GARDENIA, Calif., Aug. 7 (AP)—Many people would be surprised to learn that a baby who was born deformed because, she believes, she took the drug thalidomide during pregnancy.

Handicapped Webb, 27, said in a copywriting story in the Los Angeles Times—that she and her husband, William J. Webb, also 27, agreed that "her birth" would be entirely wrong.

Their infant, William J. Webb, Jr., was born June 12, with no arms. A partial left forearm and no thumbs. His hands extended from the ends of his stubby arms.

Thalidomide has been given as the cause of deformities in babies in Europe, Canada and Australia, whose mothers took the drug during pregnancy.

The initial shock of learning her child was deformed, Webb said, gradually got out of her mind. She held and held the baby in my arms. I knew everything was okay.

Mrs. Webb said she wished she could talk to Mrs. Sherri Pinkney, the Phoenix, Ariz., mother who is seeking an abortion in Shoshone, Idaho, because she has thalidomide during her pregnancy.

The Webbs are Baptists.

Mrs. Webb, a native of Germany, married her husband 15 months ago when he was stationed with the army in Bad Reichenhagen, Germany.

She said she took thalidomide in the form of a drug called Sedative, which was used in Germany during the war. She stopped taking it when she heard a warning over the radio.

The Webbs said that surgeons hope to correct their son's deformities at least partly with a series of operations.

Judges Give Timetable to New Orleans

NEW ORLEANS, Aug. 7 (AP)—The U.S. fifth circuit court appeals set the desegregation of New Orleans public schools back on its original timetable yesterday. I ordered Negroes admitted to the second and third grades

A three-judge panel of circuit judges also ordered the school board gradually to end its system of separate-but-equal school districts for Negroes and whites. The effect of the order would be ultimately to make one school system for both races. The panel consisted of Circuit Judges John Minor Wisdom, John Brown and Richard T. Rives.

The first grade has been integrated in New Orleans since November, 1960.

The court ordered abolition of the "dual-school" system—for the first and second grades in September, 1963, and to abolish it for the third, fourth and fifth grades in September, 1964.

In its ruling, the court affirmed the original desegregation plan by former U.S. Dist. Judge J. B. Kelly Wright in 1960. Wright issued the plan when the Southern Christian Leadership Conference board failed to submit one.

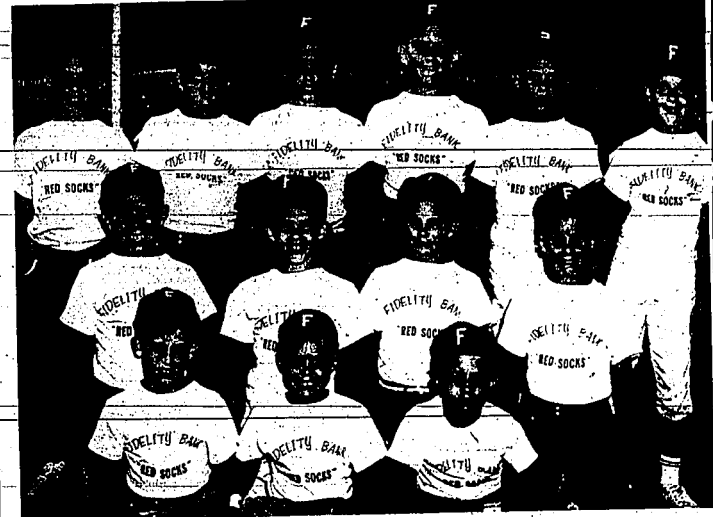

Ruling Causes Philadelphia Political Row

PHILADELPHIA, Aug. 7 (AP)—Mix one special grand jury investigation of alleged scandal in Philadelphia with a fall election for governor and a highly explosive compound of political fireworks results.

That's the mixture brewed when Common Pleas Judge Eugene Alessandrini, a Republican, directed a grand jury investigation of GOP charges of corruption in the Democratic administration of former Mayor Richardson Dilworth.

Dilworth resigned as mayor last week to become the Democratic candidate for governor. His opponent is Republican Congressman William W. Scranton, Scranton, Pa.

Dilworth says Alessandrini's ruling has political undertones. He says the grand jury probe—scheduled to begin Sept. 12—will put heading into the heart of the gubernatorial campaign. Dilworth wanted the inquiry to begin sooner.

Scranton repeatedly has attacked Dilworth's administration, and made the alleged scandals a part of his campaign, promising to clean up the city if elected governor.

Dilworth replies that any large city is likely to have some corruption, and that an investigation made during his final days as mayor, was far toward curing it.

The special investigation will be prosecuted by W. Wilson White, a Republican, who was U. S. attorney for Eastern Pennsylvania from 1958 to 1957. His first assistant is William F. Hastings Griffin, Jr., also a Republican.

Democrats said Griffin's emceeding a campaign dinner with wealthy cake and lipstick during a private dinner in 1954, and the former mayor's purchase of a \$1 million house in the "Griffin" picture, but said, "It was a silly incident and should be treated as such."

Grizzly Bear Count Stays At 200 Mark

YELLOWSTONE PARK, Wyo., Aug. 7 (AP)—Despite the influx of nearly two million visitors a year, the grizzly bear population of Yellowstone national park appears to be settled at a level of about 200.

Dr. Frank Croughan, an authority on bears, said the grizzly will survive as long as there are protected wilderness areas in the western United States and Canada such as Yellowstone.

Croughan and his brother John, who is director of Montana State university, have been studying grizzlies for four years.

Several groups are cooperating with the study, which has a goal of proposing management practices designed to keep the grizzlies from becoming extinct.

The Croughans have trapped, examined and tagged 132 bears. Small transmitter radio transmitters have been inserted around the necks of some grizzly bears to aid in migration studies.

Working with the project are the National Geographic society and the Yellowstone National Park company.

Reds Predicting Dual Launching

BERLIN, Aug. 7 (AP)—The Soviet Union plans to send up two communications satellites in a so-called popaganza program around the world, an East Berlin newspaper says today.

The Berliner Zeitung said the Soviet twin satellites would be put in orbit within a few days if they were still being fitted out.

Executives Can't Avoid Jail Anymore

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 7 (AP)—The federal government clearly is demonstrating determination to penalize antitrust guilt by criminal indictments against corporation executives, Richard A. Whiting, an antitrust defender, said today.

"No longer can the corporation officer count on paying his way out of antitrust liability," Whiting declared in an address prepared for the American Bar association's section on antitrust law.

"Jail sentences have become more common for the punishment of individuals involved in flagrant corporate violations. Increasing use of this sanction seems probable," said Whiting, a Washington, D. C., attorney.

In the first six months of 1962, he said, more corporation executives were indicted for alleged antitrust violations than in any

Writing declared the basic cause which attorneys give their management clients must teach this:

"All arrangements—however arrived at—between competitors affecting prices or allocating production, customers or territories are fraught with antitrust consequences."

Whiting pointed out that violations may bring a personal fine of \$50,000 on each count, a Sherman act indictment.

"Severe fines are no longer an idle threat, as the electrical industry cases, among others, have demonstrated," he said.
