Double-Barrelled Space Shot May Affect Berlin Problems

MOSCOW, Aug. 13 (UPI)—The Soviet union's double-barrelled space spectacular may put new stature and perhaps new steel into Premier Nikita S. Khrushchev's efforts to dislodge the Western allies from Berlin. But even in the Soviet Union, the excitement over the cosmic exploit has not been enough to erase completely the significance of today's first anniversary of the Berlin wall. Western observers here said they believe Khrushchev's personal prestige at home and abroad may be so enhanced by the latest space feat that he could bring a more difficult adversary on the whole question of an eventual Berlin settlement.

Berliners Scream Hatred of Red Wall

BERLIN, Aug. 13 (AP)—Border guards fought a fierce tear gas battle today as massed West Berliners screamed their hatred of the red wall on its first anniversary. The battle erupted in the Wilhelmstrasse, opposite the former Nazi air ministry. It is now the seat of several East German government ministries. East German police shot a stream of water from a water cannon at West Berlin youths carrying a wooden cross on a long pole. The crowd of West Berliners then hurled stones at the water cannon. Eastern guards tossed tear gas grenades into the thickly massed crowd. West police immediately threw about 150 tear gas grenades over the wall. They fell all around the water cannon, which were enveloped in a thick cloud of gas and withdrew about 30 yards. The cheering crowd had to get out for fresh air. Western police were seeking gas, as were the youths carrying the cross.

House Group Points to Bond Value

WASHINGTON, Aug. 13 (UPI)—The House foreign affairs committee told congress today that failure to approve President Kennedy's United Nations bond request would force the withdrawal of U. N. troops from both the Congo and the Gaza strip. The house group, led by Rep. Thomas E. Morgan, D, Pa., said if this should happen, "a deterioration of the situation in both these areas would appear to be inevitable, threatening world peace and the security of the United States." Then, the report declared, the United States might find it has to get involved in these areas itself.

Labor Seeks New Probes Of Railroads

WASHINGTON, Aug. 13 (UPI)—Railway labor unions today requested that the Interstate Commerce Commission investigate what they described as "poverty wages" concerning railroad earnings. G. E. Leighty, chairman of the Railway Labor Executives Association, made the request in a letter sent to every house member and senator. Leighty said the economic figures indicate that the poverty claims are false. Daniel P. Loomis, president of the Association of American Railroads, countered by declaring that the call for a congressional inquiry was a "crude effort" to divert attention away from "monstrous costs of featherbedding for which they are responsible."

5 Convicted After Tiff In Albany

ALBANY, Ga., Aug. 13 (UPI)—Two whites and three Negroes were convicted today of charges arising from a tiff over the location of a motel restaurant and given their choice of a \$300 fine or 30 days in jail. Trial of the five before Judge A. M. Durden came as the Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr., made plans to return to this racially troubled South Georgia city, possibly to lead renewed mass demonstrations in protest against segregation. The integrated group, arrested Saturday, conferred with their lawyers on ways to pay the fines.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 13.—President Kennedy's political family is understandably disturbed by the news of a delay in finding an outstanding figure to run against Gov. Nelson A. Rockefeller in the November election. Privately, they blame the failure on Mayor Robert F. Wagner, who is a target of caution and ambition.

Minorities wield power—Four years ago, Governor Rockefeller held the Democratic margin in New York City to 310,000, largely because of his strength with the minorities and the groups which normally vote Democratic. By contrast, Richard M. Nixon lost the presidency by a squeak because he did not appreciate the fact that Negroes, who are in a future which he admits and regrets.

As in 1960, the outcome of the presidential contest was decided by the vote in these areas. Rockefeller's demonstrated strength in these areas, assuming that he will retain it, which underlies the White House selection of him as the Republican presidential candidate two years hence.

He's a candidate—There is no longer any doubt, if there ever was, that Governor Rockefeller is driving for the job. He has been active in the administration of domestic and foreign policies. He has spoken in at least 10 key states within recent months.

Front-runner—Three possible rivals must undergo political baptism this November as gubernatorial candidates in their respective states—Nixon in California, George Romney in Michigan and Nelson Rockefeller in New York. Senator Goldwater denies White House ambitions, and his denial is generally accepted because of his conservatism would make him a dubious winner.
