It would allow the president to increase the sugar quota by 10 percent if the president determines that it is in the national interest to do so.

# Far Eastern Reds Prompt U.S. Leaders

GENEVA, July 3 (AP)—Diplomatic sources said here today Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev has ordered the U.S. to stop its military aid to the Chinese because it could force the Kremlin to deal with a time-consuming and difficult foreign policy problem. The diplomats, attending the Geneva summit, said such a move on Khrushchev's part would be a warning against any attack on Red China. He would come to Peking's aid in the event of a crisis.

### Brunt's Anti-Gaming View Angers Smith; Split Is Aired

BY WILLIAM SBOUET  
BOISE, July 3 (AP)—State Democratic Chairman A. W. (Bill) Brunt has angered the party's candidate for governor by urging a neutral stand on the issue of legalized gambling for Idaho.

Vernon K. Smith, the pro-gaming Democratic nominee, has told friends he thinks Brunt was wrong in urging delegates to the party's platform convention to oppose a plan that would endorse Smith's plan for local option casino gambling.

Smith's supporters say he considers Brunt's position at a party meeting in Idaho Falls as "unfortunate."

"He (Smith) believes that as party chairman, at a time like this, his position and that of a position of impartiality," said a source close to Smith.

"A chairman has no right to take a position on a subject," said a Smith supporter, who refused to be quoted by name.

The split between Smith and Brunt came into the open at the party meeting Saturday night which was intended to give Smith an opportunity to discuss his program with eastern Idaho Democrats.

Attending the meeting were 115 party workers, including delegates to the platform convention to be held in Idaho Falls July 10.

Smith told the group that the convention must endorse local option gambling. "If we wretch on the election, we deserve to lose," he declared.

Brunt, however, persisted in urging that neutral positions be taken on all controversial issues, including gambling.

The rift between Smith and Brunt is virtually certain to result in the naming of a new state chairman at the platform convention.

The party's gubernatorial nominee traditionally has the biggest voice in choosing a chairman and Smith will have nothing to do with Brunt.

Brunt has not said whether he will be a candidate for the top party post at the convention.

Smith will be designated as the role to be played at the convention by the three Democratic members of Idaho's congressional delegation, all of whom are seeking reelection. They are all opposed to gambling.

One of whom, Sen. Frank Church, said Monday that he believes the party will work out its differences over gambling.

Smith has said the same thing. "I have every confidence that the Democratic party will adopt a local option gaming plank which will be fully satisfactory to every one concerned," Smith said Monday.

But Church and Smith are poles apart on the gambling issue, and there appears to be little chance of the convention coming up with a plank that will satisfy
