explore and perhaps create something from the scraps in the basket.

NEW ideas and new materials always are welcome. A home laundry service suggested toys which could be made from empty plastic containers. Plastic containers which package fabric softeners, bleach, shampoos, detergents and the like have color and form in their favor. They are unbreakable so can safely be used in "rainy day" projects.

Once you've seen a doll made from an empty pale blue plastic fabric softener bottle, you'll find yourself sifting up other projects by the shape and color of the container.

The best bottles are those with paper labels which can be removed. An ice pick can be used to poke holes in the container to insert pipe-cleaner arms or other decorations and a good all-purpose glue may be needed to stick paper or felt to the plastic surface.

As a starter, try an angel. The body is a pale blue plastic bottle with a hole in the narrow straight side as the front. Her wings are gold-colored felt paper cut to cardboard and taped to the

## Twist Is Just Beatnik Rhumba and Is More Impersonal Than Virginia Reel

NEW YORK, Dec. 29—The Twist, the latest dance craze, is nothing but a beatnik rhumba. It is not nearly so much run as the Charleston or as hectic as jitterbugging or rock 'n' roll and it lacks the black bottom seem posturely risique. The Bunny Hug, Turkey Trot and Big Apple required the more energy to perform.

In case everyone does not know by now, The Twist got its name from the title of a song called "The Twist" by Chubby Checker. The style came from the manner of presentation of the singer who made the song popular, a fellow known as Chubby Checker. A recorder of vital statistics doubtless knows Checker's rightful name. He acquired the Chubby Checker life when he was told he looked like Pats Domino. Get it?

That was in Philadelphia, which claims to be the birthplace of The Twist, a boast that has evoked no challenges.

Checker, or whatever his name really is, is supposed to go through a variety of gyrations, mainly with his hips, while singing "The Twist." The dance being performed by teen-agers, their parents and even their grandparents represents a mass effort to imitate what Checker does while he sings.

Probably the best way to describe the Twist is to explain that when dancers perform it incorrectly they seem to be trying to go the hula or rhumba.

It is a correctly performed Twist, the shoulders are held stiff and the feet scarcely move. The arms are moved back and forth somewhat in the manner of particular to make a "V" and to tight hip gyrate in a manner certain to involve limbs from over-large exercises and send middle-aged men to the nearest orthopedist.

Most important — one never smiles while doing the twist. Nobody is supposed to be able to tell whether you are having a good time while doing it. Never look at your partner and don't worry about whether you both are doing the same step. This makes it even more impersonal than the Virginia Reel.

It matters little whether you are at the Prominent Inn, the smoke-filled bistro in the New York theater district where the Twist became famous, or the more fashionable Stork Club across town. The technique is approximately the same, although the dress and demeanor are different.

The uniform for doing The Twist at the Peppermint Lounge is a shirt and slin-slight slacks for men and either (oreador) pants or long black stockings and short skirts topped by bulky sweaters for girls. At the Stork Club, one appears in whatever "they" are wearing this year.

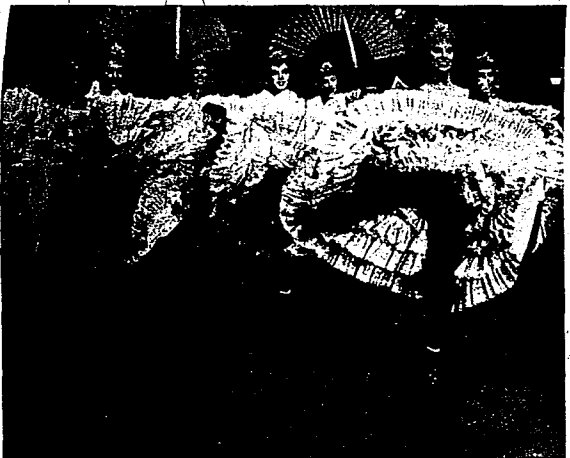
