# Aircraft Outfitted for Purdue Crashes; Three Men Are Dead

DALLAS, April 19 (UPI)—A blue and white two-engine DC8 owned by Purdue university and being outfitted to fly Big Ten football and basketball teams to games, crashed, exploded and burned late yesterday. Two men were killed instantly and a third one died early today. It happened just seconds after the plane had taken off of runway No. 13 at Dallas Love field for a check flight. The plane's tanks held 900 gallons of gasoline. The fuel ignited the wreckage in flames less than 300 yards from a freeway clogged with motorists on their way home, and from a number of homes with children playing in the yards.

# Freed Reservists Praise President

WASHINGTON, April 19 (AP)—"It is a much happier Easter now," said Pfc. Beverly Owen after he was released from the post-stroke orders from President Kennedy. Owen, 23, from Sandrift, Tex., freed Wednesday, had served three weeks of a six-month, hard-labor sentence by a court-martial which found him guilty of disrespect to his commanding general. He also was fined \$50 a month. In Washington, President Kennedy told a news conference he was remitting the sentence and also releasing him from military duty. Owen said he was "glad to be home" and "glad to be free."

# House OK's Giant Funds For Defense

WASHINGTON, April 19 (AP)—The house has unanimously approved the nation's biggest peacetime military budget—a hefty \$78 billion dollar for the next fiscal year. The appropriation bill was approved 368-0 in a roll call vote Wednesday and sent to the senate. The money bill, \$3 billion dollars less than Kennedy had requested, continues to emphasize a buildup of conventional ground forces and weapons capable of fighting limited as well as global wars. The bill earmarks 10 percent of the money for such items as six more Polaris firing nuclear submarines and 200 more Minuteman intercontinental ballistic missiles.

# Russian Ship Searched for Red Fugitive

LONDON, April 19 (AP)—Scotland Yard detectives reported that they had searched a Russian ship, the British diplomat who defected to Russia nearly 11 years ago with Donald Maclean, was not aboard the ship which arrived here today. British authorities had speculated that Burgess might have been on the Russian ship, but that none of the passengers was Burgess.

# Slides Reported

LIMA, Peru, April 19 (AP)—A landslide triggered slides in northern Peru killed at least three persons yesterday and blocked the railway line between Lima and Arequipa. The landslide occurred in the mining town of Quivilay, about 300 miles north of Lima, where a number of miners' homes were swept away.

# Ringleader in Gem Prison Riot Dug Way Out of Minidoka Jail in 1953

RUBERT, April 19 (AP)—One of the rebellious convicts at Idaho State penitentiary who apparently instigated an outbreak Wednesday at the state prison in Boise also was a trouble maker for Minidoka county officials, sheriff's reports reveal. Sheriff Tom Johnson, who also held the post in 1953, said Paul Mahaffey, 34, was arrested along with Jose Pias in July of that year, charged with beating and robbing Frank Chasias. # Exploding Meteor Leaves Trail Of Light From Kansas to Coast

SALT LAKE CITY, April 19 (AP)—A dazzling multi-colored light, apparently from an exploding meteor, flashed across the western sky from Kansas to California Wednesday night. The light was so brilliant that street lamps in Eureka, Utah—operated by a photo-electric system—went off momentarily just as they do automatically at daybreak. The flash lasted only seconds. Many people reported hearing what sounded like an explosion as the fireball vanished. Hundreds of people telephoned newspapers, law enforcement officials and radio and television stations asking about it.

# Delay Is Probable For Relief on Tax

WASHINGTON, April 19 (AP)—Congress may postpone action this year on proposals to grant tax relief to political contributors and to tighten up legal provisions on campaign spending. Influential house members said they had found colleagues unenthusiastic about acting on a proposed \$10 tax credit for political donors and a senate-passed measure increasing the ceiling in expenditures by the two major parties. President Kennedy is expected to sign legislation on a message incorporating recommendations of a bipartisan commission for tax incentives to broaden the base of political contributions.

# Two Persons Seek Offices In Elections

Two more candidates have filed petitions for candidacies. They are Harry Turner, Twin Falls, who filed for reelection as a state representative, and T. F. Morrison, Murghar, who filed his petition for county commissioner seat in the district. Both are Republicans.

# Reds Replace Command of Berlin Troop

BERLIN, April 19 (AP)—The removal of Marshal Ivan S. Konev from command of Soviet troops in East Germany is regarded as a most significant event by Western officials in Berlin. Konev has been replaced by Col. Gen. Ivan I. Yastovskiy, the Soviet news agency said Tuesday.

BERLIN, April 19 (AP)—Retired Gen. Lucius D. Clay will leave the field. He is in company D, Fourth Infantry, at the U.S. headquarters announced Wednesday.

Peck said the windows were broken sometime between 4:30 p.m. Tuesday and 8 a.m. Wednesday.

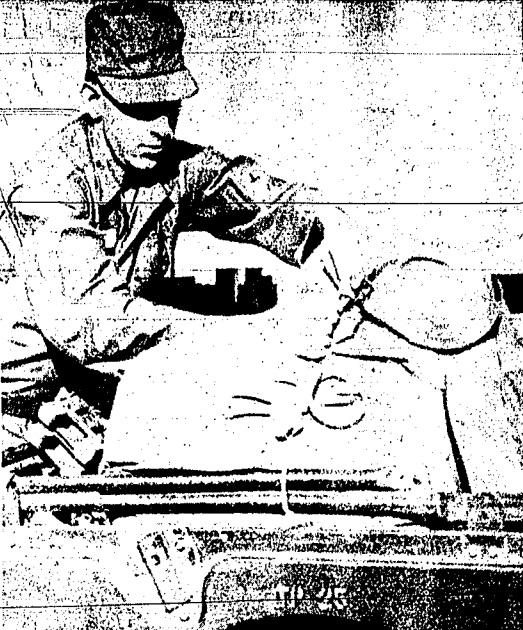

**Castro Charges Fights Planned**

MIAMI, April 19 (AP)—Havana radio charged yesterday "500 Cubans in political asylum in the U.S. naval base at Guantanamo" are planning to bolt for the mountains to fight Fidel Castro.

It was the first time the official government radio, heard in Miami, has rumored Cubans have fled into the base for refuge. Most of them are line employees who have asked to live on the reservation because of the indignities to which they are subjected outside.

The Cubans on the base are planning to take up arms against Castro in the nearby Sierra Maestra, once Castro's hideout, "to seek a way to provoke a direct attack (on Cuba) by the United States," the radio report said.

During the recording, General Maas explained the need for industry and management to give the physically handicapped a chance to prove themselves of their capabilities. He said the finest thing that can be done is to help others help themselves.

"It is a fraud to the taxpayers to train the physically handicapped for jobs which are not available to the able-bodied of industry to give them a chance," General Maas said.

"What convinces the Asian and African countries through deeds of the true meaning of democracy, and they are becoming tremendously impressed with what we are doing in the U. S. in our great attitudes with the physically handicapped," he noted.

He stated that if the U. S. continues to show the world that democracy produces people who are interested in seeing that every man and woman is given equal opportunity, it will win the cold war.

General Maas was a congressman from Minnesota for 18 years and was endorsed by Dwight Eisenhower to the Presidential Committee on Employment of the Handicapped in 1954. He received the Carnegie medal in 1953 when he discovered a man with a loaded pistol who had shot several members of congress while it was in session.

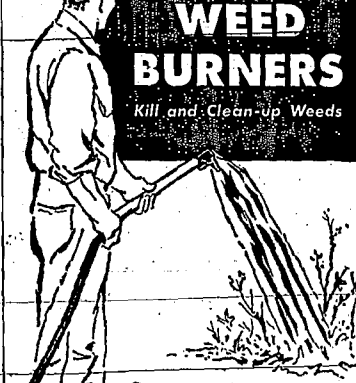

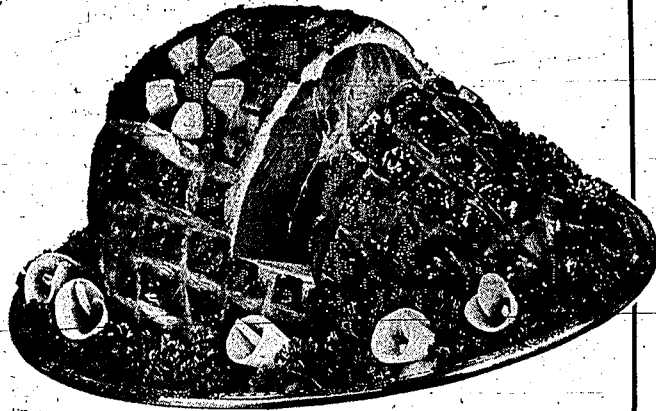

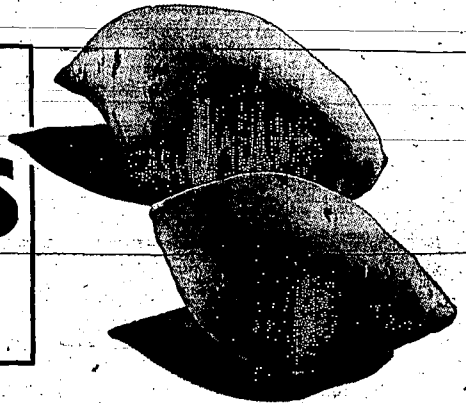

## Kramer Loses Battle for Tennis Power

NEW YORK, April 19 (AP)—The long and bitter battle between money-man Jack Kramer and his professional in one corner and the United States Tennis Association in the other was over today—with the amateurs the winners.

For years, the free-wheeling Kramer, undisputed czar of the pros, gave the USTA the hitters. One by one, he snatched the stars and forced them to compete with the amateurs in the Davis-cup teams of the United States and Australia were severely depleted as a result of his raids.

Now the remaining professionals are going to try a new tactic to persuade the world tennis bodies to permit open tournaments. Their organization is the International Professional Tennis Players association.

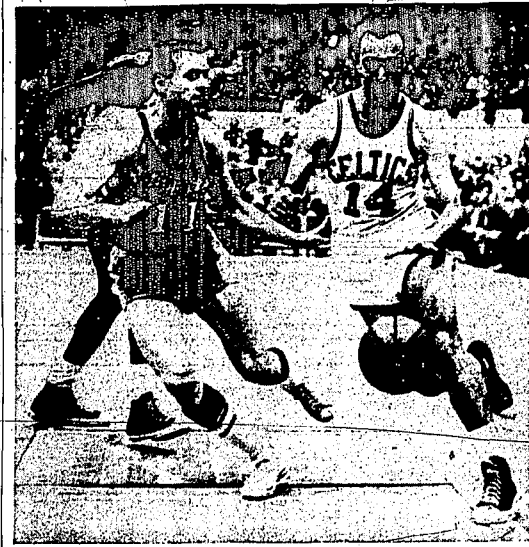

"We think open tennis is necessary for the salvation of the game," Mackay said. "Kramer may play on as an adviser or in some other capacity, but he no longer will be the boss crooner."

Boston led most of the way in the game played before a sell-out crowd of 13,909 in Boston Garden. But the Celtics had to beat down the tenacious Lakers in a five-minute overtime session after Frank Selvy brought Los Angeles back from the brink of defeat in the final 40 seconds of regulation play. 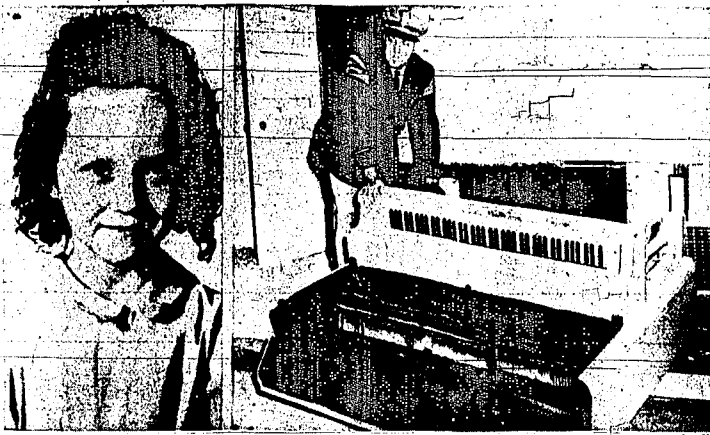

"This is a foundation on which a true approach to peace can be built," he said. "The Jaycee creed says, 'We believe that faith in God gives meaning and purpose to human life; that the brotherhood of man transcends the frontiers of nations; that economic justice can best be won by free men through free enterprise; that the government is of laws rather than of men; that Earth's great treasure lies in human personality and that service to humanity is the best work of life.'

Governor Smylie discussed the urgent need for action in the Latin American countries. He said "Our problems with the Latin countries should be straightened out."

"They belong on 'our side for three reasons," he said. "One, their history leads in the direction of freedom western style; two, Castro already controls Cuba which on the eastern approach of the Panama canal which is vital to the United States."

The third reason Smylie mentioned is the fact the Latin Americans wanted to be on the side of the U.S.

"One of the first major doctrines of the United States," the Monroe doctrine, concerned freedom for Latin America," he said. Governor Smylie concerned the urgency of this problem by telling of his visit with Khrushchev in 1960. At that time hoping to meet with Khrushchev, they asked why he has sent troops to Hungary. Khrushchev answered with a question, "Would you permit Cuba to become a communist?" Smylie told the group at that time he was sure that every man in a present including Khrushchev was positive that the U.S. would not permit this.
