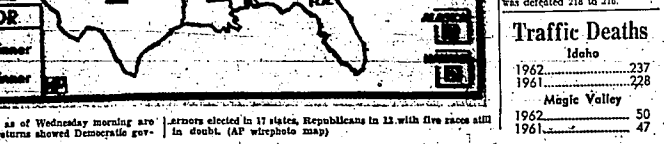

**Bullfighting Still Large**  
**Spanish Tourist Attraction**  
MADRID, Nov. 7 (AP)—Nearly 10 million foreign visitors came to Spain this year, and they were a big part of the bullfighting attraction. The years of bullfighting have been a success for Spain, which has become the world's favorite spot. Though there is a threat to the bullfighting industry, it remains a popular sight in Spain for more than 300 years. Nearly half the foreign tourists saw the bulls this season. They saw an estimated 400 million people, or more than 65 million dollars, into the country. Bullfighting performers and impresarios admit that without the tourist patronage bullfighting would be far from profitable. Bullfighting is as popular a drawing card as any sport. The big reason is that bullfighting in Spain are expensive. A Spanish may pay 30 pesetas (40 cents) for a good ticket. For a similar seat at the bullfight he must produce 90-75 pesetas. That is the better part of a day's pay for many Spanish workers. The season just closed was one of the best from a standpoint of the number of programs and spectators. The history of the bullfighting has ended up in hospitals. Bullfighting has attracted such tourist support in Spain that it is now profitable. Especially those of Mallorca and San Feliz de Guixols in Catalonia. The entire area now is reserved for tourists. In recent years, however, outfitting bullfighting by a wide margin as a national sports attraction. Sports experts estimate the total attendance at Spanish bullfight matches over reached the figure of 12 million per season. They figure that in the last three months the national drop was to around 9 million admissions. The draw of bullfighting, estimated at 4 million per year, has gone to around 6.2 million this year.

### Republicanism's 'Big Three' Loom as President Hopefuls

WASHINGTON, Nov. 7 (AP)—The Republican Gov. Nelson A. Rockefeller's inability to win as big as his supporters had hoped over less opposition damaged but did not destroy his chance to be his party's 1964 presidential nominee. After all, he was reelected. Rocky still has a 1964 chance only because any Governor of New York state is a presidential possibility unless he has two heads.

Republican George Romney, who said he would not be a candidate, was projected into the presidential picture by being elected governor of Michigan. Republican William W. Scranton was elected governor of Pennsylvania. He's another 1964 possibility. The two big states long had strayed from their Republican moorings—and now may be coming back. That appears to be the best Republican election news.

Richard M. Nixon took himself out of the 1964 nomination. Romney also said he would not be available but not so loudly. Scranton has good reason to hope. Rockefeller is a conservative. He argued that JFK can be licked in 1964. And Rocky is willing to try. William W. Scranton is a moderate.

George Romney, the first Republican to be elected governor of Michigan since 1948, could count himself in on the 1964 GOP future of the Republican party.

For Romney, his victory over Gov. John B. Swainson, was another in a long series of strides he has made since his birth to a Mormon missionary family in Mexico 35 years ago.

Romney, despite his national reputation as a relative newcomer in politics, he began his political work in the spring of 1959 when he was instrumental in organizing a "Citizens for Michigan" group.

After the organization was successful in calling a constitutional convention, Romney left his bank and became a Republican delegate to, and vice president of, the convention. Before the sessions were over Romney had also become the only Republican candidate for governor.

William W. Scranton of Pennsylvania. The election of William W. Scranton as governor of Pennsylvania puts him squarely in the front ranks of potential Republican presidential possibilities for 1964.

**TOKYO, Nov. 7 (AP)—**One of the most serious "Hate America" campaigns today in Communist China, with propaganda attacks on the United States and spreading of "Hate America" leaflets.

Each Chinese, including 13 million people in Peking, is urged to "Hate America" in the newspapers, radio and in the streets. Mass demonstrations supporting Cuban Premier Fidel Castro and the Americans shouting "Go go, Guantánamo!"

The radio also made what appeared to be a challenge to Russia to prove its leadership of the communist camp by defending China.

The serious war provocations in the Korean peninsula are not least of U.S. imperialism and intimidation is alleged to succeed, U.S. imperialism will be the biggest ever—unprecedented in doing what it pleases," it said.

**Forest Fires**  
**In Sawtooths**  
**Few in 1962**

Forest fires this summer were below average of the past five years in the Sawtooth National Forest, J. L. Seay, Twin Falls, supervisor, announced Tuesday.

There were 28 fires this season, compared with the average of 43 fires during the 1957-61 period.

Lightning fires this year were above the five-year average. The five-year average of lightning fires is 20. This year there were 29. Last year the total was 41. There were 10 lightning storms on 25 of the 62 days in July and August. The last lightning storm this year in the Sawtooth National Forest occurred Oct. 3.

The general trend of man-made fires is on the downward path, Seay said. He said the trend was downward during the 1945-51 period, but started on the upward path during 1952-61.

The five-year average was 15.8; this year there were nine man-made fires. Of the nine, four were caused by smokers and the other five by campfires in isolated, undeveloped areas.

Seay said the burned acreage this year was greatly reduced. 113 acres burned, compared to the five-year average of 3,029 acres. The decrease this year is partly due to lighter fire season last year by better detection as well as an installation of Mount Vernon lock-out station—and extra spot use of fire retardant.

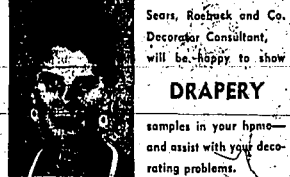

**Vermont**—Phillip H. Hoff became Vermont's first Democrat since 1854. Rep. George A. Ayres, R., was re-elected over Democrat Robert T. Stafford.

**Massachusetts**—Edward M. Brooke, R., defeated John F. Kennedy, elected to senate by 2 to 1 margin. Rep. Edward Brooke, R., defeated Rep. John A. Volpe, R. In congressional races, Democrats won three and were leading for 3 more.

**Rhode Island**—Gov. John H. Chafee, R., in a tight race decided race which may hinge on later tally of absentee ballots. Two Democratic congressmen—John E. Poony and Patrick G. Cornean—won re-election handily.

**Connecticut**—Former cabinet officer Abraham Ribicoff defeated Rep. Horace B. Bush, R., for senate seat vacated by retiring John C. Stennis, R. Ribicoff won by about 20,000 votes. Gov. John Dempsey, D., defeated incumbent Rep. Joseph P. Mohr, D., by 10,000 votes of six house seats, a gain of one.

**NEW YORK**—Gov. Nelson Rockefeller, a leading GOP presidential contender, was elected by more than 800,000 votes. Sen. Jacob K. Javits, D., piled up biggest majority (600,000 votes) in winning election as James B. Donovan, D., Republican, won 21 house seats. Democrats gained 14 in 22 Democratic, 21 Republican.

**Pennsylvania**—Republican William W. Scranton qualified for GOP presidential support by winning election as governor with 450,000-vote margin over former Philadelphia Mayor Richardson Dilworth, D. In split-ticket voting, Sen. Joseph B. Clark, D., re-elected by slim margin over Rep. James E. Van Zandt, R. Republican incumbent Gov. D. B. Keightley, D., and GOP candidate leading in one undecided race. Former House was 18 Republicans, 11 Democrats.

**New Jersey**—Republicans won 8 house seats, Democrats gained 11 for GOP. Democratic gain of 7 Democratic seats.

**Kentucky**—Sen. Thurston B. Morrison, D., re-elected by 20,000 votes over Wilson W. Taylor, R. In house races, Democrats won 13 seats, Republicans 2 compared to 11 net gain of 7 Democratic seats.

**Maryland**—"Kennedy Democrat" Daniel Brewster handily defeated conservative Republican Gov. James H. Holloman, R., in 5th senate seat held by retiring GOP Sen. John Marshall Butler, Gov. J. Millard Tawes, D., re-elected. Democrats won 6 house seats, Republicans 2 gain of one for GOP.

# Forest Funds Turned Over To Idaho

Checks totaling \$28,465.73 have been sent to the state of Idaho for use by counties in which the Sawtooth national forest is located, announced E. M. Pickett, Twin Falls timber staff officer.

These funds represent the county's share of multiple-use benefits from the national forest for the past fiscal year. The money is scheduled for school and road purposes.

Timber sales in the south fork of the Boise river area above Paulsherville—in the Wood-river Sawtooth Valley and Bulbitt division, east of Burley, and grants and receipts furnished the greatest revenue.

Substantial revenues were received from public use of land, power, minerals and recreation. Large values accrued to local towns and communities from direct expenditures made by the public in camping, hunting and fishing in favorite spots on the Sawtooth national forest.

Personnel of the Sawtooth national forest are increasing fire protection to reduce annual losses in timber stands from these fires so that a greater volume of sawlogs is available for the sawmills. Following logging operations, the forest service is planting trees in clear-cut areas to assure establishment of the most valuable species and full stocking of future sawlog timber so maximum yields per acre of the best quality timber will result.

Worthless cull trees are removed to make growing space for better trees. At the same time, logging roads and skidding trails are treated to protect waterbared valleys and provide a continued supply of clear, good quality water for the mountain-stream-and-for-irrigation and domestic use in Magic Valley.

Range improvements, such as fences, water developments and watering ponds are constructed. These measures and practices are aimed at maintaining a high level of production of all resources on a sustained basis. Such work is done to assure continued sustained incomes to local counties.
