

# Blockade Once More Near Cuba

WASHINGTON, Nov. 1 (AP)—U.S. navy ships blocked off Cuba in the Caribbean and air surveillance continued after Fidel Castro evidently refused to agree to U.N. inspection of Soviet missile withdrawal.

Washington officials probably will want to verify with aerial reconnaissance that the secretary general that all Soviet missiles would be taken out of Cuba soon after that.

The blockade, suspended during two days of evidently fruitless negotiations between Thant and Castro, was due to back-up force at dawn. U.S. personnel, as before, is to keep a ready offensive weapon on Cuba.

While House announced that the blockade was in effect, Kennedy had reviewed the situation with his top level national security council members.

Pierre Salinger, presidential press secretary, said U.S. photo reconnaissance satellites would be taken into action in the absence of effective U.N. arrangements.

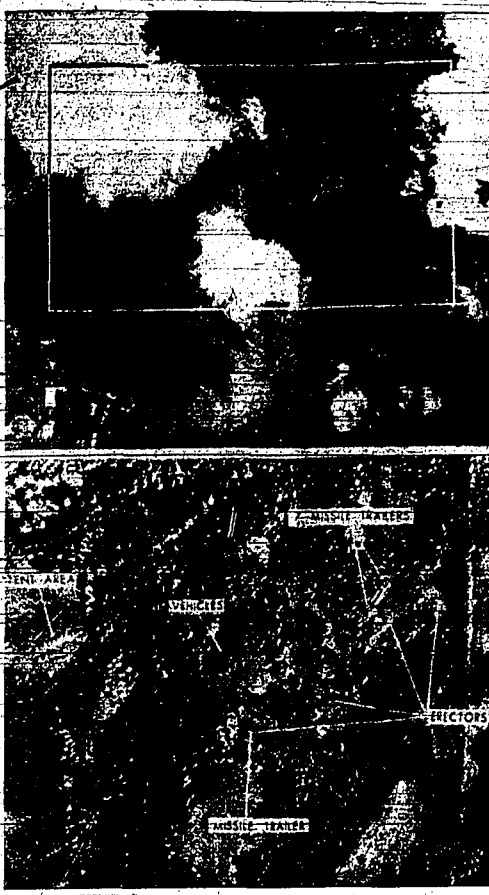

### Questions on Agreement in Cuba Asked

WASHINGTON, Nov. 1 (AP)—Two Republican leaders asked President Kennedy today to explain whether the proposed Cuban agreement means Soviet jet bombers and military men will remain in Cuba.

Sen. Barry Goldwater of Arizona, and Sen. Bob Wilson of California, the President also should clarify for the American people whether his agreement with Soviet Premier Khrushchev means "an invasion which already has been planned" to occur in some newspapers, and which could have eliminated communists completely from Cuba.

"Since Mr. Kennedy canceled his Thursday news conference admitting the possibility of the present agreement, some of these troublesome questions were asked and answered at once," Goldwater said. Wilson said in a joint statement.

### U.S., Japan To Discuss Island Aid

WASHINGTON, Nov. 1 (AP)—Secretary of State Dean Rusk announced today that the United States and Japan would resume talks Nov. 7 on joint efforts to give Okinawa more economic assistance.

Rusk said the meeting would be held in Tokyo. U.S. Ambassador Edwin P. Healy and Japanese Foreign Minister Masayoshi Ohira will be the main participants in the talks.

The United States expects Japan will provide more economic assistance to Okinawa than it has in the past and not depend on U.S. aid.

"We live," said Rusk, "in a period when the essential security interests of the United States and Japan are being met by the continued U.S. administration of the Ryukyus; the policies continued by President Kennedy to be taken during this period of transition will minimize the chances that will accompany the anticipated, eventual restoration of these islands to Japanese administration."

### Beacons on Firefly Will Be Triggered

CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla., Nov. 1 (AP)—The first firefly beacons on the United States' new "Pangloss" satellite will be triggered for official reports.

The flashes of the four high-intensity sodium gas lights will signal the beginning of a program which officials hope will lead to more accurate determination of the size and shape of the earth, location of its center of gravity and distances between far apart places.

The satellite, named Anna, was rocketed into orbit Wednesday from Cape Canaveral. Project spokesmen reported all systems were functioning well and that precise determination of the vehicle's path was being made before the lights are winked for the first time.

Exact time and place for today's initial flashes will be determined by the applied physics laboratory at Johns Hopkins University, where the satellite was developed. Laboratory scientists will send a radio signal to activate the lights.

The beacons will be activated at night when the sky is clear so that telescopic cameras will be able to photograph them against a background of known stars. The flashes should be visible to anyone through binoculars and the Defense Department said it hoped to release the flash times in advance.

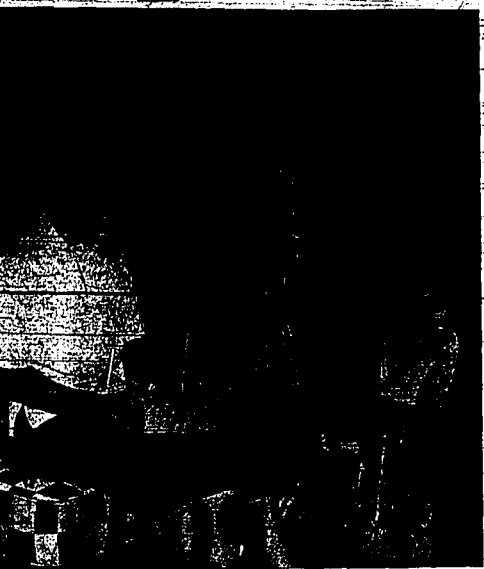

MIAMI, Nov. 1—Customs agents seized 16 Cuban exiles armed with carbines and pistols aboard a 32-foot cabin cruiser by Miami Tuesday, they said and they would be charged with exporting arms without a license.

"They were apparently ready to go to Cuba," said supervising agent Joseph A. Forster. But he said the men had made no statement about where they were headed.

The agents found seven carbines, two pistols and 2,000 rounds of ammunition aboard the boat. The men also carried worn clothes with them.

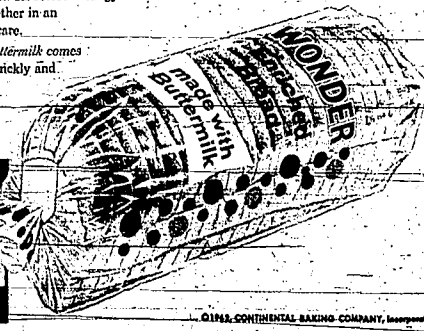

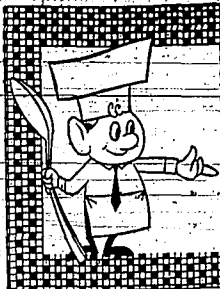

**Mrs. Pfoff's Record Hit By GOP Man**

JEROME, Nov. 1.—Mrs. Gracie Pfoff's record of accomplishment during her 10-year tenure as congresswoman now serving the United States, from Mahan, of the Jerome county Jordan for senator committee, said today.

According to the legislative reference service of the Library of Congress, which figures the performance of a congressman, Mrs. Pfoff has introduced 132 bills during her 10-year tenure and only 10 have become law.

This is an average of one per year, Mahan points out. A factor which has contributed heavily to this record is her extraordinary use of "straw bills."

A "straw bill" is one introduced for "back-home" compensation; a sham to make constituents think their congressman is really doing something for them, Mahan noted, when in reality the legislator knows as the bill is introduced, "it will never pass."

Of the 132 bills Mrs. Pfoff introduced in the immediate past five congresses, 30 of them, as approximately one out of four, have been classified as "straw bills."

Mahan stated, "The people of Idaho are entitled to better representation than that indicated by Mrs. Pfoff's record. Senator Jordan is the man to do this."

**GOP Presidential Hopes Put Chips on Line Tuesday**

WASHINGTON, Nov. 1.—At least four potential candidates for the 1964 Republican Presidential nomination will be undergoing crucial trial runs in Tuesday's gubernatorial election contests.

These include Rockefeller of New York, Richard M. Nixon of California, George Romney of Michigan and William W. Scrantom of Pennsylvania.

Rockefeller is the only one of the four who is an incumbent governor bidding for re-election. If he wins big over his Democratic opponent, Robert M. Beggan, he'll be the man to beat for the 1964 prize.

Nixon, the former vice president who carried the GOP presidential standard in 1960, is locked in a close battle with Democratic Gov. Edmund G. Brown in an unpredictable election.

Although Nixon has said he will not be a candidate for the presidential nomination in 1964, it is widely believed he will become a "draft" prospect if he wins a new political post as governor of the second largest state.

Auto-maker Romney will acquire powerful political glimmer if he manages to unseat Michigan's Democratic Gov. John B. Vanoy over the vehement opposition of organized labor.

Scrantom, a Republican congressman with a wide following in his own state, will also emerge as a major Democratic contender for the GOP if he wins his close race against Richard Dilworth, former Democratic mayor of Philadelphia, for the governorship of Pennsylvania.

Thirty-five states will elect governors on Nov. 8.

In addition to the four large and populous states in which they have potential ticket-leaders running, Republicans are making strong bids for governorships now held by Democrats in Ohio, Texas, Colorado, Wyoming, Wisconsin and Nevada.

In Ohio, Democratic Gov. Michael V. DiSalle is involved in a tough re-election battle against Republican state auditor James A. Rhodes.

**Swiftiness of Buildup May Change Mode of Arms Talks**

WASHINGTON, Nov. 1.—The suddenness of the Soviet missile buildup in Cuba has sharply raised a major problem for future U. S. disarmament talks.

The problem: How, in an age of high-mobility weapons, is it possible to derive safeguards against rapid and secret movement of missiles into new areas as happened in Cuba.

Officials said that, though they had long been aware of the mobility of ballistic missiles up to 1,200-mile range, there was little in U. S. disarmament planning to deal with a situation like Cuba.

The first photographic evidence of Soviet offensive missiles in Cuba was obtained Sunday, Oct. 14, when a lone U. S. reconnaissance plane flew over the island.

Processing of the film took until noon Monday, Oct. 15. Then photo interpreters went to work on the film.

"It was late Monday night when an analyst working over the masses of film with magnifying equipment first spotted what appeared to be a medium-range missile base."

The White House and Pentagon were immediately notified, about 10 p. m. Monday, and analysis of the film continued into the night. It was Tuesday morning before the evaluation report could be laid before President Kennedy.

Though actual construction was still in an early stage, it is now apparent that by that time the logistics of the offensive missile buildup had been proceeding for some weeks and gathered great momentum.

As far back as late September, U. S. officials had been puzzled by the fact that Soviet ship movements to Cuba were not tapering off as they should have been. The buildup was only for coastal air defense.

There were also, during that period, intelligence reports on types of cargo ships and shipments of electronic equipment

The final question asked: "Was President Kennedy trying to bring on World War III?" The answer in part, said McNamara, "is in the affirmative. On the contrary, the President was trying to avoid war."
