# Rusk Tells Russ U.S. Viewpoint On Arms, Berlin

GENEVA, March 12 (AP)—Secretary of State Dean Rusk and Soviet Foreign Minister Andrei Gromyko spent three hours today discussing Berlin and disarmament problems without reaching any settlement. Foreign Secretary Lord Home of Britain bowed out of the talks temporarily to allow Rusk to emphasize Western views on the issues. The discussions took place over a long lunch at the Soviet villa. Both men were accompanied by experts. Because of the length of the discussion, the Berlin review presumably went further than a mere repetition of previous U.S. complaints over Soviet harassment tactics in the air corridors to the isolated city.

# Peace Talks Hit Snag on Ruling Bloc

EVIAN, France, March 12 (AP)—French and Algerian rebel delegations went into their sixth day here today still at odds on the makeup and power of an interim regime to take over until Algeria becomes a nation. Informants close to the conference in the heavily guarded Hotel Du Parc were still optimistic that the negotiations would end in agreement. "British spokesmen said there is still a possibility that the negotiations would end in agreement," they said. "The British are speaking in Geneva with one voice. Rusk, Gromyko and Lord Home here for the opening of the 17-nation disarmament conference Wednesday—conferred Sunday night at dinner but reports were that little progress was made. The Western Allies called on Russia to stop harassing allied air-traffic to Berlin but increasing tensions there endanger this disarmament negotiations. Gromyko denied knowledge of Soviet interference in the Berlin air corridors. Rusk and Gromyko the United States and Britain would like to get to work promptly on Tuesday. Gromyko dimmed hopes for a quick agreement by raising the old spy-catchers controversy. He demanded that increased inspection provisions be written into any treaty. Rusk asked Gromyko to reach in the middle of April. The United States will go ahead with a series of nuclear atmospheric tests in the central Pacific. Home supported the U.S. stand.

# Rails Union's Walkout Vote Is Scheduled

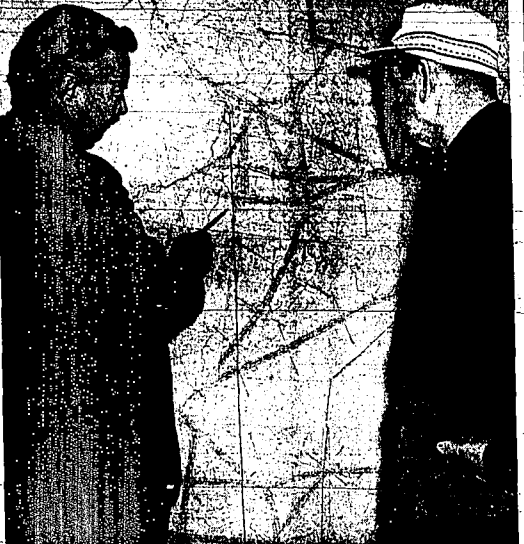
CHICAGO, March 12 (AP)—E. Gilbert, president of the Brotherhood of Locomotive Firemen and Enginemen, announced today that the union will vote on a strike vote against the nation's railroads. Gilbert said he rejected the report of a presidential commission which called for elimination of 40,000 firemen jobs on diesel locomotives in freight and yard service. "We intend to produce (freight) to show the industry (that) we are not profit-minded carriers who sought every safety device and rule sought by the men who face the hazards of the industry," Gilbert said. "We want the public to know that railroad financing is not a public utility but a business which constitutes safe railroading," he added. The presidential commission, in Feb. 28 report, called for a major overhaul of the rules covering the working conditions of 400,000 of 400,000 rail road employees. Gilbert last week conferred with 200 officials nationwide about the report, which he said was considered by railroad officials as "an arbitration award."

# Copper Needles Launch Planned

The probes will be sent up in a package of 200 million in late October. The 100 million were rocketed into space. Purpose of the project is to create a field of 200 probes to reflect interwave radio messages over great distances.

# First Lady Places Wreath at Shrine

NEW DELHI, India, March 12 (UPI)—Mrs. Jacqueline Kennedy placed a sheath of white roses today on the memorial to Mahatma Gandhi, who led India to independence. The gesture, made at the spot where Gandhi was assassinated by a Hindu fanatic in 1948, came a few hours after the American first lady arrived in India for a nine-day semi-official visit to the cheers of tens of thousands of semi-officially dressed Indians. Mrs. Kennedy placed the roses on the Gandhi memorial, stepped back, and brushed aside a spray of white flowers. Mrs. Kennedy was dressed in a white sari. She was accompanied by her sister, Princess Alexandra, at her side. The tribute to Gandhi was one of the first public gestures by the first lady of the American President at the outset of her visit, which started with a royal welcome from Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru to school children, snake charmers, and camel drivers. Hundreds of Indians watched the first lady as she walked along a roped-off concrete path leading to the "Gandhi" shrine. As is customary at the memorial, she removed her white, high-heeled shoes beneath the arch leading into the inner courtyard of the shrine, where Gandhi was slain as he walked to the Royal Alms House, was in an Indian hospital where British officials said he would remain for a few days until his condition permits transfer to the British hospital. # Reds Harass Berlin Lane; Airmen Shot

BERLIN, March 12 (AP)—Western officials today reported new Soviet harassment of western airmen in the air lanes over East Germany to West Berlin. # Asian Products Boom Predicted

TOYO, March 12 (AP)—An expanding U.S. economy will provide a growing market for Asian products during the next decade, the economic commission for Asia and the Far East was told today. The prediction came from Philip Klutznick, chief U.S. negotiator for the trade agreement, and American representative to the United Nations economic and social council. Klutznick said that the U.S. economy's proposed trade expansion act would, unprecedentedly, begin slowly in U.S. district court today. # War Over Spud Volume Rule Fought by Solons

WASHINGTON, March 12 (AP)—Any effort to control volume in the handling of potatoes will result in strong opposition from Idaho. Sen. Frank Church and Rep. Ralph Harboring, Idaho Democrats, said today. But they said they believe there would be support in Idaho for national marketing order of uniform application which would establish requirements for grade, size and quality. 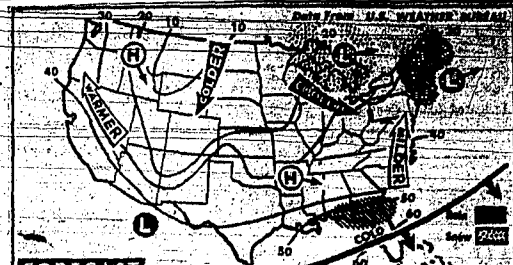
