President Seeks Lighter Federal Farm Legislation

WASHINGTON, Jan. 31 (AP)—President Kennedy sent a tough new farm program to congress today which would give the nation's farmers this choice: Accept much lighter production controls on surplus products or face a cut-off of most federal price supports and other aid...

Additional aims are to boost farm income and reduce costly farm surpluses now in government hands, he said. Farmers growing wheat, corn, oats, barley and sorghum grains would lose all price supports if they did not go along with acreage allotments and marketing quotas set under the new program...

Marketing quotas would be set on all dairymen for the first time if the program is approved.

The toughest Kennedy program is the proposed program to provide indemnity federal controls were introduced into agriculture in the 1930s.

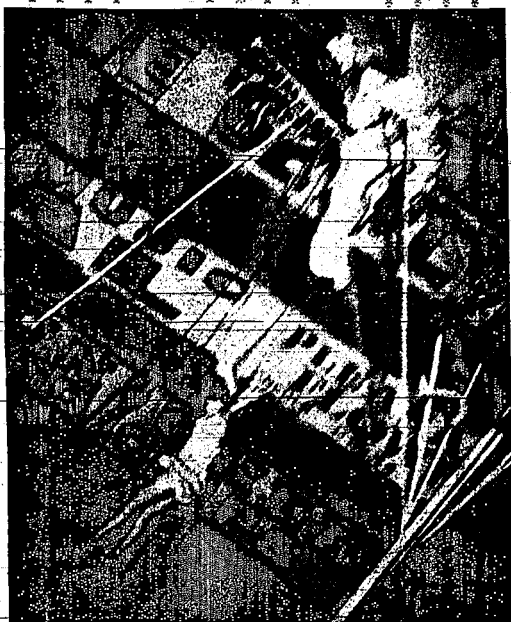

2 Famed Circus Performers Die in High Wire Act Fall

DETROIT, Jan. 31 (AP)—Two months ago from behind the iron curtains in East Germany, Paughman was making his debut with the Wallendes.

The four younger men formed the base of a pyramid with their feet on the high wire. Karl and Herman Wallende were standing on long rods which ran along the younger men's shoulders.

Suddenly the pyramid collapsed. Herman Karl and Gunther Wallende managed to stay on the wire and grab Miss Schopp.

For Umo panic threatened from the shocked crowd. Some men tried to run into the ring. Women wept. Others, including children, were frozen in their seats.

A circus clown, Ernie (Dinko) Burch, was credited with bringing calm. Burch, grotesque in his makeup, stood in the ring center pleading for order.

Paughman's wife, Jenny, 33, a troupe member, was standing on a platform at one end of the high wire.

She said her husband did not appear to have a good grip on his 250-pound balancing bar and lost his balance as he tried to clings the grip.

Relief Load Is Problem In Chicago

CHICAGO, Jan. 31 (AP)—Cook county, bearing a heavy relief load, advised unskilled workers from other areas to stay away from Chicago.

"I think they'd be crazy if they came. There's nothing here for them."

Raymond M. Hilliard, director of the Cook county department of public aid, made that comment Tuesday in response to a question at a news conference.

He spoke with newsmen in the wake of Gov. Otto Kerner's statement last week that Illinois is facing a "transfer crisis," due in large part to public assistance programs.

Cook county's 1962 budget estimated \$202,076,553 for public aid benefits, an increase of 60 per cent over 1959. It envisioned monthly average cases load of 251,000 persons for this year, an increase of 43 per cent.

The biggest items in the blueprint of spending federal, state and Chicago cash are aid to dependent children and direct relief.

During the decade of the 1950s, newcomers rode into Chicago via a train of about 35,000 a year. But the commission on human relations said the influx has dropped considerably.

Cook county requires one year of residence for eligibility for aid. Hilliard said, "The number has increased by men who came to Chicago some time ago and lost their jobs when their plants shifted to more efficient operations or moved elsewhere."

Hilliard frowned on the thoughtless migration of men who tried to put into effect before the courts intervened.

The whole Newburgh approach is to try to punish people off relief, he said.

BASE:
1-10-ounce can condensed cream of mushroom soup
1/2 cup milk
2 cups diced cooked chicken
1/2 cup onion, finely chopped
1/2 cup chopped onion
2 tablespoons chopped pimiento
2 tablespoons chopped parsley
1 teaspoon salt
DRESSING:
1/4 cups sifted all-purpose flour
3 teaspoons baking powder
3/4 teaspoon salt
3 tablespoons shortening
1/4 cup rolled oats (quick or old-fashioned, uncooked)
1/2 cup milk
Heat oven to very hot (450 degrees F.). For base, put soup in sauce pan. Stir in milk frequently. Add remaining ingredients; combine well. Heat to bubbling.
For biscuits, sift together flour, baking powder and salt. Cut in shortening until mixture resembles coarse crumbs. Stir in oats; add milk all at once and mix just until dough follows form around bowl. (Add a little more milk if necessary to make a soft dough.) Turn out on lightly floured board or canvas lined gently a few times. Roll or pat to 1/4-inch thickness; cut with heart-shaped cutter.

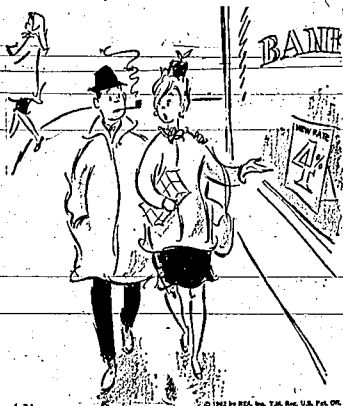

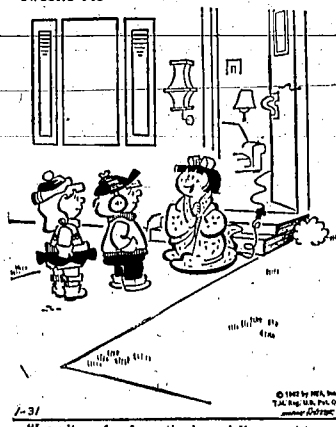

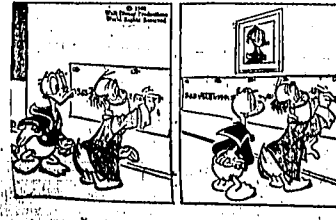
