No official would discuss this facet of the case for the record, but there were indications that they were not dismissing this theory. A briefcase bearing the initials "T.C.D." was found among the debris after the plane disintegrated in the air, was in custody of federal bureau investigators.

Hodges Urges Positive Action To Counter Stock Mart Slump

WASHINGTON, May 29 (AP)—Secretary of Commerce Luther H. Hodges recommended today that the administration adopt "positive action rather than words" to help counter the jolt to confidence caused by slumping stock prices. Hodges told a news conference he believes two steps should be taken: 1. "I would favor an announcement as quickly as possible that we ought to have a tax overhaul," he said. Elaborating, he expressed hope that such an overhaul would include a net reduction in both individual and corporate income taxes.
