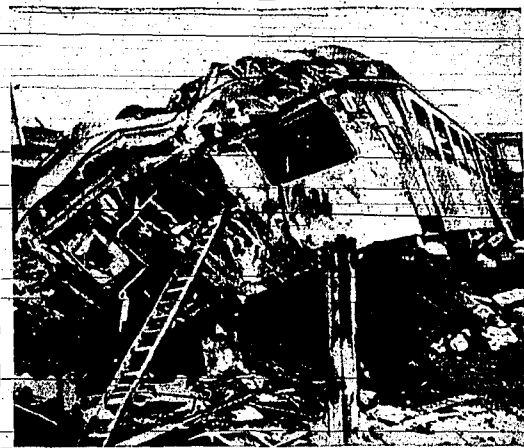

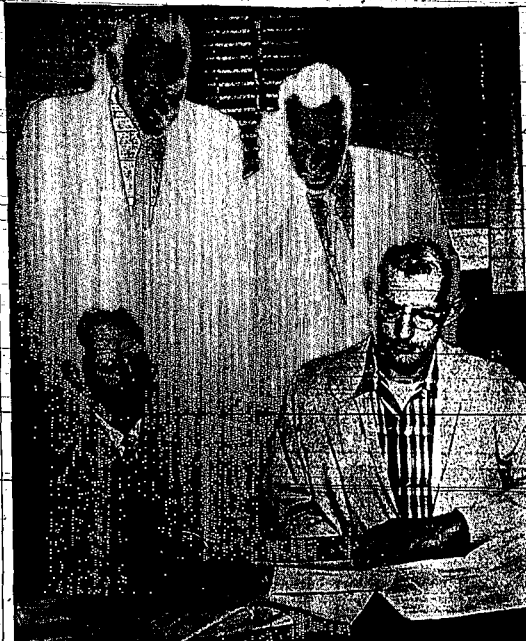

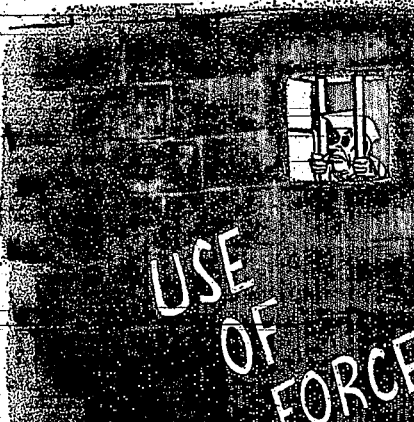

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Utah Search Is Continued For Airplane

BRUCE CANYON, Jan. 8 (U)—The search for a missing light plane carrying a California fabric salesman was scheduled to resume in southern Utah today.

The plane, a twin-engine Piper Apache, disappeared Saturday on a flight from Vegas to Casper with a refueling stop scheduled at Alamosa, Colo. The pilot, Harry Hansen, 44, Sepulveda, Calif., was last heard from when he checked in by radio over Bryce canyon.

Planes of the Utah civil air patrol scoured a rugged, uninhabited area from here to the Colorado border Sunday. Ground parties also searched the Sepulveda and Cimarron areas, where a light plane was reported seen Saturday.

Low clouds and storms hampered the search effort.

There are many mountains 10,000 to 12,000 feet high in the remote area where the plane was last heard from. The CAP said Hansen planned to fly at 11,200 feet.

Union Okays Strike Threat For Pan Am

NEW YORK, Jan. 8 (U)—Pan American World Airways faces a strike by pilots and flight attendants after midnight tomorrow, but the Airline Pilots Association has given no indication if or when there will be a walkout.

Government intervention delayed a threatened strike last November, but the giant airline's pilots are free to go out at midnight in a dispute over a new contract.

A spokesman for Pan Am, which flies around the world but does not have domestic service within the United States, said yesterday that prospects for a settlement were not good.

Pan Am employs 1,370 pilots. It has said it will furlough all of its 20,000 employees and completely close down operations if the pilots strike.

The prime unresolved issue is cockpit manning of jetliners. ALTA's refusal to let the airline reduce the number of pilots from three to two.

Federal regulations provide for only two pilots, plus a third crewman who must either be a pilot or a flight engineer.

Clay Returns After Talk on Berlin Policy

WASHINGTON, Jan. 8 (U)—Gen. Lucius D. Clay prepared to return to Berlin today in full agreement with President Kennedy on policy for handling "potential crisis situations" there.

The President announced the agreement yesterday in a three-paragraph statement after an hour-long meeting with Clay, his personal representative in Berlin. Kennedy said they had "a most useful and satisfactory review" of the Berlin situation.

Kennedy also was expected to discuss the Berlin problem later today with Vice Chancellor Ludwig Erhard of West Germany. Erhard had a 9 p.m. appointment at the White House.

Source said the President might ask Erhard for West Germany's assessment of a Soviet move to establish direct contacts with the Bonn government on Berlin and other German problems.

The President's conference with Clay came as officials reported new instructions were being sent to Ambassador W. Thompson, U. S. ambassador to Moscow, for his next "exploratory" talk on Berlin with Soviet Foreign Minister Andrei Gromyko.

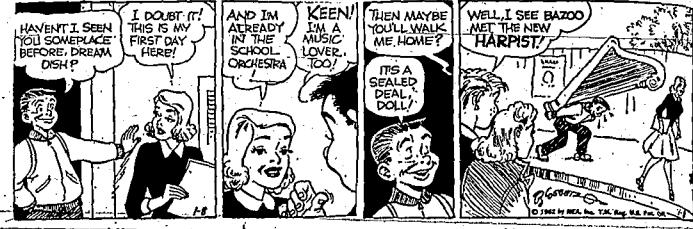

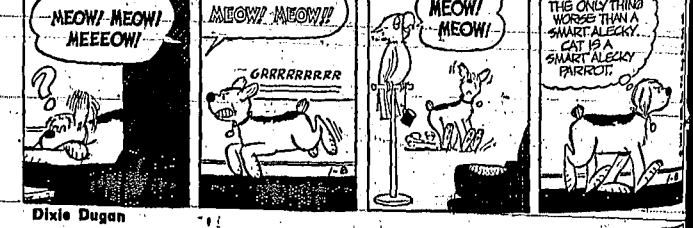

Brown's attack on Nixon, who has declared his candidacy for the Republican nomination for the California governorship, was in a speech prepared for delivery to the National Press club. Nowhere in his remarks did Brown state unqualifiedly that he will seek reelection this year. But, he hinted at it several times.
