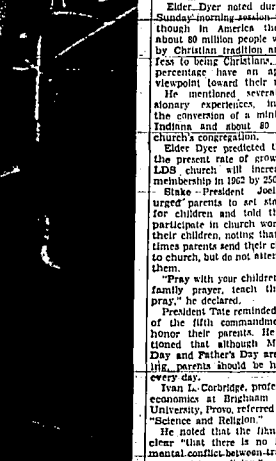

They're Committed

At least two candidates for governor have hitched their hopes to solid issues in Idaho's primary election this year. Win or lose, they have committed themselves to controversial stands that could either elect or defeat them. Vernon K. Smith, Democratic candidate for governor, is basing his campaign almost exclusively on legalized gambling. George Crookham, Republican candidate, is stumping the state in support of a sales tax.

Because there are more than two candidates for governor on both sides of the political fence, don't be too surprised if both Smith and Crookham show up in runoff primaries. By now, both candidates have discovered there are certain liabilities to one-issue campaigning, but the benefits may be enough to offset them.

Such campaigning is designed to ensure every possible vote of voters who approve of either issue. Their support is solid, while other candidates of both parties will be fighting for the votes not given Smith or Crookham.

Mr. Smith's basic figures are the center because he has more opponents to divide up the anti-gambling vote. But when he comes down to the runoff primary, assuming he is one of the finalists, then the anti-gambling vote will be concentrated in one candidate and Smith doesn't figure to pick up any more votes.

By the same token, if there is a runoff primary on the Republican ballot, Mr. Crookham would be running against odds, if he were one of the finalists. The Times-News Straight Ballot on the sales tax might be an indication that Mr. Crookham already is running against heavy odds.

But if some quirk of elections should pit Mr. Crookham against Mr. Smith in November, what a quandary would face voters? Which would be the lesser of two evils: the possibility of a sales tax or the possibility of legalized gambling?

POWER ISSUE AGAIN

Public vs. private power, a perennial issue in Idaho elections, has sneaked into this year's election with the anti-nuclear proposal of the Bonneville power administration in all of Idaho. It's just one more issue on which candidates will be declaring themselves. Some of the other hot potatoes that have arisen so far include an Idaho sales tax, federal controls for farmers and wilderness bill.

Primary reason for Idaho Democratic delegation to congress bringing the public vs. private power issue into the election at this particular stage is Idaho Power company's bid and perhaps ill-considered request for a 13.7 per cent rate increase. It's a ploy designed to win votes from Idahoans who are irritated and opposed to Idaho Power's request.

Candidates have never been bashful about taking a stand in the power battle and none is likely to hesitate now. Democrats probably will favor the idea and Republicans will oppose public power in any form.

James Amest was among the first to register his strong stand against the latest public power proposal. The Burley attorney who is running for the office presently held by Rep. Ralph Harding, didn't mind any words in his strong stand against the Bonneville plan.

He made a couple of points to taxpayer should ever forget. He pointed out Bonneville lost some 13 million dollars last year and emphasized that taxpayers always pay the deficit in public power installations. Amest also noted the sharp loss of tax income whenever public power takes over a power market. Here, again, it's the taxpayer who has to pick up the tab.

So when all the intangibles are added to the public power bill, perhaps public power isn't such a panacea after all.

Idaho's voters have always rejected public power proposals in the past and there's no reason to expect any different results now.

IT MIGHT NOT WORK

Walter P. Reuther told his United Automobile Workers union that more drastic action was needed by the government to end unemployment and spur the U. S. economy. Reuther, who has put in a plan for new jobs for economic progress, said the UAW supported Kennedy but didn't think he'd go far enough and urged delegates to get out and work for the election of liberals this year.

Reuther, a politician can be expected to miss the message of "we're backing you all the way, but what are you going to do for us?"

Mr. Reuther may have been thinking of the recent age case when he said President Kennedy "brought a new vitality, intelligence and compassion to the conduct of the federal government."

It will be interesting to see what happens when it comes time for the UAW to negotiate again with the auto industry.

WHIRLIGIG

WASHINGTON (AP)—The southern sponsors of the Negro migration to northern cities may be applying themselves by inaugurating a new section of many monstrous civil rights advocates an emergency, state legislators and members of congress. Such a result appears inevitable under the present system and all the talk of politicians.

Even more to the disadvantage of Dixie, the movement of Negroes to the north is a chaotic occupancy of the White House by ultra-liberal President Kennedy and his cabinet. They owe a heavy obligation to the colored voters, as did FDR and Harry S. Truman, and as does every president since.

These migrants, who may never have been able to vote in the South, will be taken in tow by friends and foes alike as Democratic precinct workers and persuaded to grasp their new suffrage opportunities. They will not vote as a bloc, and the majority of a voting bloc estimated to be at least 80 per cent or more Democratic.

URBAN AND DEMOCRATIC—As the dispersion trend during and since World War II has spread, the masses of Negroes will settle in the cities. With the urban element gaining more economic and political power in legislative bodies, California and other states, during the next election, the Democrats will continue to dominate these seats of ballot-box influence.

It will more than neutralize the Republican national committee's current effort to strengthen its base in the rural areas of the South and West of the North, Midwest and Far West.

Northern politicians and Negro spokesmen have branded this involuntary hege as a "crucial test" and so it will be both politically and economically, the South may suffer most severely from the impact in the long run.

The rapidly industrializing South, which even now is inviting more northern factories to locate in its office or plant building, is looking. This prospect is all the more threatening because impartial and nonpolitical studies report that the most productive workers are those who are pulling up stakes. The old folk are not able to adjust to such a sharp shift in their living conditions.

BALANCE OF POWER IN 10 STATES

The current migration has prompted a study of the political balance of power in 10 states in the 1950-60 decade. This does not provide a complete picture for it does not include the states of New York, Pennsylvania and West Virginia and during World War II at the call of federal agencies.

States where the Negro vote may be decisive are: California, 34,400,000; Connecticut, 3,000,000; Illinois, 19,000,000; Indiana, 4,300,000; Maryland, 3,600,000; Massachusetts, 3,200,000; Michigan, 7,000,000; Ohio, 13,300,000; Pennsylvania, 12,000,000; and Virginia, 3,000,000.

President Kennedy carried all of these states except Virginia and West Virginia by a margin of one to one GOP Obrivators by narrow margins.

NO HELP TO NIXON

By contrast, the Negro influx into 10 states which voted for Richard M. Nixon in 1952 and 1956, totaled 12,000,000 in 1950 in agricultural Vermont to 18,000 in Washington.

A recent review of the 1960 results, former Vice President Nixon admitted to a reporter for a Negro magazine that he lost out because he failed to get the Negro vote in the states that race. His Negro advisers and campaign workers were a final factor helpful to the Democrats. As the administration's tactics open voting booths in the South to the Negroes, their votes will be counted and their political weight. And, of course, they will vote with their northern brethren in voting Democratic.

VIEWS OF OTHERS

NOT AN "ACT OF GOD"—A two-line telephone pole fell on a Pennsylvania motorist's automobile. When the driver sued, the Columbia Telephone company countered that the pole fell because of "an act of God."

The ways of the Lord are deep and unsearchable, but that it is not the province of man to pass judgment upon what is beyond human comprehension. In this case, the telephone company is liable for the damage to the automobile which it inflicted on the plaintiff's car."

POTATO NUMBERS GAME

The "numbers game" implication in the national potato control proposal should sober the nation out of a potato marketing control program. Of the 6,846,000 potato growers in the nation, only 31,842 would be eligible to vote in the referendum on potato control.

If Idaho's 6,261 growers, 5,200 would be eligible to vote.

Those growing more than two acres of potatoes are embraced in the marketing order plan. But what if all of the uncontrolled growers, who are less than one per cent of the crop, say, will be an improved price once supply and demand is stabilized, produce up to the two acre rule.

True, these small growers are not now a market factor. But once a parity price is dangled in front of them, they could be influential in making a quick shift of the national potato market. And they all would be eligible to vote in the referendum on any marketing regulations.

It is another reason why potato controls are unwelcome to growers.

WASHINGTON, May 7 (AP)—George Romney, an industrialist, turned politician, has just announced that he will probably resign any opposition of union leaders to his effort to be elected governor of Michigan.

So we schedule a week-end trip for the first weekend in June. Just get it. It's up to you.

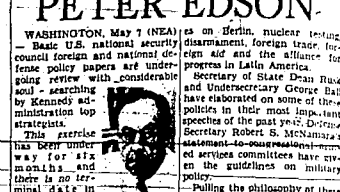

1/2 cup shortening

2 eggs, slightly beaten
1 1/2 cups sifted all-purpose flour
1/2 teaspoon double-acting baking powder
1/2 teaspoon salt
1 cup mashed ripe bananas
Preheat oven to 350 degrees (moderate). Beat shortening until creamy and fluffy, 2 minutes at medium speed on electric mixer. Gradually add eggs, beating until light and fluffy after each addition. Add sugar and beat until thick and pale cream. Grease loaf pan and line with wax paper. Add alternately with bananas; blend thoroughly after each addition. Grease bottom only of a loaf pan (approximately 4 1/2 x 8 1/2 inches). Turn batter into pan. Bake 30 to 40 minutes or until cake tester inserted in center comes out clean and dry. Let bread cool in pan (30 to 35 minutes) before turning out cake.
