3 cups fluffy mashed potatoes
Peel onions, leave whole. Peel carrots, quarter and cut into 2-inch pieces. Put both onions and carrots in a saucepan with the 3/4-cup boiling water and salt. Cover. Boil 10 minutes, or until almost tender. Drain vegetables (save water to use in the cream sauce) and put into a 9x12 1/2-inch baking pan. Melt butter or margarine in a saucepan. Blend in flour, stir in milk and the carrot and onion stock. Cook until slightly thickened. Add cheese. Pour sauce over the vegetables. Top with fluffy mashed potatoes.

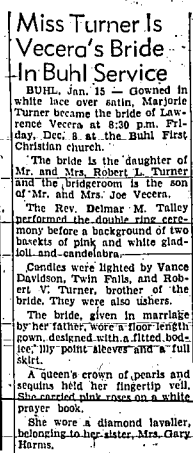
Mrs. Smith added that clematis blooming on the current year's growth is pruned in early spring and varieties blooming on previous year's growth are pruned after flowering.

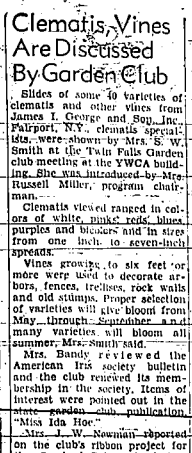

VATICAN CITY, Jan. 15.—More than 100 members of the Catholic hierarchy gathered in the Vatican palace today to begin a week of discussions on the forthcoming ecumenical council under the personal guidance of Pope John XXIII.

Observers viewed the pontiff's desire to preside over today's session of the council's central preparatory commission as further evidence of his wish to set the date for the council as early as possible. It will be the first of its kind in over 100 years.

Cardinals, archbishops, bishops, theologians and church officials went to the palace's congressional hall for the start of their third meeting. The commission met here on Christmas day, Nov. 21 and Nov. 6-11 last year.

The council is expected to be held next fall. On Christmas day, Pope John issued a "bill of intention" — a formal document which sets the date for the council. The date was not announced.

The pontiff said he would convene the council in Rome at the time, and Vatican sources said it was likely later this year.

In a television address he "thoroughly concurred" in Kennedy's State of the Union statement, but he would ask for "a check on the nation's finances in the black for fiscal 1953."

But, "in view of all the demands he has made on the congress, that is going to be a valorous feat that I really have to see," Dicksen added.

In a television interview, the GOP senate leader said Kennedy's decision to push for tuition tax credit revision to meet the challenge of the European common market "probably will be one of the most controversial things that has come to capitol hill in the last quarter of a century."

He said the proposal touched on business and employment, investment and the world trade. He said how it affected Illinois before he decided how to vote on the issue.

Dicksen also said he thought the Kennedy administration was not pushing hard enough for civil rights legislation. He said the new session would complete work on civil rights legislation, but he said the program would be completed by the Eisenhower administration.
