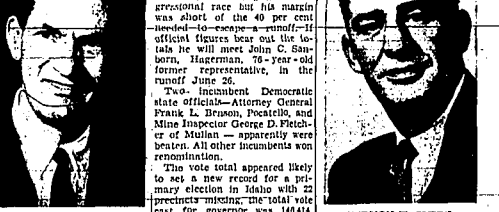

KANSAS CITY, Kans., June 6—A federal judge ruled Tuesday that ex-soldier George John Gessner is mentally ill and cannot stand trial now on charge of giving nuclear secrets to the Russians.

Judge Arthur J. Stanley Jr. sent Gessner, 35, back to the St. Louis medical center at Springfield, Mo., for treatment.

Gessner, formerly of Homestead, Pa., is accused of telling officials of the Soviet embassy in Mexico City about the fitting systems of two gun-type nuclear weapons.

Gessner went to Mexico City after deserting Dec. 7, 1950 from Ft. Belvoir, Tex., where he was a nuclear weapons maintenance specialist. He served a term at Ft. Leavenworth, Kans., for desertion.

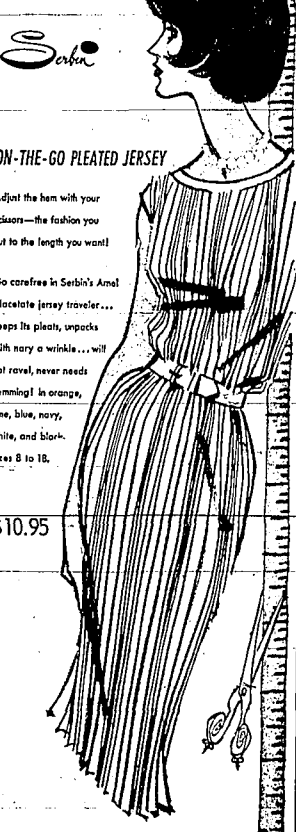

Koreans Defy Ban; Protest Yank Assault

SEOUL, South Korea, June 6—A thousand students defied a martial law ban on demonstrations today and marched on the U.S. embassy to protest the beating of a Korean by two American servicemen.

A triple row of police jeeps barricaded the front entrance to the embassy, and the students withdrew after an appeal by Maj. Gen. Kim Chin-woo, commander of the Royal Garrison. Then they split into small groups and tried to reach the embassy through alleys and side streets.

Again they were met by police who arrested more than 100 of the demonstrators. There was no violence.

The assault has charged two journalists—David W. Swanson, 25, Galesburg, Ill., and Thomas M. White, 25, Washington, Ill.—with severely beating a South Korean cabinet secretary at a front line news late last month.

Seoul newspapers have reported two other recent incidents of Koreans being beaten by American servicemen.

NEW WEST, Fla., June 6—Romania has shipped the first of 1500 specially built tractors ordered by Cuba. Havana radio reported Tuesday.

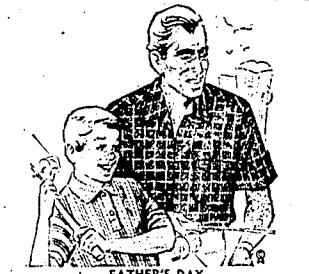

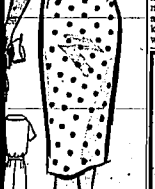

Food for Americans
By GAYNOR MADDOX

COOK KOSHER-BEEF
Katsuro Mito, prominent Honolulu attorney of Japanese ancestry is a hospital gourmet. He invited us to dinner at his beautiful home above the city with a sweeping view of Diamond Head and the sea. His son David, junior at Punahou school, helped his talented father at the potluck.

For hours d'ouze there were little rice-carrying fish called "Ushimono" from the cold waters of Hokkaido, Japan's northern-most island. Others included grilled, dried and salted octopus, selected highly regarded by the Japanese and Hawaiians; small shells filled with scallops; cool and nice non-irradiated; saki and saki niku niku. Mrs. Mito, the gracious and cultured daughter of a Honolulu artist, passed these delicacies to the guests.

But kosher corned beef cooked in its own stock was the main event. Our host, counselor for Japan Airlines, called it the main event, specially—a graduate of the University of Colorado, he became almost profane as he told us how it does it.

He admitted his measurements were depending on the mood, taste and eye-appeal. Use a 10- to 14-pound piece of kosher corned beef. Trim fat and cord. Simmer in saki sauce.

For 2 to 3 hours, turning several times and pricking to allow sauce to penetrate the meat. Cool and set aside in sauce overnight.

Saki Sauce
(Yields about 1/2 gallon)
Combine 4 cups saki (Japanese rice wine) and equal amount of cold water. Add soy sauce, grated onion, chopped green onions, dash of red pepper, 1/2 tsp. ground ginger, and 2 tablespoons Ajinomoto. Simmer 1 hour, stirring frequently. Do not allow to boil. (Sherry or dry red wine can be substituted for the saki.)

To Smoke
Use any standard smoking grill. Avoid using too much charcoal and place non-irradiated below meat. Add saki-sauce. Wrap marinated corned beef in heavy duty quilted foil, fat side up. Pour in more sauce before sealing foil covering. Place on grill. Smoke 2 to 3 hours depending on weight and intensity of heat. Steady low heat gets best results.

One hour before done, open foil to expose meat to fire. Baste with more sauce. When it is done?

"Use a tone-timed fork. It goes through the meat with just the right care, amounting to loving resistance, then I should know it is done to perfection," our host explained with a smile.

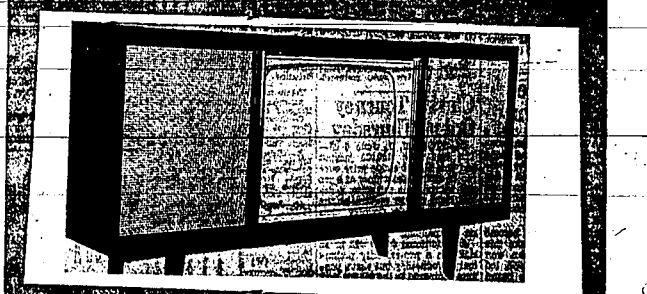

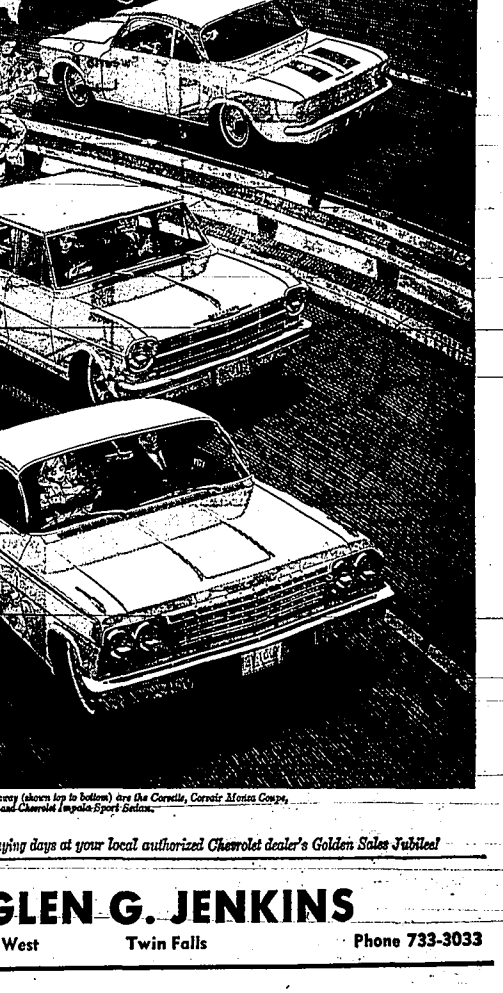

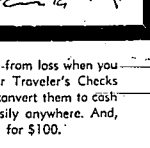

Helicopters Lead Sortie On Viet Cong

Saigon, South Viet Nam, June 6 (AP)—U. S. army helicopters today flew South Vietnamese troops into battle against communist rebels, helping spring a trap in which 22 rebels were killed and four captured.

One helicopter was damaged by small arms fire from the ground and had to drop out of formation during the attack 40 miles south of Saigon. No U. S. personnel were believed hit, informed sources said.

Vietnamese troop losses were not disclosed.

It was the third time this week that U. S. helicopters aided government troops against the Viet Cong rebels in the rice paddies and marshes around Saigon. On Monday, helicopters came in to rescue a village under rebel attack. Others helped a government force wipe out 22 rebels in another area.
