U.S. Air Force Jets Land in Thailand to Bolster Defenses Against Reds

BANGKOK, Thailand, May 16 (AP)—A dozen U. S. air force jets flew into Bangkok today as the arrival of a new U. S. Southeast Asian command to help defend Thailand from any communist thrust into the area. As the swift Super Sabres landed, U. S. military sources reported that Laotian troops had moved north into the area.

Grange Notes Direct Mail Advertising

Postal patrons are again receiving a flood of advertising from out-of-state home improvement companies, offering enticing free gifts. Reports William Grange, Twin Falls Chamber of Commerce secretary-manager, adding that the only objection is to allow a salesman to discuss the program in detail.

Grange cited numerous instances where local home improvement companies have added two and three times the price a local contractor would have bid for the same job, without doing with some of these fraudulent operators.

"If these fellows are doing an honest job, they will have no objection to your comparing the quality material and contract with that of a local contractor," said Grange.

"If they can't stand the light of a little investigation, that is a pretty good clue to do the business with them," Grange added, adding that in one case a local contractor paid for a job, the old stove was removed from the house, and the new stove was ordered again to replace the old one.

He stated that all contracts involving large sums of money should be checked thoroughly by homeowners or a local attorney before a contract is signed.

News Around Idaho

BOISE, May 16 (AP)—Assignment of A. J. Webber as assistant state conservationist will be announced by Lee T. Morgan, state conservationist, for the conservation service, Webber, who is being transferred from the Salt Lake City office, will be assigned to the Boise office, which is being transferred to Mountain as assistant state conservationist for Hawaii.

MOSCOW, May 16 (AP)—Francis Nordin, principal at Moscow high school for 13 years, was notified of his resignation effective at the end of the school year. School Superintendent E. B. McDonald said a successor will be named soon. Board members indicated it would be someone not now teaching at the high school.

MOSCOW, May 16 (AP)—Clarence Smith, 31, testified yesterday he was dragged and forced under threat of death to accompany another man and woman to Culiacas last summer where the three are accused of robbing a bank. Smith claims the government's key witness in U. S. district court at the trial of himself and Eugene Garvey, 24, and Albert Bill, 31, all of Spokane, who broke into safe deposit vaults in the Culiacas branch of the Idaho First Security bank, about \$23,000 in cash was stolen and some \$50,000 in non-negotiable bonds. Papers and records were strewn about the floor of the bank.

POCATELLO, May 16 (AP)—Dr. David W. McCormick has been named to the Idaho advisory committee to the U. S. commission on civil rights. He is the second Pocatello man to be appointed to the body. Eugene V. Price was named earlier. McCormick is one of the founders of the Pocatello committee of Civil rights.

BOISE, May 16 (AP)—Gov. Robert E. Smylie has appointed T. E. Burton, state board of education, to the vacancy created by the death of Andrew S. Little of Emmett. The term runs until Jan. 1, 1964.

IDAHO FALLS, May 16 (AP)—A 31-year-old Idaho Falls man, charged with first degree murder, has asked for time to consult an attorney. C. T. Thomas was arrested last Saturday night for the slaying of a 19-year-old girl, Bertha Kramm, at the Idaho Falls hotel. The slaying occurred at the rear of a home, but that it was accidental.

BOISE, May 16 (AP)—Despite a late start, Idaho's farm work generally was ahead of normal by May 1, the U. S. department of agriculture reported today. The agency said that a combination of warm and dry April permitted fieldwork to go ahead rapidly, making up for delays earlier because of wet weather. Warmer than average weather during the month favored growth of forage crops. The department said, but cool nights retarded growth at high elevations.

IDAHO FALLS, May 16 (AP)—Alfred P. Ames, Republican candidate for state auditor, told Idaho Falls citizens club members Tuesday night that the increasing complexity of modern state government and emphasis on accountability of the growing amount of state funds at the disposal of state officials increases the importance and influence of the state auditor.

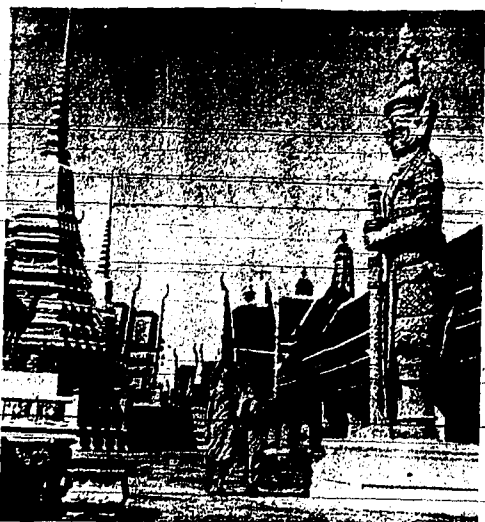

Italy Abolishes Ads for Tobacco

ROME, May 16 (AP)—Advertising of tobacco in any form will be banned throughout Italy, under a law effective today.

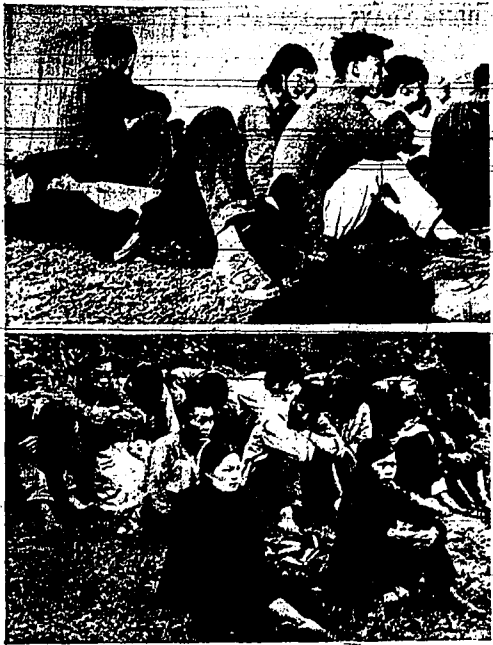
