

Area Firms Face Restraint Order For Price Rues

BOISE, March 26 (AP) (UPI)—The state of Idaho filed a complaint in third district court today to permanently restrain 23 firms, including seven represented in Magie Valley, from selling merchandise below the limits prescribed by law.

The complaint asked third-district court here to issue injunctions preventing further sales at less than the required six per cent markup.

Magie Valley firms named in the suit, in addition to Safeway, Albertson's and Sav-On drugs, are Shurt's, Market, Supermarkets, Inc., and Lewis and Clark Market.

Other names were McPherson's Supermarkets, Inc., and Lewis and Clark Market, IGA Food Center, Coeur d'Alene; Rogers, M.-J. Food center and Sundaes IGA, all in Sandpoint, and Okey Foods, M. and W. Market.

WASHINGTON, March 26 (Special)—The state department foreign policy briefing conference here today heard down heavily on the theme that the United Nations and NATO are doing the jobs for which they were designed and the Russians still do not have military capabilities equal to the U.S.

Several top officials of the Kennedy administration spoke at the Monday morning session of the briefing conference. They said the U.S. can avoid an atomic war if we can maintain our military advantage.

"We have an overall capability unmatched by the Russians and in addition we have the technological knowledge that have no equal," one speaker said.

On the subject of the United Nations, speakers pointed out that in the period since the U.N. was formed, the world has undergone no such a period of peace as in its history.

One said U.N. Secretary General U Thant has some success in collecting money over the U.N. and as of today \$5 million dollars have been pledged to buying the new headquarters building.

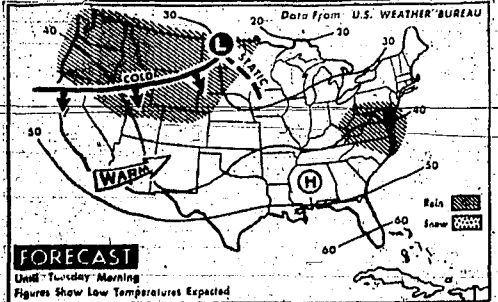

Both USW president David J. McDonald and chief negotiator, R. C. Cooper have remained tight lipped on the closed-door sessions which resumed today after a week-end recess.

McDonald, in a message sent to a convention of steelworkers in Kansas City Saturday night, said "for those who may gather that we seek to bring the steel industry to a halt, we have no regard of consequences, I swear that nothing could be further from the truth."

The union leader said the USW wants "only an equitable share of industry's profits and I can say emphatically that the industry to both industry and the nation will be worth far more than the face value of that share."

Cooper and McDonald agreed to the recess Friday after both admitted that negotiators were fatigued from the grain of the talks.

VIENTIANE, Laos, March 26 (AP)—The rightwing Laotian government accused today that the United States was playing into communist hands by trying to force it into a neutralist-led coalition regime.

"It is evident that the communists will launch at the differences between America and Laos nationalists, and will exploit this situation," the government's official spokesman, Sitsoukha Champassak, said.

Sitsoukha voiced his "regret" at the tough language which Assistant Secretary of State for Far Eastern Affairs Averell Harriman used here with strongman Gen. Phoumi Savanay and other rightwing leaders in an unsuccessful mission to bring them around to the U. S. point of view.

Sitsoukha said Harriman's final meeting here with Phoumi was a meeting in animated and occasionally venomous atmosphere.

Earlier, neutralist Prince Souvanna Phouma rejected a royal invitation to visit Vientiane, dubbing his hope that there might be an immediate resolution of the Laotian crisis in the wake of Harriman's week-end visit here.

Fire departments from Cedar City were called by the night clerk, Lucile Gubler of Lelah hotel.

Later fire fighting equipment from Parowan, 10 miles to the north and St. George, 54 miles to the south, were called to help control the blaze.

The fire apparently started in the cafe, and spread to the furniture store.

At the crest of the battle, four fire trucks poured approximately 3,250 gallons of water per minute on the inferno.

In addition to volunteer fire fighters, hundreds of citizens were assisting with hoses.

Castro Still Is Cuba's Top Man but Reds Diffuse Power

By LOUIS DE LA HABA
WASHINGTON, March 26—Fidel Castro is still the most important man in the Cuban government, though his role has undergone a gradual but radical transformation.

Without Castro, the communists who have been gaining increasing power and responsibility would be unable to carry out their plans, yet they have been accepted by the Cuban masses.

But, because the communists consider the flighty Castro politically unreliable, they have gradually diffused his power and the direct control he once had over every department of government.

These are the views of Cuban affairs specialists here who keep track of the most minute developments in Havana.

These specialists point out that Castro no longer is the free-wheeling, one-man show of the early days of his revolution. Instead, they believe, Castro has become a mouthpiece, or at least a man, for the policies of the emerging dictatorship in which Cuba's old-time communists play a major part.

Castro has been named secretary of the national directorate of the Integrated Revolutionary organization, a transitional group that is expected to become the nucleus of Cuba's future Soviet-styled, one-party system.

This puts Castro right in the inner circle of power in Cuba. But this power, informed observers here believe, does not include such basic aspects of the Cuban government as agriculture, industry, labor, foreign commerce and foreign policy.

Those are in the hands of the hard-line communists who share the power with Castro.

The communists need Castro, however, to put their ideas across to the Cuban masses. In this respect, Castro, a master orator, has no equal in Cuba.

His appointment as first secretary of the Politburo-to-be is interpreted here as a recognition of this fact. It is, in essence, a practical compromise that bene-

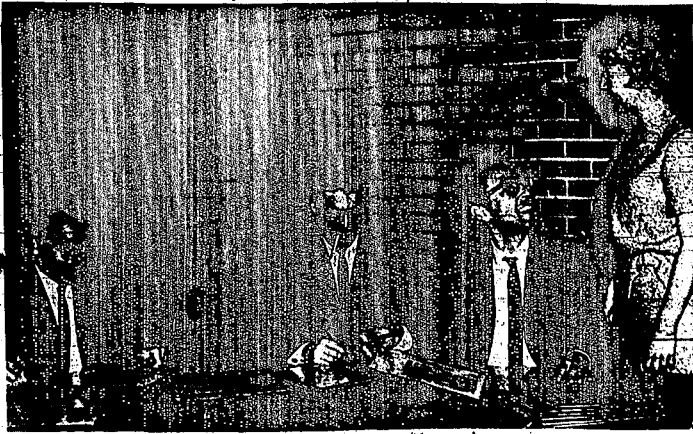

The 25-year-old Cuban underwent delicate brain surgery early yesterday at Roosevelt hospital where he was taken after being knocked senseless under a barrage of blows from the American contender.

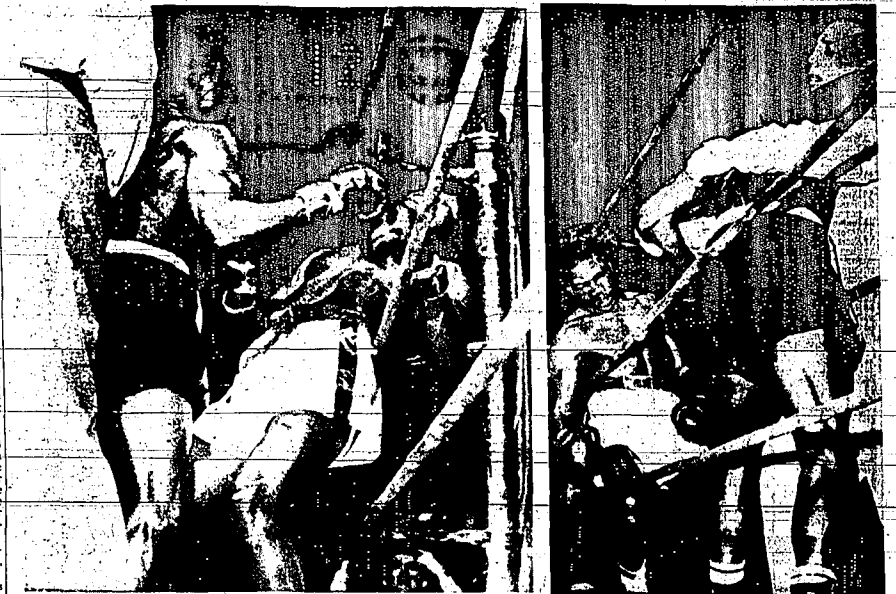
