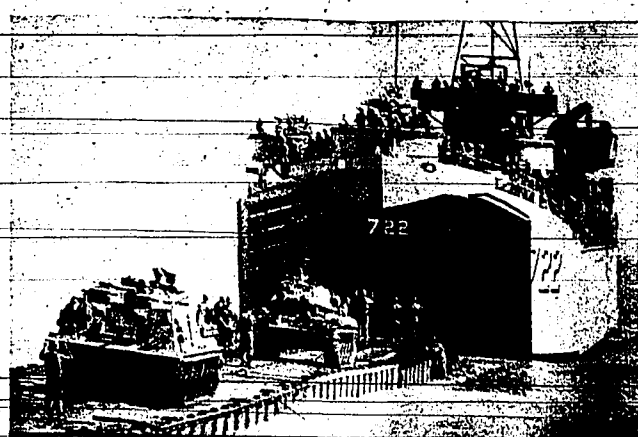
### Icy Gales Bring Death To Europe

### U.S. Warns Of Policies On Trading

PARIS, Nov. 19 (AP)—The United States today warned European trade officials that their restrictive farm import trade policies threatened the unity and strength of the West.

It warned that Washington has the power to take retaliatory measures for delivery to the agricultural committee of the organization for economic cooperation and development. Its membership is made up of Western European countries, Canada and the United States.

President's talk had been approved by President Kennedy and Secretary of State Dean Rusk.

He said the United States was concerned—particularly about farm policies being developed by the European-Common-Market composed of France, Italy, West Germany, Belgium, The Netherlands, and Luxembourg. Great Britain may become a member.

### Two East German Escapees Tell of Time In 'Nazi Like' Concentration Camps

BERLIN, Nov. 19 (AP)—Nazi-style concentration camps have returned to East Germany, according to two men who served in one.

The two men, both of whom fled to West Berlin, said the camps were established for anti-communists, were so harsh that they knew of at least three suicides.

The men, Dietrich Mueller, 23, and Guenter Breuer, 28, told their story in a West Berlin radio camp after a 30-day flight from the Mildenberg "work education camp" near Oranienburg, 20 miles north of Berlin.

They said work education camps were concentration camps.

In everything-but-name-without bare barracks surrounded by barbed wire, 15-foot high walls and watch towers manned by communist police with orders to shoot on sight.

The existence of the camps was no secret. The East German government announced their establishment soon after it built the anti-emigration wall on the East-West Berlin border Aug. 13, 1961.

But until Mueller and Breuer swam a cold border canal to West Berlin, details of life in the camps was unknown.

They escaped while on a work party at a collective farm. They hid and swam out for 24 days.

They said they were held in a room with 230 men. They were fed bread and soup about two ounces of sausage, a smattering of fat and two slices of bread.

In theory the inmates received wages of 216 marks (1954) a month but they had to give back all but 30 marks (\$750) for lodging.

Out of the 30 marks left, they had to pay for their clothing and toilet articles.

The two said they escaped Oct. 18, while working on the collective farm, made their way to East Berlin in three days and hid out near the border until they escaped through barbed wire and swam a border canal.

### U. S. May Re-Heat Crisis To Prevent 'Castro-Hero'

If Fidel Castro is not to emerge in the guise of victor and hero from the U.S.-Soviet confrontation, it may be necessary one of these days for the United States to reject the Cuban crisis.

The appearance of a Castro victory in the Cuban standoff, after all that has happened, could have disastrous results for U.S. policy in Latin America, where it scored heavily with the strong posture which resulted in dismantling of Soviet missiles in the Caribbean.

Yet under certain circumstances Castro might make points for his side. It is entirely possible for him to proclaim himself a victor over the "North American imperialists"—if nothing is done about those Soviet bombers on Cuban soil or inspectors are not put in Cuba to make sure offensive weapons have been removed.

The communists could regard the compromise on either of these points as a backdown by the United States in the face

of Castro's defiance. Castro might thus try to recoup some of the losses he sustained in Latin America when both Kennedy and Khrushchev humiliated him in the showdown.

It is difficult to believe that the long stay of Anastas I. Mikoyan in Cuba has been anything more than a Kremlin maneuver, a substitute to indicate to the world that the Havana regime still enjoys sovereignty, that it is not owned outright by Soviet communists.

It is difficult to believe there was no collusion between Castro and the Soviet first deputy premier in what is presented to the world as a stubborn Castro stand against inspection and against giving up the bombers.

The Soviet Union, through Premier Khrushchev, pledged itself to remove from Cuba any weapons Kennedy regarded as offensive, and to permit on-the-spot inspection. Moscow's excuse for not removing the bombers: His bridges are burned. He has no choice in the long run except to obey Moscow. The whole Cu-
