

Glenn Describes His Adventures On Orbit Voyage

GRAND TURK ISLAND, Bahamas, Feb. 22 (AP)—Astronaut John H. Glenn, Jr., described more of his space adventures today and was reported getting a bit nervous over the public welcome scheduled for Friday. His experiences in space, as related to associates here, included a vain attempt to get his hands on a camera film container which went floating around in his capsule in a state of weightlessness. He also told of turning his spaceship completely around, the better to observe the mysterious "fireballs" that showed up outside the capsule at sunrise.

Soviet Tells Russians of Abel's Swap

MOSCOW, Feb. 22 (AP)—The Soviet government today told the Russian people for the first time that Col. Rudolf Abel, the convicted Soviet spy, had been released by U.S. authorities at the same time as U2 pilot Francis Gary Powers. The official newspaper Izvestia printed a letter from Abel's wife and Powers, thanking the Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev for arranging Abel's release. Abel had been "innocently arrested" and "unlawfully confined" from the bottom of our hearts, we profoundly thank the Soviet government and Premier Khrushchev for his release. He had been held in East Germany.

Observatory Will Fly to Observe Sun

CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla., Feb. 22 (AP)—An orbiting solar observatory, nicknamed OAO, is scheduled to be launched on a two-week mission to make the most comprehensive study yet of the sun and how it affects conditions on earth.

Plying in a circular orbit 300 miles above the earth, OAO's delicate instruments will observe the sun's surface and the solar wind, taking readings unobscured by the earth's heavy atmosphere.

Major assignment of the 400-pound observatory will be to measure X-rays and gamma, ultraviolet and infrared rays emanating from the sun. These potentially deadly particles are absorbed or deflected by the atmosphere and do not reach the ground.

"You are our brothers and we will stand by you," declared the President's world-touring brother. The attorney general flew to West Berlin without any Soviet attempt to hinder his plans in the air corridors and first visited the wall the communists have built across this divided and isolated city.

"I think it is particularly important now, before space becomes devoted to uses of war," Kennedy said at his news conference Wednesday. Khrushchev had sent a message congratulating the United States on Astronaut John Glenn, Jr.'s, triple orbit of the globe and suggesting the two governments combine resources to explore outer space.

Khrushchev Renews Plea on Conference

WASHINGTON, Feb. 22 (AP)—Soviet Premier Khrushchev was reported today to have made a new appeal to President Kennedy for an early summit conference on disarmament. It was understood to be a reply to Kennedy's message of Feb. 14 concerning the 18-nation general disarmament conference slated to open in Geneva March 14. In that communication Kennedy turned down Khrushchev's proposal to start the Geneva talks at the summit level with the government chiefs of all participating nations in attendance.

AEC Slating Giant Idaho Reactor Job

WASHINGTON, Feb. 22 (AP)—The Atomic Energy Commission today said it had signed a \$18,800,000 contract with the Fluor Corporation, Limited, Los Angeles, to build the world's largest test reactor at the national reactor testing station in Idaho. The AEC said the advanced test reactor would be used for the development of advanced fuel systems and materials.

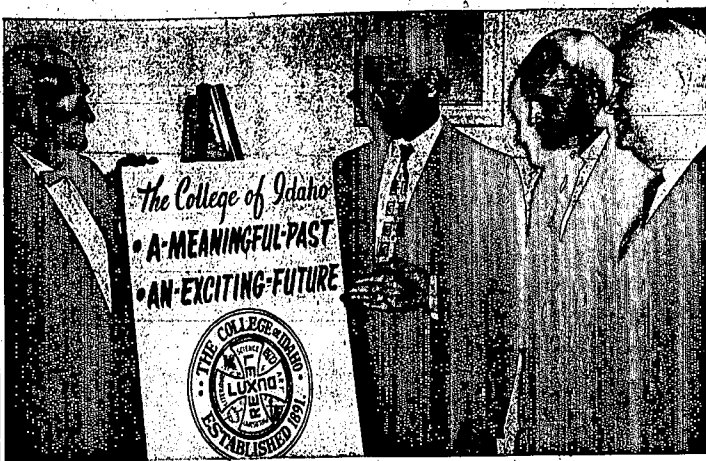
