#3 Million Asked in Suit Against Hagerman Man, 2 Buhl Fish Food Companies

BUHL, July 18—Elwood D. Grimes, Hagerman, former superintendent of the fish hatchery at Hagerman, and two Buhl firms were named defendants in a \$3-million lawsuit filed Tuesday. Sterling Nelson and Sons, Inc., Salt Lake City, filed the suit in U.S. district court at Boise against Grimes, Ranken, Inc., Buhl Feed and Ice company, The Utah firm charges Grimes and the two companies violated both federal and state laws in the sale of fish food which was purchased by the state of Idaho.

In this petition, the Utah firm alleges it is entitled to damages for the state fish and game department's purchase of fish food at a higher price than the fish food offered by the Buhl firm.

Balloon Is Rocketed Into Space at Cape

CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla., July 18 (AP)—The largest space balloon ever launched—of the height of a 13-story building—was rocketed 922 miles above the Atlantic ocean today as a forerunner of an advanced Echo communications satellite. The gleaming silvery sphere, dubbed "Big Shot," provided a brief but spectacular show for ground observers in the Cape Canaveral area as it separated from the Thor two-stage booster, expanded to its full 135-foot diameter, and drifted across the predawn sky.

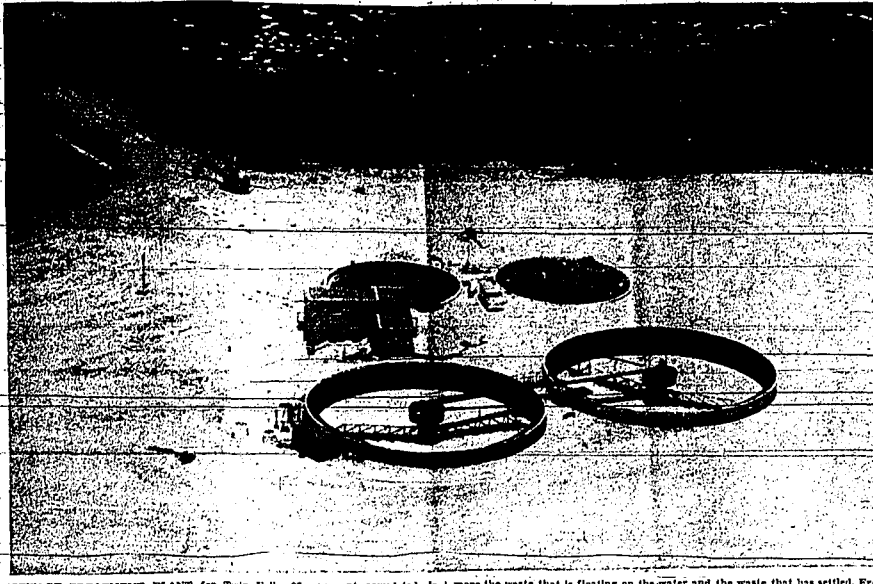

T. F. Man Is Convicted in Assault Case

O'Neal B. Tyson, 20, 473 Jackson street, Twin Falls, was found guilty Tuesday by a six-member police court jury of battery in the July 21 beating of Joe Arellano, 425 Miller avenue.

Judge Dale Adamson delayed sentencing until 1 p.m. Wednesday after a short deliberation. Arellano was beaten after he approached a car parked in front of his residence to investigate. The incident occurred about 2 a.m. June 22.

He told officers he thought a friend was parked there. When he approached the vehicle a man got out, knocked him down and kicked him in the face, he said.

2 Republicans, Brunt Assault Smith's Casino Gaming Plan

The gambling plan of Democratic gubernatorial candidate Vernon K. Smith was assaulted Wednesday as "the most phony program ever to come into Idaho's face" and "politically inspired."

Two Republicans and a Democrat voiced sharp criticism of Smith's program.

State Republican Chairman O. McMurry hit the "phony" tag on the gambling plan and state Rep. Carl H. Burt, Republican candidate for secretary of state, said he would ask the state Republican platform convention to adopt a strong anti-gambling plank.

In Idaho Falls, A. W. Brunt, who retired last week-end as State Democratic chairman, urged a write-in campaign against both Smith and Republican Gov. Robert E. Smylie.

Brunt said "there is a lot of support available" for an independent candidate for governor.

McMurry looked out at the Democrats, declaring that they had "abandoned principle for political expedience in casting aside all remnants of their former leadership in favor of their gubernatorial candidate's gambling plan."

He said that "Smith's appeal for tax relief through gambling is the most phony program ever to come into Idaho's fiscal and political history."

Brunt said gambling would result in "a deterioration of law enforcement which will lead, in many cases, to divorce courts and to unpaid grocery, dental, medical, and rent bills."

The nominee said that "law enforcement to control vice traffic must come down from the state level . . . in order to be successful."

"In my travels around Idaho I have found no sentiment for laxing law enforcement," Brunt said. "The people of Idaho are proud of the fact that our state is a clean, moral state in which to live and raise a family."

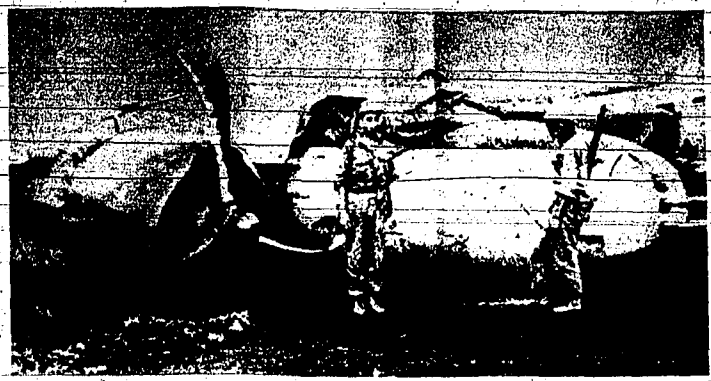

ELISABETHVILLE, Katanga, The Congo, July 18 (AP)—An estimated 10,000 African women, many of them carrying small babies, repeatedly charged a United Nations road block yesterday

and shooed armed Indian troops who fired over their heads. The shrieking women were dispersed by a U.N. helicopter three hours after they made their first attack on the roadblock. Gooding Has Address by Candidate

GOODING, July 18—Some 100 persons "attended" a farmers' union picnic Sunday afternoon in the Westside park in Gooding to hear Vernon K. Smith, Democratic candidate for governor, speak on his "tourists in Idaho" program.

Smith, who was introduced by Wellington Lenbo, gave the main outline of his program, which includes gaming on a local option basis. He also gave some high lights of the Democratic platform convention held in Idaho Falls last week-end, and said he felt delegates' approval of his program gave it more prestige.

Smith told of the great need in northern Idaho for some industry because of the closing of several mines and a shut-down of the lumbering industry. Smith said that highway 10 across that part of the state carries an average of 10,000 more cars per day in summer than in winter,

showing the potential in the tourist industry. He compared his program to that of the industrial development organization of Gooding, in an effort to build a regional processing plant, which would hire people to build it, and in turn would produce jobs for people to run it, and others to service all this. It would also bring in more people, thus increasing the value of property.

Smith stated "We should give local areas the right to decide if they would like to have gaming." This, he feels will produce a building boom within the state, which would, in turn, increase wages and decrease taxes, by broadening the tax base.

In answer to the question of an increased crime rate, Smith asserted that as long as the gambling is strictly regulated, it does not increase crime. He cited as an example the fact that Nevada was investigated by Atty. Gen. Robert Kennedy who expressed confidence that gambling was strictly regulated and controlled. Smith said that much more money should be spent on the various mental institutions over the state, both for improvement on buildings and salaries of per-
