# Frail-Looking Youth Is Rugged Veteran After Surviving Wilds

**SALT LAKE CITY, July 16 (AP)**—Young Keith Henry Davis might look frail and feeble—but he's a real veteran of rugged survival in the wilderness today. For three and one-half days the 12-year-old boy scout lived on raw fish in the high Uinta mountains of northeastern Utah. He was lost. It showed, the temperatures dropped below freezing, and there was a violent, summer thunderstorm. At night he walked and ran to keep warm. In the day, he slept or looked for his camp or rescuers.

He ate raw, the few fish he had caught. It was while fishing in the Salt Lake City area Thursday when he went off by himself to fish, but got lost. His father, Keith J. Davis, a painting contractor from the Salt Lake suburb of Kearns, searched day and night for his son the next three days. Hundreds joined in the search on the ground, in the air and on the lake. No sign.

He said the Western plan was "no compromise at all in our view."

# Insect Venom Can Be Potent As Snake Bite

From honeybees to hornets, insects can be as dangerous as any snake bite, according to a report by Dr. C. Thompson, medical director of the University of Illinois at Urbana. ## Idaho Looks Good

Although a new record in crime was set last year for the nation, Idaho looks good by comparison. J. Edgar Hoover, director of the FBI, reports four serious crimes each minute were committed across the nation in 1961. In the five states with the lowest crime in the U.S. has increased 34 per cent while the population has gained only 7 per cent. The crime rate, that is the number of crimes per 100,000 population, has gained 25 per cent in the past five years.

Even on a nationwide basis, only 15 states had a lower rate of crime per 100,000 population than Idaho. That's a favorable position for the state. Wyoming, the lowest state, had a rate of 87.7 crimes per 100,000 population.
