BALDWIN, N. S., Oct. 22 (AP)—Hurricane Ella, still a threatening 400 miles from its eye as it churned away from the U. S. coast, today posed a threat to Nova Scotia. The Halifax weather office said Ella, an erratic storm, could strike the U. S. east coast, and pass 150 miles south of Newfoundland. Sable Island off the coast is a likely target, the weather forecasters here said. It could even aim directly at the Atlantic coast of Nova Scotia.

Hansen Is Endorsed by Action Group

BOISE, Oct. 22 (UP)—There are many people in this country who see history as an apple cart, with fruit for all, if they just don't upset it. Adm. Arthur Hansen, retired chief of naval operations, is James H. Hoffa's choice for president Sunday night. In a public address here, sponsored by the Methodist Men's Club, Hansen said the thing these people fail to realize is that there are "other people" who are the targets of the Red attack. "It's us they're shooting at," he said.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 22—Orval Hansen, Idaho's congressional delegate, was endorsed today by a committee for Constitutional Action (ACA), the national non-partisan organization dedicated to the support and preservation of constitutional government.

HOUSTON, Oct. 21 (AP)—Dock workers from the Great Lakes to Texas will boycott 430 foreign world ships which have trade with Cuba this year, a Houston union official said yesterday.

Dromax, executive secretary-treasurer of the West Gulf Ports council, AFL-CIO, said the boycott includes the names of vessels from 22 nations.

Dromax's union has been boycotting two foreign freighters, one for landing goods in Cuba another for trading with Ned Chin.

The next vessel on the protest schedule will be the Yugoslav freighter Kupera, Dromax said. The Kupers was due at Mobile.

NFU Outlines Dairy Plans For Income

WASHINGTON, Oct. 22 (AP)—The National Farmers union has proposed a dairy program which it said would increase producer income by one billion dollars a year and provide low prices to consumers.

The program calls for direct payments to producers somewhat similar to those now in effect for the 1963 wheat and feed grain programs. The proposed payments would cover the gap between actual market prices for milk and 100 per cent of the parity price of milk.

James G. Patton, NFU president, said yesterday his organization would press for enactment of the program in congress next year. Patton called on other farm groups to support the plan.

The proposal would provide 100 per cent of parity (44.16 per 100 pounds) for producers who sell no more than they did in the 1961-62 marketing year. Producers who decide to market more would receive only the market price which the government would set at 90 per cent to below \$4.49 per 100 pounds.

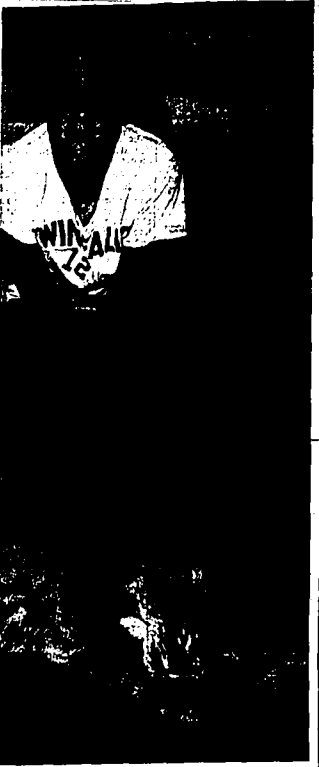

NEW YORK, Oct. 22 (AP)—The federal reserve board judging a sluggish economy or just minding the store's Main Street incline to the latter view of the board's cautious move to expand credit.

The other method of supplying banks with lendable funds—lowering the discount rate—also could have much the same undesired result—more short-term interest rates would turn down if the discount rate did.

The money managers have been pushing a policy of keeping short-term interest rates high enough to discourage the flight of the dollar to other lands. At the same time they have tried to keep the supply of credit easy enough to encourage the economy to grow. It has been a delicate balancing job—but made easier in recent months because borrowing demands have been modest.

Making more funds available to the banks now is aimed at caring for the usual season trade demands without affecting interest rates much.

But as to being a spur to the economy—that's another matter. Bankers will appreciate the extra money in their reserves, and how the demand for sound and profitable loans will come along.

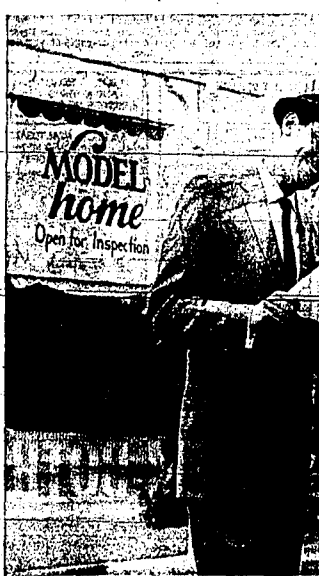
