

## Cabinet Aide Answers Rap By Unionists

WASHINGTON, March 1—Secretary of Labor Arthur J. Goldberg said Wednesday the administration has no intention of continuing labor-management term limits. He said management and employers and unions reach settlements consistent with the national interest.

Comments called in reporters to explain what he meant in a speech last night at a Democratic club, a speech in which leaders of both unions and industry have interpreted to include more government intervention in labor-management relations.

The secretary said in the light of U.S. commitments at home and abroad, government and private mediators must increase their provide guidelines to insure that settling differences between the parties themselves but for the public interest as well.

Goldberg emphasized Wednesday that neither him nor the administration intended to impose term limits on labor-management relations but instead to insist on general principles which labor and management should do for the public good.

He said an African voting majority in Northern Rhodesia would endanger the whole federation and he meant to present it.
