Idaho General Fund Agencies Ask More Money

BOISE, Nov. 15 (UPI)—Idaho's general fund agencies have requested a total of about 28 million dollars to operate the next two years that now are pending the pre-legislative budget committee's report. Rep. Pete Cenarrusa, R., Blaine, said the total general fund budget request for the next two years amounts to about 118.3 million dollars. Appropriations for the current biennium totaled 88.3 million dollars. Cenarrusa, vice chairman of the committee, said all education requests are being made by the schools and the institutions of higher learning amount to about 76.5 million dollars. The health department requests 11.5 million dollars and public assistance for 12 million dollars. The state auditor requests 8 million dollars and is asking a total of about 18.3 million dollars.

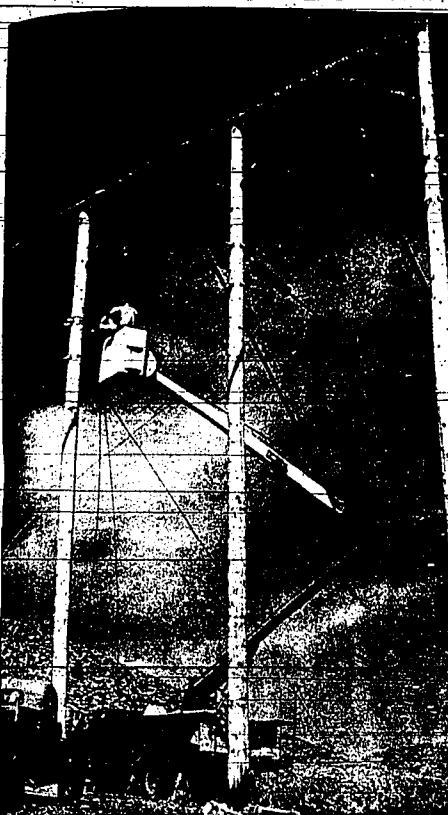

New Transmission Line Will Boost Power in Hailey Area

HAILEY, Nov. 12.—Service will be next month on a new 132-kv. transmission line being built by Idaho Power company to provide an increased supply of electricity to present and future needs of this steadily growing town, the utility's Hailey-Shoshone manager announced Wednesday.

HUNGARIAN SPROUT AND SALMON CASSEROLE
(Makes 6 servings)
2 packages (10 ounces each) frozen brussels sprouts, or 1 pound (1 quart) fresh brussels sprouts
1 can (1 pound) salmon, drained and flaked
1 cup cooked rice
1 cup sour cream
2 tablespoons lemon juice
1 cup grated cheddar cheese
1 cup chopped chives

1. Wash sprouts.
2. Cook frozen brussels sprouts according to package directions. Drain if necessary. If fresh brussels sprouts are used, cook covered, in 1-inch boiling salted water 10 minutes. Arrange half of sprouts in the bottom of a greased 1 1/2-quart casserole.
3. Mix together: salmon, rice, soft cream, lemon juice, cheese, chives and pepper. Spread salmon mixture over sprouts in casserole; top with remaining sprouts. Cover and bake in slow oven (325 degrees F.) 40 minutes. Serve hot. NOTE: Two cartons (13 ounces each) fresh brussels sprouts may be used.

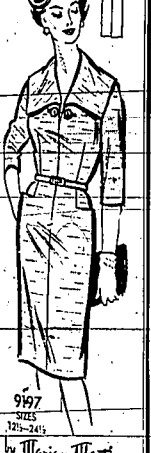

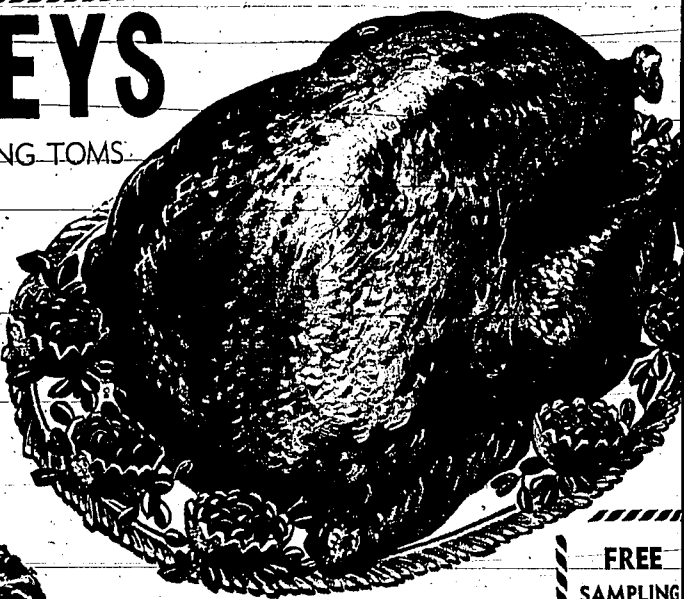

Wartime Tax On Rail, Air-Travel Axed

WASHINGTON, Nov. 15 (AP)—Millions of American travelers will begin saving nearly 100 million dollars a year on their combined travel expenses when wartime transportation taxes are wiped off the books at midnight tonight.

The 10 per cent federal tax on air fares will be replaced immediately by a 6 per cent "user charge" designed to help pay for airports, navigational aids and other government-financed facilities used by the airlines. The 10 per cent tax on the price of rail, bus and boat tickets will be eliminated completely.

These tax changes, approved by congress last summer, will trim about 170 million dollars from federal revenues. Cash benefits to the public will be less, however, because 24 railroads and about 50 bus lines will increase fares to offset all or part of the tax savings.

Udall Will Push OK for Power Lines

WASHINGTON, Nov. 15 (AP)—Interior Secretary Stewart L. Udall says a two-step strategy will be followed in an effort to get the next congress to approve a proposed West Coast power transmission line.

Udall said Wednesday that one step will be to obtain enactment at the earliest possible date of preference legislation to protect power rights in the areas originating the power.

The second, he said, is to include funds in the next budget to finance a start on the line. Udall said the legislative strategy was reached at a meeting with Undersecretary James K. Carr, Assistant Secretary Kenneth Holm and Bonneville Power Administrator Charles Luce. The proposed high-voltage transmission line would move electrical power from the Columbia basin to industrial centers in California.

U. S. Bureau Says Salt Lake Milk Has High Radioactivity

WASHINGTON, Nov. 15 (AP)—The U. S. public health service says milk samples from Salt Lake City showed the second highest content of radioactive iodine of all cities where milk was regularly inspected.

The service said Wednesday that the measurement for the year ended Sept. 29 was 36,200 micro-microcuries of radioactive iodine-131, based on average daily amounts in one liter of milk.

A spokesman said this level is not considered a public health hazard. What the health service

describes as the acceptable health risk level of exposure is 38,000 micro-microcuries in a 30-month period.

One city, Palmer, Alaska, did exceed the level, with 39,660 micro-microcuries per liter of milk during the period. The spokesman said this was also not considered a hazard to health, but iodine-131, based on average daily amounts in one liter of milk.

Prosecutor Kenneth Pike said at his closing argument that the three Indians accused of violating the state health and safety code, "if we permit the door-to-door sale, it could open the door to a national epidemic. Some religious sects would eventually be using heroin."

A. L. Wirth, a defense attorney, concluded by charging the Indians were being denied due process of law, and said the case may perhaps evolve to whether the white man takes away the Indian's religion as he did the Indian land.

Ancient Vendetta Code Accounts for More Dead

OROCOLO, Gardina, Nov. 15.—Vendetta the ancient code of killing for revenge, accounted for the fifth death here Tuesday night in a vendetta that started with the slaying of a visiting British couple two weeks ago.

Orziano Medina, known as a professional "bandit," walked into a saloon Tuesday evening and armed with a sub-machinegun, hand grenades and a knife, he found his intended victim, Giuseppe Andrea Musca, 72, sitting at a table playing cards with some friends. Medina ordered them to stand up, according to police, then fired a burst of machine gun bullets into Musca's body, killing him instantly.

Some three or four weeks after the slaying, Medina was struck with a beer bottle, subdued, beaten and hauled off to the police station. The story behind the slaying follows the complicated logic of vendetta, an Italian custom of joining Corsica, where Vendetta first became a way of life centuries ago.

The latest feud started with the killing of Edmund and Vera Townley, British tourists from Toronto, Oct. 29. Their bodies were found in a mountain meadow their camp about 50 miles north of the Sardinian capital of Cagliari.

Their deaths broke an investigation into slaying-killing-for-revenge, discrediting the Sardinian reputation for hospitality.

Four days later, Orziano Medina, older brother of Orziano, was found dead in the country-side. A few yards away was the body of Salvatore Mattia.

Police believed Orziano Medina, who also had a record of banditry, killed and robbed the Townleys. For this he was shot to death by Mattia who was in turn fatally stabbed by Medina's friend, police thought.

At his death, Mattia's wife was due to strike next, Giuseppe Musca, look over Mattia's place as a gang leader, but before the

could move, Medina's brother took the next step, killing Mattia last night to raise the death toll to five.

In two weeks, the Townleys, Medina, Mattia and Musca had been killed in accordance with the primitive code.

Police believed Orziano Medina, who also had a record of banditry, killed and robbed the Townleys. For this he was shot to death by Mattia who was in turn fatally stabbed by Medina's friend, police thought.
