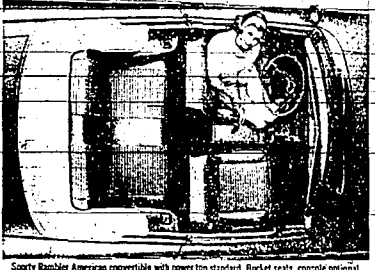

## World Edges Back From Brink; Russ Still Won't Admit 'Mistakes' in Cuba

WASHINGTON, Nov. 6 (AP)—During his conference in Vienna last week, an odd but serious exchange took place over the "Kitchen Table" between President Kennedy and Soviet Premier Khrushchev.

It concerned the Bay of Pigs, one of the ill-fated Cuban invasions, April 17, 1961.

"The Bay of Pigs was a mistake," Kennedy said, "carefully. But in the American opinion, we can publicly admit our mistake."

"Can we," Khrushchev retorted, "we have publicly admitted Stalin's mistakes."

"Yes," said the President, gesturing with his hand. "We can't do that."

The question of Cuba was the subject of the conference. Kennedy announced Sunday, Oct. 28, that he was withdrawing the Russian missiles from Cuba, but not admitting a mistake. He said the action was taken "in the interests of peace."

But the original Soviet reaction to Kennedy's proclamation of the quarantine of shipments of offensive weapons to Cuba was a "rejection and warning."

Major radio broadcast a note which said: "The Soviet government resolutely rejects such a unilateral withdrawal of arms from Cuba. The arrogant actions of American imperialism could lead to disastrous consequences."

There, little by little, the Soviet appeared to be changing its mind.

Khrushchev replied to a message from the British Prime Minister Harold Russell, saying he would take no "rash action." On Wednesday, Oct. 24, it was reported that some Soviet-bloc troops had been ordered to avoid the blockade zone. On Friday, Khrushchev said he would accept any more steps into the blockade area for the time being.

A still unpublished message from Khrushchev on Friday was "as an administration official," it that he might agree to remove the missiles from Cuba. In another note however...

change the balance of nuclear striking power between the United States and the Soviet Union. But, as a top official put it, they were setting up eight or 10 sites for 20 or 40 missiles. If they were allowed to proceed, why not 10 more sites? That could very well have made a difference.

2. The consequence, in official thinking, would have been to encourage the Soviet Union to take a stronger line on Berlin and in all Latin America.

3. For over a year, in spite of the Vienna conferences between Kennedy and Khrushchev, qualified observers have said they do not believe the Russians were contented the United States would fight, if necessary, over these super-important areas in the world.

4. In his reply to Khrushchev's message about removing the missiles from Cuba and dismantling the sites, Kennedy said: "I agree with you that we must devote urgent attention to the problem of disarmament as it relates to the whole world and also to critical areas. Perhaps now, as we step back from danger, we can together, make real progress in this vital field."

It is possible that the Cuban episode might lead to a gradual turn-around in the whole pattern of the United States' relations with the Soviet Union.

British Prime Minister Harold Macmillan touched on this point in a statement in the House of Commons, Oct. 20. He pointed out that Khrushchev agreed to international verification to determine that the Soviet missile bases were dismantled.

Having accepted the principle there, he said, the Russians may be "able to accept" in other areas, such as disarmament.

"The world has had a shock," Macmillan said. "We have been very near the edge."

BY LARRY HOVEY A return to prestige amateur sports is being made the fervent hope of a growing number of people associated with the game of golf.

Over the past 10 years the game, growing more popular and attracting new fans each week, has become an unwelcome and unprofitable business because of a growing number of tournaments.

And this makes a haven for "gold bugs" and the more desperate "sandbaggers" who play on a deliberately high handicap, then use the extra strokes to get in a lower flight.

On the other extreme is the golfer who is an excellent golfer doing it. A few dollars in prize money and a \$100 set of irons, plus a reward to this type—no amateurism at all.

There is a growing feeling among the USA and USAA that there must be a return to prestige to combat the cheating and the "gold bugs" who have had several hundred amateurs—the Idaho chapter of the Professional Golfers' Association has returned to pure competition.

The USA and the Idaho chapter, PGA, plus some of the thinking amateurs had their way, all tournaments would immediately become trophy tournaments only.

The benefits are immediately apparent. Winning would mean prize money, not a \$100 set of irons, plus a reward to this type—no amateurism at all.

Currently, a golfer can compete in a 36-hole, week-end, tournament and win a new set of irons. If he wins, there have been championships he would probably receive less.

The highest honors available in this state should be the state amateur, state women's amateur and low amateur in the Idaho state open.
