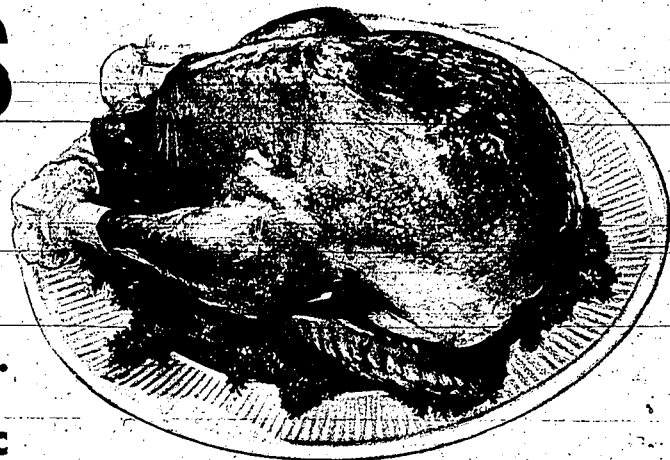

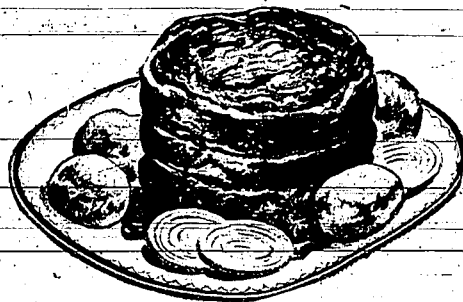

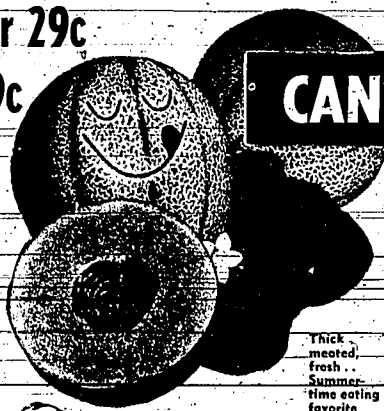

CAMBRIDGE, Mass., July 5 (AP)—Professional burglars cracked a safe at Harvard university's mineralogical museum, and stole \$50,000 worth of gems including an 84 carat diamond, police disclosed today.

The thieves said about 50 gems were taken and the thieves apparently had some knowledge of precious stones.

"Harvard university spokesman said, however, the theft was 'somewhat puzzling'—since the stones are primarily useful only for scientific research and teaching.

"Their value is chiefly scientific because of their unusual crystalline structure, their peculiar color and in some instances where they were found," the spokesman said.

Police said a "professional" broke the steel and concrete safe from which selected gems including diamonds, opals, rubies, sapphires, and beryls were taken.

The thieves also took selected gems from the display cases in the museum.

"Harvard officials denied published reports that the gems were valued at half a million dollars."

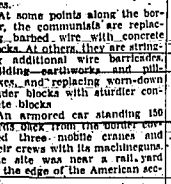
Communist Guns Guard Workers

"Sugar production in the western hemisphere is down 5.6 per cent, representing a cut of 1.6 million tons. The Cuban output declined nearly 2.1 million tons and there also were declines in Argentina, Peru, Chile and other countries. However, some of the declines were offset by increases in the United States and Brazil.

Most African countries showed gains in sugar production in the 1961-62 crop year. Altogether they produced slightly more than three million tons; an increase of 17.2 per cent over the previous season.

Plentiful fruits include cantaloupes, watermelons, peaches, lemons and oranges. Locally, some may be at bargain prices.

Meats in supply include chicken, turkey, mutton, smoked picnic meats and a variety of beef, lamb and pork cuts. Many stores are advertising "milk-fed spring lamb."

One retail chain is featuring the beef at 59 cents a pound in its New York City stores.

As usual, dairy products remain in abundance. Eggs are in the same category as the July fish plentiful, says the U. S. department of agriculture, include filets, shrimp and canned tuna.

Shoshone BLM District Is Ready for Bad Fire Season

SHOSHONE, July 5—Preparations are now complete by the Shoshone district within the Shoshone district land management for the fire season. James Gabetas, fire control officer, states this condition in many years.

Because of the great amount of moisture during May—there is a large volume of flash fuel this year. The district already has experienced 10 fires, one of which burned 25,000 acres northeast of Richfield. This large fire was caused by lightning.

In past years many of the fires, Gabetas says, have been man-caused, usually through carelessness. Many of these fires are caused by unauthorized burning of private lands adjacent to public lands, as well as encampments and smokers.

Last year the cooperation received from land owners and campers was better than ever before. However, even more care will have to be taken this year.

The fire season as set by the governor is May 1 to Oct. 31, during which time anyone violating the law on private lands must obtain a burning permit.

Anyone wishing a burning permit within the Shoshone district must contact the BLM office here, telephone 988-2373.

Trained and experienced fire personnel will then assist in setting up a burning plan and outlining the necessary conditions that must be met before a burning permit can be issued, Gabetas explained.

Anyone failing to obtain a burning permit is guilty of a misdemeanor, Gabetas points out. This is punishable by a maximum of a \$500 fine and six months in jail.

Also should be immediately reported to the Shoshone fire dispatcher, 988-2373.

The dispatcher can be reached seven days a week, from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. Fire reported after 8 p.m. should be spotted to 988-2373, and calls may be disconnected, the control officer points out.

Three Aimed At Medics in Canada Strike

REGINA, Sask., July 5 (U)—The threat of violence was injected today into the strike of Saskatchewan doctors against the government's compulsory medical care program. Tempers grew short as more doctors reportedly were moving out of the province.

As the government program unfolded, the doctors moved into the fifth day, each side sought to marshal public support. Neither side showed any sign of backing down.

The doctors struck to their demand that provincial Premier Woodrow Lloyd's Socialist government do away with the compulsory feature of the program.

The government refused to budge and claimed the medical care situation was apparently under control. Deputy Premier J. H. Brockelbank declared there "appears nothing in the nature of panic and alarm."

But in the western Saskatchewan town of Swift Current, police suits were posted at the homes of two doctors after an organization calling itself the "Swift Current Citizens Safety Committee" threatened the doctors and their families.

The threats, in letters to the town's weekly newspaper and a radio station, ordered the doctors to get down from their "chosen pedestal" and return to normal practice by Friday morning. Otherwise the letters warned, the doctors would "suffer such harm to themselves, their families or their property as the organization may deem fit."

Harriman Meets With Laotian

GENEVA, July 5 (U.S. assistant secretary of state W. Averell Harriman conferred privately today with Laotian neutralist premier Prince Souvanna Phouma on a withdrawal of SEATO's protective umbrella from Laos.

The new Laotian government wants the protection of the SEATO alliance to be withdrawn once the kingdom's neutrality is proclaimed by the 14 nation conference here.

The SEATO question is one of the key issues which so far have not been agreed upon by conference members.

The communists are backing Laos demand and the western powers—at the conference—are authoritatively reported prepared to drop the protective pledge which SEATO has extended to Laos in the past.

DEFENSES INSPECTED

TAIPEI, Formosa, July 5 (U.S. Gen. Liu An-shih, commander in chief of the Chinese-Nationalist army, inspected the defenses of the island fortress of Quemoy on Wednesday and expressed confidence the Chinese communists would be crushed if they attacked.

International Kidnaping, Murder Probe Is Reopened

WASHINGTON, July 5 (U.S. Dept. of Justice announced today that it will reopen a probe into charges of international kidnaping and assassination.

The center of the cloak and dagger intrigue is Dr. Jesus de Galindez, who slipped through a New York subway into oblivion on a night in 1956 after writing a book to expose the brutalities of Gen. Rafael Trujillo's long-fisted dictatorship in the Dominican Republic.

Pops of Trujillo contended the charges and there were headlines and investigations. But no light was shed on Dr. Galindez's disappearance, nor was he ever reported seen alive again.
