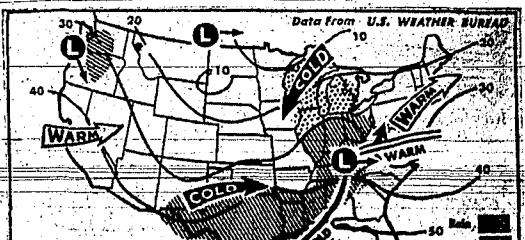

# Kennedy Is Facing Row About B70

WASHINGTON, March 8 (AP)—President Kennedy today appeared to be ducking a show-down with congressmen who want to move toward production of a 2,000-mile-an-hour bomber which he says may not be needed.

At his news conference yesterday Kennedy said he never intended to spend more than \$1 billion on the B-70, and orders him to spend it, he does not think he will be able to do so.

The items on which the extra money is supposed to be spent won't be developed for another year or two, the President said.

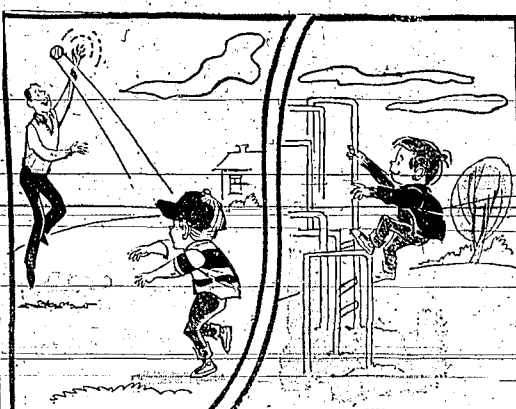
Kennedy's remarks came a few hours after the house armed services committee announced that congress-affirm, "once and for all, its duty and right under the constitution to advise and support" the armed forces.

The committee wrote into a 13 billion dollar military procurement bill an extra \$1 billion to get ready for actual production of the B70 bomber, for which the administration so far has authorized only research and development work.

It coupled the extra authorization with language to "direct" that the money be used. Similar efforts by congress in recent years have been consistently rebuffed by the executive branch.

In thus setting up a possible showdown with the President, the committee on the bill is against one of his most outspoken supporters in congress, Rep. Carl Vinson, D., Ga., the committee chairman and congress' most powerful voice in defense matters.

Vinson today declined immediate comment on the President's remarks.

# Help Your Child in School—No. 14 It's Important to Reduce Fear of Failure to Get Best Student Work

Whether the fear of failure comes on a child with blinding suddenness, or whether it lies on him like a dead weight which he barely recognizes, it can be a hazard to his physical as well as his mental health.

Fear of failure can be so strong that on the day of an examination a child becomes violently ill or he may "blurt out" and not be able to answer a single question.

Chronic fear of failure may show up in the student not wishing to recite in class. I have known students to answer "I don't know" to every question they are asked. Privately they admitted they knew many of the answers but would not speak up in class for fear they might be wrong.

A child who fears failure usually dislikes school. He rejects the idea of planning for a school year. He thinks college is a place to avoid.

Let's discuss three types of fear that directly affect learning.

First is the fear of failure due to a lack of coordination. If the child has not developed enough coordination to climb jungle gym and play games with his group he will be afraid to try. Although games are not directly related to learning, they affect his happiness in school.

Parents can help their child develop the necessary coordination. Play ball with him, provide climbing and jumping apparatus, teach him to swim.

Directly connected with school work is the coordination necessary for handwriting. Provide the small child with plenty of scratch paper, pencils and crayons. Encourage him to write and draw to develop his hand and arm muscles. Older students of ten can profit by improving their handwriting. This makes their work easier — and usually brings higher scores on examinations.

Second is the chronic fear of failure. A student may fail to recite, he may avoid homework. He may refuse to listen in class. These students "tune out" the instructor because they are afraid. They will not understand the lesson. Parents should help children plan to read, understand, and do their homework.

# Organized Labor Gets Set For Idaho Political Fights

BOISE, March 8 (AP)—Organized labor is getting ready this spring for political action candidates for governor, congress and U. S. senate to determine the ones it deems worthy of endorsement.

Darrell (Whitey) Dorman, Boise, state president of the AFL-CIO, said a meeting of the committee on political education (COPE) in Idaho will be called, probably for Boise, sometime after the April 21 candidate filing deadline.

He said that between 175 and 200 delegates from union locals throughout the state would be eligible to attend the convention.

"They'll go over the candidates' records and — quite possibly — invite them in for a debate," Dorman said.

Dorman said the AFL-CIO will be particularly interested in the various candidates' stands on eight principal issues: minimum wage, workers' compensation, unemployment compensation, expansion and revision of the state labor laws, industrial diseases, minimum wage, tax revision and — possibly — governmental reorganization.

LONDON, March 8 (AP)—No foreign motorist may drive into the Soviet Union after March 15 because tourist accommodations are fully booked, the London office of the Soviet agency Intourist announced Wednesday.

The order to accept no more bookings came from Moscow, said an Intourist spokesman.

The 15-day limit applies to tourists to enter the Soviet Union by aircraft, ship or train, he said.

## Door Is Open In Indonesia For Solution

JAKARTA, Indonesia, March 8 (AP)—Indonesian President Sukarno said today the "door is still open to the Dutch for the peaceful solution" of the West New Guinea (West Irian) dispute.

But, he said, if a peaceful solution is unattainable, Indonesians will do "everything in their power" to return West Irian to the Republic of Indonesia.

Sukarno outlined his government's policy toward the disputed territory in a speech at a prayer meeting marking the end of the Moslem fasting month of Ramadan.

The meeting was held in the gardens of Sukarno's palace here and attended by several thousand guests. Sukarno's speech was carried on a nationwide radio broadcast.

"Do not let one drop of blood flow," Sukarno said. "Let us solve (the issue) through peaceful means."

He said, however, that military training and mobilization would continue unabated and even accelerated throughout Indonesia.

Spokane and Austin are the only major cities in the United States without a traffic death since Jan. 1, Nabers said.

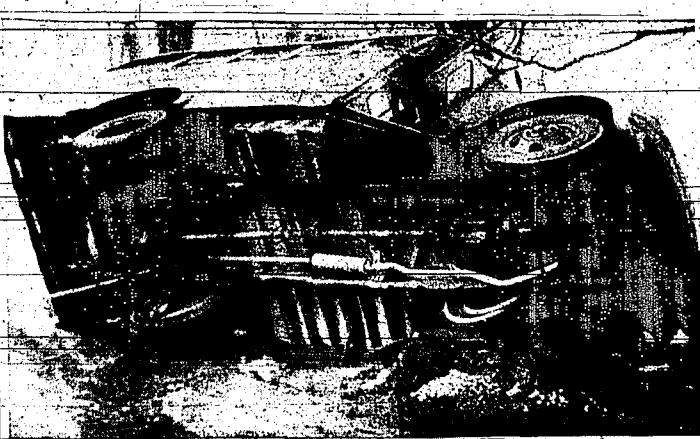
## Wendell School Eyes Vacancies

## Pontiff Praises Polish Cardinal

VATICAN CITY, March 8 (AP)—Pope John XXIII praised Stefan Cardinal Wyszynski and other Roman Catholics in Red Poland today for keeping their faith firm "in circumstances frequently difficult, among wars and trials of all kinds."

"Deeply moved, we have heard in your voice repeated affirmations of Poland's loyalty and love for the holy Catholic Church," the pope told the cardinal and 120 other Polish churchmen.

The Polish-Catholics have always kept high and bright the torch of the gospel and of faith in Christ the Redeemer."

The pontiff spoke shortly after he had received Cardinal Wyszynski in a private farewell audience before the Warsaw archbishop returned behind the iron curtain.

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## Passing Fish Over High Dams Is Key to Columbia Fisheries

WASHINGTON, March 8 (UPI)—Columbia river fisheries might be maintained for all time if the problem of fish passage over high dams is solved, a house appropriations subcommittee has been told.

The statement was made by Donald L. McKernan, director of the U. S. bureau of commercial fisheries during an appeal for nearly 2 million dollars for research on fish migration

over dams. In testimony published today, McKernan said the problem was "the remaining hurdle" in efforts to maintain salmon runs in the basin.

He asked for \$1,075,000 more than current expenditures of \$924,000 for the program in line with Interior Secretary Stewart L. Udall's order for a "crash research program" on the problem.

The federal power commission is delaying the licensing of high dams in the Columbia basin pending some progress on the problem by the end of 1964.

"We feel that we simply must have this level of program," McKernan told the committee. In answer to a question by Rep. Don Magnuson, D., Wash., McKernan said he was sure fish would successfully pass over the Ice Harbor dam.

The problem, he said, could with dams 300 feet or more in height.

McKernan also suggested that if an answer to the problem were found it might be possible to reestablish runs above the Grand Coulee dam.

"At least one salmon has shown he could do it but experts figure it will take 10 to 15 years to solve the problem of migratory fish passage at high dams," McKernan told of a test in a laboratory where his fish would climb so far and then be prodded to continue.

"We kept this fish climbing until it climbed over a mile. Instead of the fish getting tired out, we got tired out," McKernan said.

"We found that the salmon in the Columbia river would climb any dam of the heights and were anticipated," he added.

He expressed hope of "at least some significant findings" by the end of 1964.

"If we don't resolve this problem in the 'middle' Snake river, which is the area under question, when one of these large dams contemplated is constructed, we may lose the investment

entirely," he said.

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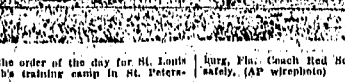

### Indians Are Restless, Says This Oklahoma Paleface

WASHINGTON, March 8 (AP)—A worried frontiersman named J. Leland Gourley rode into town yesterday with word that the Indians are restless in Oklahoma.

There was a time when his report would have made grown men pale and women and children weep.

These were the days when the Indian was the best barbed-wire rider, the craftiest stalker and the fastest foot in the west. When the waman wanted the paleface ragged, he could always sit around the campfire waiting for the paleface to get into the trap.

But—palefaces are scarce now, boys are passing and stinking downy take nearly so much concern as it once did for the paleface.

Of course, the brave could still sit around weaving baskets, and that's the reason they're restless. It seems they have forgotten just how to do it.

Thus Gourley, who heads the area-redevelopment program in Oklahoma, asked the area residents to petition the federal government to help the Indians in 25 Oklahoma counties to learn how to weave baskets.

Gourley put the problem in a nutshell:

"Our southeastern Oklahoma Indians don't know how to be Indians," he complained.

Marty Hagerstrand of Tahlequah, Okla., said the Sequoyah Indian Weavers' association applied to the Indian Service for \$15,000 to build a new sales outlet south of Tahlequah. The service suggested that federal funds might also be available to teach the Indians to make something to sell at the sales outlet.

Household items used to be about 400 Indians in four states producing handwork for sale at Tahlequah, but the number has declined to a handful.

"There are still many Indians in Cherokee, Sequoyah and Delaware counties that still have the basic knowledge, but haven't done any work for eight or 12 years," he said.

"The government said it would consider the proposal.
