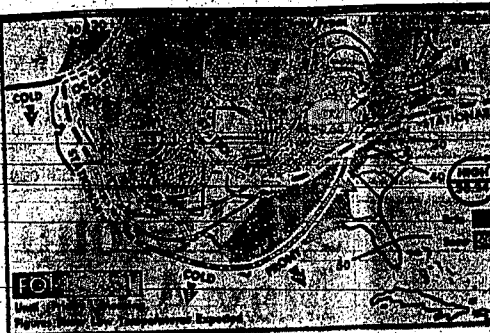

# Orbital Shot Fuel Slowup Halts Flight

CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla., Jan. 4.—Astronaut John H. Glenn Jr. will have to wait at least an hour before he can be launched into orbit as the first American to orbit the earth.

The national aeronautics and space administration Wednesday postponed the launching from 10:25 a. m. to 11:25 a. m. because of a fueling problem with the Atlas booster rocket.

The word came from reliable sources close to the Mercury Project, NABA, which has not announced any later for the launching, declining comment on the report.

The informants said the difficulty could be corrected within a day or two delay but that NABA officials decided to call a seven-day hold to make a complete check.

Glenn, 40, reportedly was disappointed by the postponement, the second for the launching, but was not available for comment.

# Vatican Will Receive New Cuban Envoy

VATICAN CITY, Jan. 4.—The Roman Catholic church disclosure that Fidel Castro and his top officials have been excommunicated will not keep the Vatican from accepting a new Cuban ambassador, nor will it keep the Cuban government from sending him.

Vatican sources said today Luis Blanes Fernandez, named by Castro to the ambassadorial post, vacant more than a year, would be received in line with diplomatic protocol.

The Cuban foreign ministry said in Havana Wednesday after disclosure of the excommunication that Blanes y Fernandez, a Spanish-born dentist and journalist, would leave for the Holy See Jan. 9.

Blanes y Fernandez' name appears on the 1962 list of diplomatic representatives accredited to the Vatican. Sources said the list took some time in preparation and his name would not have been included if there were plans to reject him.

A canon law expert in the Vatican secretariat of state said Wednesday that Castro and top officials of his pro-communist regime had been excommunicated.

# T. F. Library Personnel Covered by Unemployment Act; Expense Is Noted

Unemployment compensation payments for employees of the Twin Falls public library might lead to further curtailment of library service, Arthur L. DeVolder, city library director, reported Wednesday.

DeVolder said members of the Twin Falls public library board are informed by E. O. Doherty, representative of the Idaho unemployment security agency that effective Jan. 1 all municipal and county employees would be covered by the unemployment compensation act.

Based on present salary expenditures, the library would have to contribute approximately \$1,000 per year to cover library employee DeVolder said.

New library hours went into effect Tuesday. It will take several months before the overall effect of reduced service can be determined, DeVolder asserted.

Library income since July 1 includes \$17,500 city appropriation, \$21,110 pay \$211,443.20 country subscriptions, and \$1,127.26 fines and collections.

Total income during the period was \$19,202.28, expenditures including purchase of books, periodicals, binding, salaries, high telephone, supplies, incidentals, heat, building supplies and equipment and miscellaneous expenses including insurance and sundries totaled \$21,555.50.

During December, 92 new adult books were purchased by the library and 16 were donated, DeVolder said. In the youth division, 19 books were purchased and eight were donated. No juvenile additions were made in December.

Books were put and withdrawn totaled 14 juvenile, 97 adult and

eight youth books, for a total of 114.

There were 125 books and magazines repaired in the library and 92 magazines were bound. One adult record was added and three juvenile records were withdrawn.

A total of 192 new adult and 16 new juvenile records were registered. There were 215 adult and 60 juvenile readers withdrawn.

DeVolder requested that readers withdrawing 65-64-63-62-61-60 their expired cards so the plates can be used again. Filing the cost at 10 cents a plate, the library can save \$300 if the 3,000 expired cards are returned, he requested.

Circulation for the month was 8,747. Adults checked out 2,309 fiction books, 2,068 non-fiction, 257 periodicals, 20 pamphlets, five pictures and 22 films.

In the juvenile department, 2,311 fiction books were checked out, 764 non-fiction books, 20 periodicals, and 12 pamphlets.

The youth room circulated 434 fiction books, 227 non-fiction and 389 pamphlets.

Daily average circulation during the 25 days the library was open in December was 350. Largest daily circulation was 632 and smallest 179. Some 43 percent of the items circulated was non-fiction.

Phonograph circulation included 48 adult and 138 juvenile records.

Overdue notifications totaled 595, with 208 notices being sent to adults, 122 juveniles and 167 youths. A total of 153 bills were sought. Of these, 72 went to adults, 67 to juveniles and 60 to youths.

Books returned but withdrawn totaled 14 juvenile, 97 adult and

A total of \$11.50 was paid for non-resident cards. No income was received from dues during December. Expenditures were \$2,854.65.

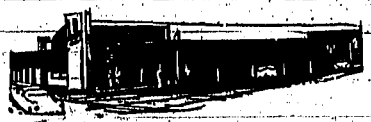

# U2 Pilot Not Bothered by Crash, Jump

BLOOM, Miss., Jan. 4 (AP)—U2 pilot Charles Stratton awoke from a six-hour sleep following a night perched in a cypress tree some 600 feet above the ground.

The air force captain, 32, seemed more concerned with food than with his reconnaissance plane, whose shattered remains lay in a brush-covered, almost inaccessible part of the Pearl river swampland on the Louisiana-Mississippi border.

Although he survived his 400-600-foot fall, nine hours in the cypress tree above the snake-infested marsh and a daybreak rescue with not a scratch, Stratton had been placed in the hospital for some rest. He had been awake 29 straight hours.

Asked about his flight, he said there wasn't much to it. Stratton normally flies the high-altitude U2 on weather reconnaissance missions as part of the defense department's high altitude sampling program. Tuesday night's flight, however, was a navigational test flight from his home base, Laughlin air force base, Del Rio, Tex., to Birmingham, Ala., and back.

"The plane began to malfunction—I think in the electrical system—and I decided not to stay around," he said.

Bringing the craft down from about 60,000 feet to 45,000 feet, he flipped the ejection switch and about himself out at about 8:40 Tuesday night.

# Utah's Water Supply Aided By Snowpack

SALT LAKE CITY, Jan. 4 (AP)—Above average snowpack has brightened Utah's water supply outlook for next summer.

But two federal agencies cautioned Wednesday that the water prospects were still dim in the southern part of the state and in scattered other sections. The reports also noted that despite the heavy snowfall, the reservoir storage will probably be low by the end of summer.

Snow Survey Supervisor Gregory L. Pearson of the soil conservation service said the snowpack is 20 per cent above average in Utah as a whole and 100 per cent above average on the Ogden river watersheds, 182 per cent on the Teton river watershed and 100 per cent in the Wasatch mountains east of Salt Lake City.

He said the forecast was for average or above average stream flow next summer.

# Thrifty Pork Loins to Top Buying Lists

By The Associated Press  
Pork loins and frozen vegetables will head many housewives' shopping lists this week.

The emphasis on frozen vegetables comes from the twin effects of heavy stocks of frozen varieties and a 20-cent discount on last week's sale-freezing temperatures in parts of Florida's winter vegetable belt.

Early season estimates were that a heavy vegetable crop would be processed this year, but last, including canned as well as frozen. Warehouse stocks of frozen varieties for some of a whopping 1.3 billion pounds, a record.

Best buys among fresh vegetables are broccoli, cabbage and lettuce, reflecting heavy shipments from California, Arizona and Texas; and potatoes, celery and onions. In some sections, good buys also can be found among eggplant, spinach, radishes and winter squash. In California, peaches, peaches, tomatoes, cucumbers, radishes and cauliflower.

Broiling and frying chickens also will be featured at meat counters in the Northeast and Midwest, reflecting still abundant supplies of the birds. Midwest shoppers will find turkey still at low prices, provided they haven't had their fill over Christmas and New Year's.

Bacon is another featured item in the Northeast and Midwest, while sausage and spare ribs are a special prices in the Southwest.

Florida citrus supplies were largely unimpacted by the recent cold weather, government experts said. Grapefruit and oranges remain plentiful, however, with prices less than the best buy list.

Apples and lemons also are outstanding buys in most areas with bananas, guavas, pineapples and avocados featured in other places.

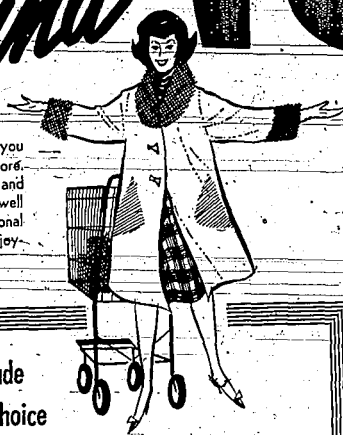

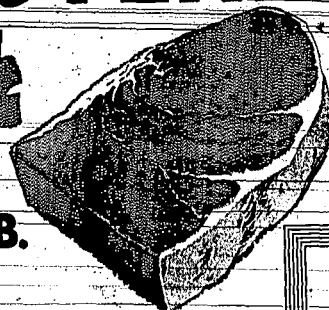
