Senator Says Chinese May Have A-Bomb

WASHINGTON, Jan. 22 (AP)—Sen. Robert Humphrey, D-Minn., believes red China could explode a nuclear device "anytime within this year."

The assistant majority leader said yesterday he had discussed the matter with leading scientists.

"It has been known for a good deal of time that prior to World War II some of the most advanced nuclear scientists and nuclear physicists were Chinese and they are still in China," Humphrey said.

But Humphrey said it was because of the possibility China could produce a bomb that he had been so insistent on a nuclear test ban treaty. Commenting on "TV INTERVIEW" he said "the only way to stop the spread of nuclear technology is to stop testing."

Humphrey added that "worse than the failure to test would be to have a balance of power that would be in the hands of the Sino-Soviet bloc."

If American scientists have "evidence that recent Soviet tests have resulted in such an advance that our security is in jeopardy" then this country must test, Humphrey said.

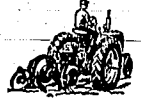

Hearings Set On Sales of Films to TV

WASHINGTON, Jan. 22 (AP)—The supreme court agreed today to look into the order barring movie distributors from selling old films in "blocks" to television stations.

Block booking is the sale of a film on condition that the buyer take one or more others which he may not want.

The order prohibiting the practice as an antitrust violation was handed down Dec. 2, 1950, by Federal District Judge Archibald Dawson in New York.

Movie firms appealed the decision as "too extreme." The Justice department appealed it as not severe enough.

The court will schedule arguments on the case later this month and will follow with a written opinion.

The high court in a similar case in 1948 forbade block booking of motion pictures to theaters.
