

# "Cut-Down" Aid Bill Passes With Windup in Sight

WASHINGTON, Oct. 8 (AP)—The senate completed its vote today on a bill appropriating \$3,500,000 for foreign aid. The total is more than a billion dollars short of what President Kennedy asked. Passage of the bill, a compromise worked out by senators and conferees, was by voice vote. The House passed the measure by a vote of 171 to 108. Sending the bill to the White House would prompt one more step along the way to adjournment, but other hurdles remain to be cleared before the legislators can wind up the longest session since 1951.

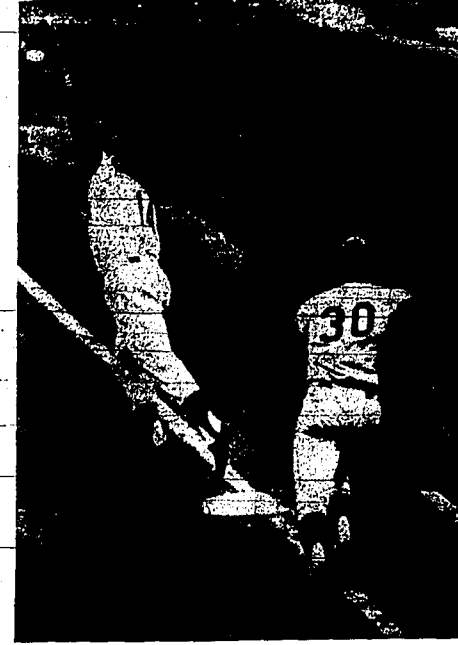
