British Open Conservative Party Meet

LEANDRINO, Wales, Oct. 10.—The Conservatives of Prime Minister Harold Macmillan opened an annual conference today with the aim of presenting a new party image to the voters.

The new party image is the chief objective of the conference. Macmillan highlighted his program as the keynote for the opening session with a speech intended to show that the Macmillan government is the most progressive and full of energy since the war.

Macmillan said he will continue to assure a rising living standard in the years ahead.

He called for a new program to abolish restrictive practices and end job favoritism and monopoly devices.

He also attacked policies which he said were being pursued by several other parties. Among these were John Hunt, a stock-exchange and prospective parliament candidate, who said Macmillan was too timid in taking the lead off the economy.

Macmillan avoided anticipating a major debate Thursday on common markets, but stressed that his chances are coming and Britain should be prepared for them.

Macmillan is urging the 4,500 conference delegates overwhelmingly to approve a resolution supporting the common market, but stressed that the value of the pound, and economic growth and foreign income policy.

Castro Says Soviet Men Are in Cuba

MIAMI, Oct. 10.—Premier Fidel Castro told the Cuban people last night for the first time that Russian instructors "technicians" are stationed in their country.

In a speech broadcast by Radio Havana, Castro reiterated the familiar charge that the United States is preparing to invade Cuba. He said "it is far more dangerous that we see three weapons and three technicians."

He scoffed at reports he is importing Soviet weapons and technicians to defend his revolutionary regime against the Cuban people.

Although Castro said hardly a week ago that his army no longer has anything to fear from the United States, last night he again was warning about U.S. plans for an attack on Cuba.

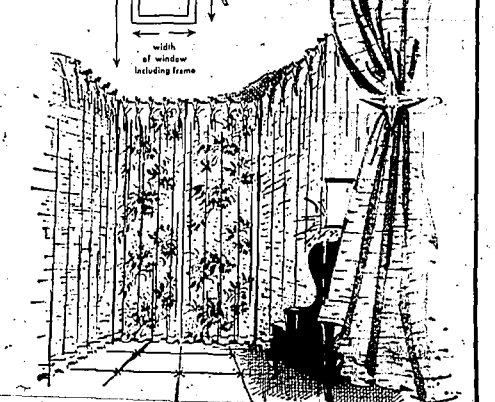
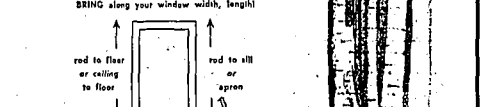

News Around Idaho

BOISE, Oct. 10 (U.P.)—Driver's licenses of 33 Idaho motorists were revoked during the past week on charges of drunken driving, the department has reported. In addition, licenses of 17 motorists were suspended for reckless driving and 27 for failure to meet requirements of the safety driving act. The department reported state police issued 483 traffic tickets during the week, including 83 based on radar evidence.

Agency Says Rain Needed In Mountains

BOISE, Oct. 10 (U.P.)—Above normal precipitation during the remainder of this month is needed if Idaho mountain areas are to be in proper condition for the winter snowfall, the soil conservation service said Tuesday.

Moran W. Nelson, snow survey supervisor, said soil moisture will be below normal except at elevations above 8,500 feet. He said it is important that it is increased prior to Nov. 1 because the latter date generally marks the beginning of the snow storage season.

"The deficiencies of soil moisture occurring as of Nov. 1 will be below normal except at elevations above 8,500 feet. It begins some time during the spring of 1963," Nelson said. "The snow cover will be below normal except at elevations above 8,500 feet for the first of November and does not melt until the following spring."

"The carryover storage in reservoirs, as reported by the U. S. bureau of reclamation, is good and we are hoping for a good season with normal or better reservoir-stored water throughout the winter," he said.

Nelson said the first soil moisture measurements will be made Nov. 1.

He said predictions of water runoff in the streams of the Columbia river basin were amazingly accurate. The actual flows differed from the forecasts by less than 1 per cent for the Columbia river near The Dalles, Ore., and the Snake river at measured near Heise, in eastern Idaho, Nelson said.

"The forecasts were off, however, by 4.7 per cent for the Clearwater river near Spaulding, 11 per cent for the Snake river near Boise and 6.5 per cent for the Weiser river."

Meredith Criticizes Army Acts, NAACP at Ole Miss

OXFORD, Miss., Oct. 10 (U.P.)—Meredith James H. Meredith criticized Thursday the way the army and, indirectly, the NAACP have handled certain aspects of his historic desegregation of the University of Mississippi.

He said the instance he cited "has made my struggle most difficult." In a formal statement made available to newsmen, Meredith, 31, again denied a report, attributed earlier to a leader of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, that he had been picked for the desegregation move, rather than acting on his own initiative.

2. Complained that the army had segregated the troops brought in here after the riot that erupted when he appeared on the campus nine days ago.

Meredith named no NAACP officials in his complaint. But John A. Morsell, Assistant to Executive Secretary Roy Wilkins of the NAACP said in New York that Meredith, in effect, was "self-selected" and added, "It does not matter... whether he is self-selected or hand-picked." As for the army, it flatly denied that segregation was in the order of the day at present but did say some patrols had been kept on an all-white basis at the height of the tension several days ago.

In an interview that Meredith himself sought, he released a handwritten statement labeling as untrue a claim that he had been "picked, selected or chosen" to integrate Ole Miss. The claim may have added to staff student opposition to him, he said.

"If it (the statement) were true," Meredith said, "I must admit I would prefer their (the students) opposition would be in some way justified."

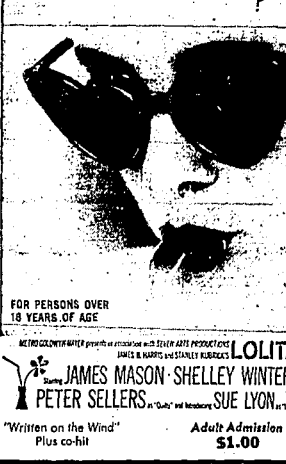

Federal Suit Filed Against 3 Oil Firms

LOS ANGELES, Oct. 10 (U.P.)—A civil antitrust suit was filed by the Justice department Tuesday against Cities Service, Sinclair, and Richfield, three of the nation's largest oil companies.

The department said the suit accuses Cities Service and Sinclair of agreeing not to compete with Richfield or each other in six western states—California, Oregon, Washington, Idaho, Nevada and Arizona.

Richfield agreed in return, it was alleged, not to compete with the other two companies in the rest of the country.

A department spokesman said the action in U. S. district court was the first of its kind in the oil companies to stop allocating markets.

It asks further that Cities Service and Sinclair be directed to sell their Richfield stock holdings, the spokesman said, and that Cities Service and Sinclair directors be required to resign from Richfield's board of directors.

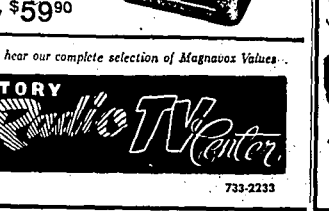
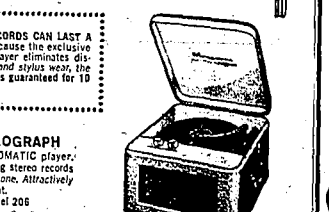

Brussels sprouts are surprisingly good in this farmhouse pie.

Brussels Sprouts Farmhouse Pie (Makes 6 servings)

To make filling: 2 packages (10-ounces each) frozen Brussels sprouts 1 cup butter or margarine 1 cup all-purpose flour 2 cups beef stock or bouillon 1 teaspoon salt 1 teaspoon pepper 1 teaspoon celery seed 1 teaspoon dry mustard 1 can (15-ounce) whole onions, drained

Cook Brussels sprouts according to package directions; drain. If necessary, melt butter or margarine in a large saucepan; blend in flour. Gradually add stock and onions; cook over low heat, stirring constantly, until thickened. Mix in seasonings.

Brussels sprouts are surprisingly good in this farmhouse pie.

To make pastry: 2 1/2 cups sifted all-purpose flour 1/4 cup (1/2 stick) butter, softened 1/4 cup milk 1 tablespoon salt 1/2 cup plus 1 tablespoon salad oil

Blend together flour and salt. Combine milk and salad oil and blend thoroughly into flour mixture. Shape pastry into 2 balls; roll out between waxed paper into two 10 1/2-inch circles. Line 9-inch pie plate with one pastry circle. Add Brussels sprout filling; top with remaining pastry circle. Pinch together top and bottom edges of pastry and flute; cut five 1 1/2-inch slits in top pastry. Bake in very hot oven (450 degrees F.) 30 minutes, or until pastry is golden brown. Serve hot.

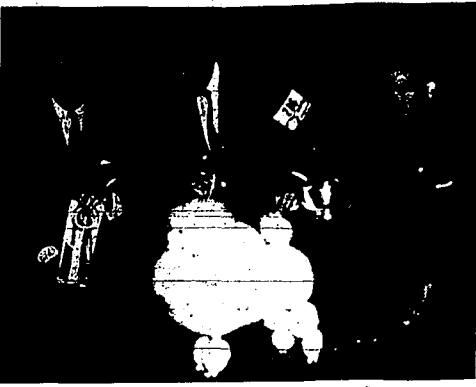
