## Nixon Political Obituary on Stirs up Furor

NEW YORK, Nov. 12 (AP) — A televised appearance of Alger Hiss on an program entitled "The Political Obituary of Richard M. Nixon" was met Sunday night with a flood of phone and telegraphed protests, cancellation of the program by several stations, and picketing of network stations. One Midwestern station carrying the program received a bomb threat but it proved to be a fake. Protesters appeared outside studios of the American Broadcasting company in New York and Los Angeles.

ABC's 11:30 a. m. taped program gave an honest summary of Nixon's career, including comments from persons applauding him.

Nixon could not be reached for comment. The 10 men and women picketing outside ABC's main studio here, some of whom were wearing Nixon-style suits, said such as "Why a nationwide forum for a convicted perjurer, Alger Hiss?"

Several ABC-affiliated parties canceled the broadcast. The Tat Broadcasting company said it ordered a show off its two stations where it had been scheduled, in Cincinnati and Columbus, 2.

## Typhoon Karen Plunges Fangs Into Guam; Island Damage High

HONOLULU, Nov. 12 (AP) — Typhoon Karen—described as the worst tropical storm in Guam's history—has rendered the island nearly helpless, leaving hundreds injured, at least one dead and an estimated 100 million dollars in damage. Karen ripped the tiny island—hub of the United States Pacific defense ring—late Sunday night and early Monday, Guam time, with winds estimated at 160 knots. The Navy's Pacific Fleet headquarters at Pearl Harbor said a three-day warning of the big blow "saved countless lives."

Guamanians and U.S. military personnel and their dependents began digging out of the battered island. Guam's national police chief, Manuel Guerrero, issued an urgent appeal to Washington to rush aid. He said, "Guerrero stated by typhoon Karen."

Pacific fleet headquarters said four of every five civilian homes had their roofs blown off. The acting governor's message said George Washington high and Tuman Junior high schools were destroyed. # Broker Held Over 'Prank' Stock Theft

NEW YORK, Nov. 12 (AP) — A 40-year-old former Wall Street broker charged with the theft of more than one million dollars worth of stock which he conspired with a partner to steal from a public company, was questioned today by federal agents in connection with the disappearance of \$1 million of the company's stock from the walls of the Fifth Avenue apartment of the broker's partner, Robert A. Granger, who is charged with the theft of the stock. Police traced Granger to the apartment residence of a woman where they said he was found in possession of the certificate for shares of American Express corporation stock valued at \$1,075,000.

Granger's attorney, Eugene J. Jones, said that his client had been in the apartment in New York until a few weeks ago. "This was only a prank," Jones said. "Granger is not to be held in prison and friends."

Jones denied that \$1,000,000 had been taken from the apartment for a bearing on the grand jury charges in connection with the stock theft. Granger was held in custody at the Federal House of Correction in New York City until he was released on \$100,000 bail by the grand jury.

# Jury Finds Cigarettes Cause Cancer

PITTSBURGH, Pa., Nov. 12 (AP) — A jury has ruled that cigarette smoking can give you lung cancer and you can't legally blame a cigarette manufacturer.

A U. S. district court jury came to this conclusion here following a trial in which a cigarette manufacturer was accused of causing damage from Liggett and Myers Tobacco Company.

Geo. Pritchard, 64, Pittsburgh, said he smoked the company's Chesterfield cigarettes from the 1920s until 1953, got lung cancer and had his right lung removed.

The jury of eight women and four men ruled that cigarette smoking was "the cause or one of the causes" of Pritchard's lung cancer, but said Pritchard assumed the risk of injury when he started smoking.

The panel, said Liggett, and others did not make any express warranty upon which the plaintiff relied and by which he was induced to purchase the cigarettes.

Attorneys for both sides indicated they were at least partly satisfied with the verdict.

Pritchard had tried to collect \$275,000 in damages.

# Failure to Get Efficient Use Of Workers Hit

WASHINGTON, Nov. 12 (AP) — A house civil service subcommittee chairman said today federal officials have failed to emphasize efficient use of government manpower for many years.

Rep. J. P. Davis, D., Ga., chairman of the subcommittee, said employment in the private branch of the federal government rose by 128,000 persons between Aug. 31, 1959, and the same date in 1962 to total more than 4.5 million.

"Undoubtedly for many years too little emphasis has been placed by top management in the government on the key management or management items, such as elimination of nonessential or duplicative work, the removal of unnecessary work, the improvement of work load planning and development of more specific and meaningful criteria for determining personnel requirements," Davis said in a statement.

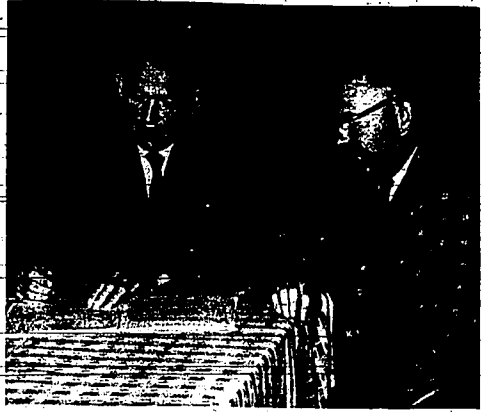

# Labor Agreement Summary Given

WASHINGTON, Nov. 12 (AP) — Major collective bargaining agreements covering about 3.1 million employees were negotiated during the first nine months of 1962, the labor department bureau of labor statistics reported today.

In the agreements, each affecting at least 1,000 employees, 2,468,000 workers received wage increases averaging 3.4 per cent. About 600,000 of them were non-operating railway employees who received average increases of about 4.1 per cent.

Contracts covering 656,000 employees provided for no wage increases. This group included workers in the steel and aluminum industries who received no raises during the first nine months but did get improved fringe benefits.

# Grange Master Urges Drive For International Trade

PORT WAYNE, Ind., Nov. 12 (AP) — Herschel O. Newsum, master of the National Grange, urged the opening session of the farm groups' 38th annual meeting in Port Wayne today that it must redouble its drive to promote freer international trade.

At the same time, Newsum said, the Grange must continue its campaign to promote the "domestic parity" theory for federal farm programs and public distribution of U. S. farm exports to the European Common Market.

For commodities which go to both domestic and foreign markets, the "domestic parity" idea means a relatively high price for domestic sales and lower world-market levels on export sales.

Newsum maintains that relatively high domestic prices are necessary to keep the farm economy in step with American wage levels.

"To assume that prices will come to America must be brought down either in agriculture or out of agriculture, toward levels that world commerce would determine would be rank error," he said in his prepared address.

Grange policy, he said, is aimed at matching the economic devices which keep U. S. industrial prices above world levels.

Newsum added, however, that it would be "rank isolationism" to maintain a one-price structure for farm commodities because of the food needs of the people of underdeveloped nations.

Turning to international trade problems, Newsum told the Grange meeting that "our collective well-being requires a freer trade movement among the free nations of the world."

Foreign markets for American goods are being lost to other nations, he said.

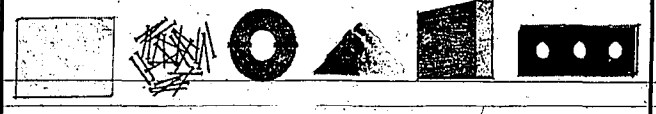

### Election May Have Helped Rule Change

WASHINGTON, Nov. 12 (AP)—A long-winded, bipartisan drive for a change in Senate rules to make it easier to pass legislation is expected to have been given a big boost by the results of last Tuesday's election.

A move to repeal Senate rules 22, requiring a two-thirds majority of senators present, is expected to start up a bitter battle right at the outset of the new 86th congress when it meets Jan. 3.

A fight over the issue marked the start of each congress in recent years. Southern senators who favor the rule changes have led the opposition and conservative Republicans have led the forwarding charge.

### Intricate Scheme Stymied to Pass Million Dollars of Worthless Checks

LOS ANGELES, Nov. 12 (AP)—An intricate scheme to have innocent buyers of consumer goods pay one million dollars in bad checks for \$20 "prizes" was reported Tuesday by the attorney general's office. The scheme could collect any amount of money, police said.

Instead of one million dollars to cover checks, a sponsor's account had \$14,000. When several thousand 100-dollar checks were drawn on the account, the sponsor's account had \$14,000 when bank records were checked, said Bureau.

Bureau said a similar scheme was attempted in the Oakland area about a year ago according to information from the area police.

"It appears we may be conservative in estimating 10,000 checks or one million dollars as the figure for the scheme," said Ron Katz, president of Telecredit, who said his firm had 300 calls and had enabled stores to intercept some \$5,500 in worthless checks.

But quick action by Telecredit's firm using a computer system to investigate the validity of checks-for-prizes-in-the-area was being met with deceiving the store-trader.

"It definitely appears to be a check-for-prizes-in-the-area," said Telecredit's Director M. F. Bussemaker, "and we will turn the case over to the postal authorities." No arrests were made immediately.

Police investigated the scheme as to the apparent scheme since M. was based on the estimated \$20 after making the check. But stores as well as Telecredit confirmed a number of persons who try to cash the checks. There also was money transferred to the collection points—but some reached the hands of the initiator of the plan, according to police.

One phase of the operation involved hiring a girl through an employment agency to walk at various clubs in El Monte, Burbank and Compton to collect the \$20 prizes. Management's gains instead of losses of any scheme—were then to collect the money and transfer it to the originator of the plan, according to Bussemaker.

Bussemaker said Telecredit was responsible for assisting police in preventing any money reaching the suspect, or suspects.

# Famed Diamond 'Idol's Eye Goes on Sale in New York

**NEW YORK, Nov. 13**—One of the world's most famous diamonds, the legendary 7.12 carat "Idol's Eye," will go on the auction block here Wednesday with a 1.35 million dollar collection of other rare stones.

The many-faceted blue-white stone, 1.35 carats in weight, is the largest of its kind ever found in Venezuela. It is expected to bring about \$250,000. Another diamond necklace, studded with 12 emeralds weighing 107 carats each once belonged to the Indian maharajah of Indore. It is expected to bring \$200,000.

The "Idol's Eye" was mined in the Colorado mines in Hyderabad, India, in 1600, and became the property of Prince Bahadur of Indore, who took it to the East India Trading company in payment of debt. For 250 years the jewel disappeared from sight, but was found by Sultan Adil Shah in the 18th century.

The auction sale also includes the largest emerald-cut diamond in the world, "The Liberator," which weighs 120 carats.
