Romney May Ask Election To GOP Post

WASHINGTON, Feb. 5 (AP)—George W. Romney says if he decides to seek the nomination of Mitt Romney, he will announce as a Republican who recognizes that the Republican image needs improvement.

Romney, 56, president of American Motors, said Sunday on a television interview program that he will make his decision this week.

On the GOP issue, Romney said, "I think the Republican party has been too much identified as a business party, as a party influenced importantly by one economic segment of the country. I think this is unfortunate and wrong."

As for the Democratic party, Romney said he thought it "has been identified too much as a union party and that actually union influence is too great."

Romney left the impression that he probably will try for the governorship but he stopped about an inch short of an actual declaration.

He said he would like to see him to make a statement on his possible candidacy for president in 1964 "because of a number of factors."

Romney said he had been non-partisan for a number of years. He declared himself a Republican, he said, only because it was necessary to qualify as a candidate for delegate to a state constitutional convention.

Schwiebert's Plan for '62 Ballot Veiled

CALDWELL, Feb. 5 (AP)—Former Idaho legislator and congressional candidate Erwin H. Schwiebert is expected to announce here he will leave his present employment March 1, but decline to reveal his plans for the future.

Schwiebert, who will be leaving his job with the nation's business department of the U. S. Chamber of Commerce, is expected to become a candidate for the Republican nomination for congress in the first district.

He said that he would have no further public statements concerning his plans until March 1, but that he would make his intentions known at that time.

Schwiebert served four terms in the Idaho house of representatives in 1942, 1943, 1944 and 1949. He served one term in senate in 1957.

He was defeated in the primary for the first district Republican congressional nomination in 1952. He won the primary nomination in 1954 but lost to Max Baucus in the general election by the narrowest margin since she was first elected.

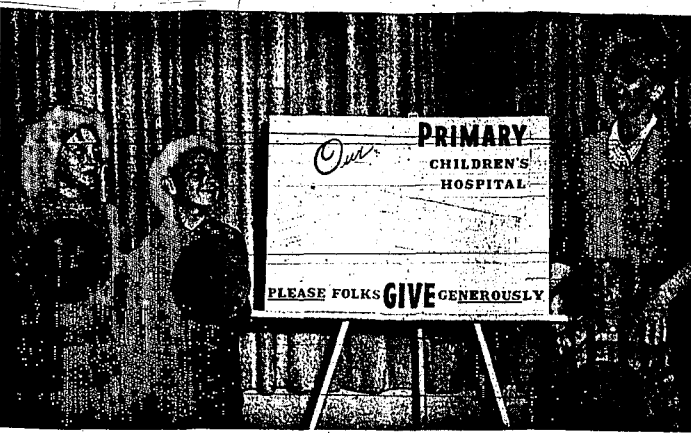
A recreation room is located in the basement. The assembly room, which is being finished, is about 80 feet long and 18 feet high.

West Needing Coke Source, Smylie Notes

BOISE, Feb. 5 (AP)—Gov. Robert E. Smylie said today that western production of coke may open up in Idaho "a new industrial era far beyond anything we have visualized."

Smylie referred to the announcement by Food Machinery Corporation and United States Steel corporation that joint experiments in coke production have met with success at their plant in Kemmerer, Wyo.

"The firms said tests indicate that the product can be used satisfactorily in the production of elemental phosphorus."

Idaho's chemical industries must now obtain coke from the East.

Food Machinery corporation now operates an elemental phosphorus plant in Pocatello. Similar plants are operated by Monsanto Chemical corporation at Soda Springs and by Central Farmers corporation at Montpelier.

Smylie said a nearby source of coke would also aid the J. R. Simplot company's fertilizer production operations in Uppigville.

RUPERT, Feb. 5 (AP) — A report on the recent meeting of the Northside Communities' association at Oodling was given by Wayne Anderson at the Thursday luncheon meeting of the Rupert Chamber of Commerce.

Charges Set For Denver's Police Probe

DENVER, Feb. 5 (AP) — One of the largest police investigations in U. S. history will expand further this week when criminal charges are filed against the 50th and 51st "bunches" in the city.

Dial Air, Bert M. Keating will not disclose the names of the two new suspects, but he said he has evidence with which to charge them.

He said the evidence was gathered last week by visits to the Colorado state penitentiary at Canon City, Colo., where some of the convicted Denver patrolmen are serving terms.

FBI Placing Mad Slayer On Top List

WASHINGTON, Feb. 5 (AP) — Watson Young, Jr., who has been an inmate of seven mental institutions and is sought for double murder and rape, was added today to the FBI's list of 10 most wanted criminals.

Young, described by the FBI as a homicidal maniac, has been hunted by police since Dec. 14 when he allegedly shot to death an elderly Indianapolis couple who had befriended him. The 29-year-old Negro is accused of raping a housewife and terrorizing her 2-year-old daughter within minutes after the murders.

The FBI said that Young, a one-line marine, has been a patient in mental hospitals in Charleston, S. C., Philadelphia, Louisville, Ky., Dayton, O., Kansas City, Mo., Marion, Ind., and Washington, D. C., within the last eight years.

The fugitive has been classified as a "schizophrenic paranoid" and is known as a sexual pervert.

The FBI said that Young, in the past, in funeral homes, has attended embalming school and has impersonated a funeral director as well as a deputy U. S. marshal. He also has worked as a laborer, night watchman and salesman.

Young has a loud, distinct cackling laugh. He dresses neatly and expensively.

OLASGOW, Scotland, Feb. 5 (AP) — A Scottish whisky importer tried today to say he hopes will be a foolproof way to ship Scotch to the United States without having a few bottles disappear on the way.

Soviet Paper Says U.S. Is Berlin Block

MOSCOW, Feb. 5 (AP) — The Soviet government newspaper Izvestia accused the West today of blocking progress toward a Berlin settlement by insisting on uncontrolled access to the city.

The newspaper's charge came on the heels of U.S. Ambassador Lincoln Thompson's third attempt Thursday to see whether there was a basis for full-scale East-West negotiations on Berlin.

The article, signed by foreign affairs commentator N. Polyakov, indicated that the American key to still maintain firm resistance to what the West considers the key issue in any Berlin settlement.

"The roads that link free cities with the outer world, be they on land, river or air never were and never will be uncontrolled," the article said.

"On what grounds," it added, "does Washington refuse to reckon with the sovereign rights of the DDR (East Germany) in the midst of which West Berlin is located?"

Izvestia said this was "not a remedy but a poison for the dangerous postwar alliance of West Berlin."

It accused the West of trying "to drown the Soviet-American talks in the artificially blown-up problem of access."

Plan to Reunite Families Given

WASHINGTON, Feb. 5 (AP) — Assistant General J. Edward Day today announced a plan "to reunite evacuated, displaced and homeless persons with their families in the event of an enemy attack."

"It involves the use of two forms. These would be filled out by persons removed from their homes and families following an attack," Day's announcement said.

"The first form, known as a 'safety notification card,' would be used to notify family members and friends that the evacuee is safe, and to provide them with the evacuation area or temporary location," the announcement said.

"The second card would go to the postal service, to notify it of the evacuee's new mailing address. Once this second card has been turned in at the nearest postoffice, mail addressed to the evacuee's former location would be forwarded to him."

Graham Crusade Wins Approval

QUITO, Ecuador, Feb. 5 (AP) — Billy Graham's crusade in this predominantly Roman Catholic country has won high praise for benefiting all-Catholic Protestants and non-Christians.

The praise for the American evangelist came from former President Galo Plaza Lasso.

The American evangelist, a Baptist, has been drawing big crowds to his meetings, including a "large" number of Indians. A Protestant spokesman said the 6,000 who nearly packed the city coliseum Saturday night were nearly three times the number of Protestants living in Quito.

Hundreds came forward in response to his appeal to make a decision for Christ.
