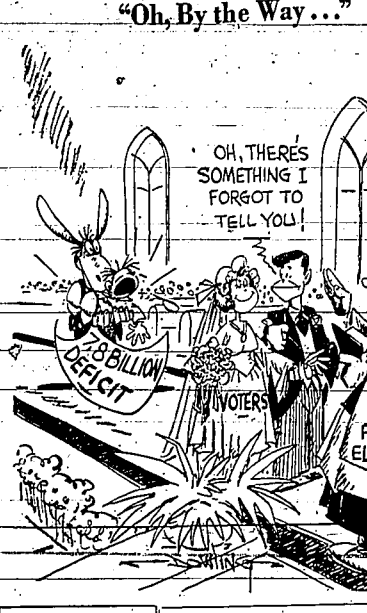

Advisers Tell President to Slash Taxes

WASHINGTON, Nov. 20—A presidential advisory committee recommended Monday a 10 billion dollar tax cut to strengthen the economy and expand production.

In a report to President Kennedy, the advisory committee on labor-management policy said a majority of its members favored a cut of that size only next year. Some preferred applying the reduction over two or three years. "I wanted to hold the cut at four or five billion dollars during the next year."

"Tax rates should be reduced on both individual and corporate incomes," the committee said in the report which it released. "A dollar amount, the bulk of the tax reduction should take the form of lowering the rates on the income tax rates. The remainder should be achieved through reducing the 'emergency' corporate tax rate of 30 per cent."

Secretary of Labor W. Willard Wirtz told the committee that he had not settled upon a plan for the corporate tax figure. The rate has been boosted from 47 per cent during the Korean war.

Plane Axed

LONDON, Aug. 20—Aviation Minister Julian Amery announced yesterday that British airlines will suspend development of its revolutionary multi-jet liner.

He said the short BAC 1-11 jet plane had proved valuable data on basic aerodynamic and pilotage problems of vertical takeoff.

"At present, however, we have no further plans for the development of multi-jet aircraft in the United Kingdom," he said.

COPENHAGEN, Denmark, Nov. 20—Fifteen passengers aboard a Polish tourist train have departed to the West, police sources said. The train was held for political asylum and the other six are expected to do so within the next 24 hours.

The 15 were said to have been among 20 passengers who arrived here about the Polish ship "Mazowiec." The liner sailed back to Poland that night with only 60 passengers.

India Makes Urgent Plea For Aircraft

WASHINGTON, Nov. 20—An urgent appeal from India's Prime Minister Nehru for helicopters and transport planes was delivered to President Kennedy on Monday.

India also sent a number of requests for more arms and equipment to the state department. Authorities sources said the appeal for aircraft was contained in a letter delivered to the president in person by Indian Ambassador D. K. Nehru, a cousin of the prime minister.

After the hastily arranged White House meeting, Ambassador Nehru said the purpose of his call was to acquaint President Kennedy with the latest developments in the military situation and the urgent need for defense reinforcements.

The new vote from Prime Minister Nehru came in the wake of heavy Chinese Communist attacks that brought the Red Army to within 40 to 50 miles of India's Assam oil fields.

State department press officer Lincoln White said the United States took a very serious view of the large scale Chinese attacks. He also disclosed that India had sent a number of requests for arms and equipment to supplement the five million dollars worth already authorized.

An authoritative Indian source said there was no list of items in the letter delivered to Washington. He said the need for transport aircraft, including helicopters

WASHINGTON, Nov. 20—The administration requirement that government officials report their talks with newsmen also applies to the White House.

Federal charges against GM's Southern California Chevrolet dealer organizations and 351 co-conspirators were based on charges of restraint of trade.

In the one-count criminal indictment, the government accuses defendants of conspiring to deprive Chevrolet buyers here of a free and unrestricted competitive market. This was accomplished, the suit contends, by holding sale of cars through discount houses and referral services.

GM denied government charges and contended "It is a responsibility not only to dealers, but also to customers to assure that the product we sell is properly handled."

The government charged two years ago the defendants conspired to "induce and persuade" Chevrolet dealers to stop selling cars through discount houses and referral services.

Attorneys for GM and the dealers are expected to appear in court today.

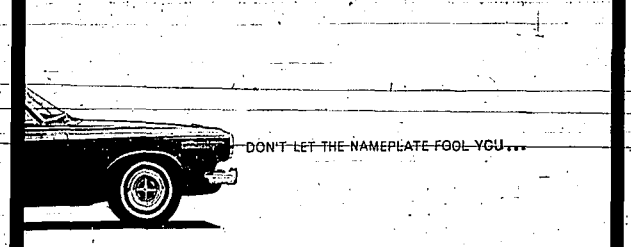

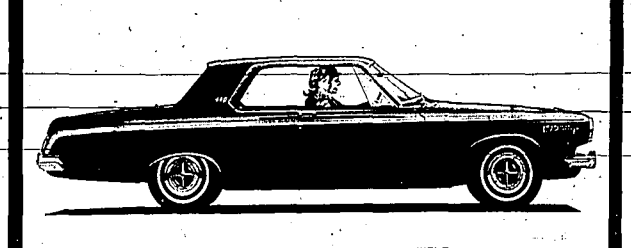

Air Service Report Given To Chamber

HAILEY, Nov. 20—Jack Davies, Twin Falls mayor and chairman of the Chamber of Commerce members at their regular noon dinner meeting Monday afternoon stated he has received a civil aeronautics board ruling that "all service to Idaho will continue indefinitely on a seasonal basis. Davies explained that planes were unable to land here during severe storms last winter and for a time in the spring when the runway was not sufficiently dry. He reviewed the two major projects of the city council the past summer, which cost some \$35,000.

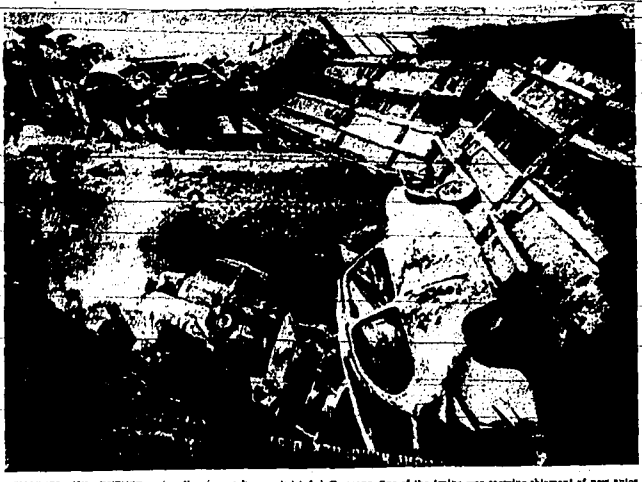

Washington Faces Threat Of Flooding

Low lying areas of western Washington faced a flood threat Thursday in the wake of a storm which raked out a portion of the Willapa peninsula and caused injuries to two women in Spokane.

The Skagit, Stillaguamish and Nooksack rivers rose above flood stage Monday night, and other streams were rising.

The floodwaters flowed over the Mount Baker Highway at Maple Falls, closing the route, Jackman Creek, a tributary of the Skagit, broke through a dike four miles east of Concrete, limiting traffic on state highway to one lane.

The state was in- in Yakima, said the Willapa pass highway was closed late Monday by a washing of four miles west of the summit. Earlier, the road was closed for an hour and a half by rock slides east of the summit.

The storm caused temporary power outages in parts of the state. Mount Vernon was without power about 40 miles after a high wind knocked out a transmission line. In Spokane, Washington Water Power company spokesman said Rosalia, 100000, minus electricity for about half an hour.

U. S. Learns Of Hidden Red Missiles

NEW YORK, Nov. 20 (AP)—The United States has learned that tactical missiles capable of carrying nuclear warheads have been hidden inside Cuba and the missiles are capable of reaching into Guantanamo naval base, the New York Herald Tribune reported today.

Known as "Frogs," these ground-to-ground mobile missiles have a range of about 100 miles, the newspaper said in a Washington dispatch from its Pulitzer prize-winning reporter, Marguerite Higgins.

She wrote that administration officials are unwilling to explain how they obtained "clear evidence" that the missiles were hidden inside Cuba.

The "Frogs" range over ground-to-ground missiles are capable of using both conventional explosives and atomic warheads.

In effect, they amount to long-range artillery weapons of a kind that could be crucial in a push against the U. S. naval base at Guantanamo, Cuba.

Governor Warns Of Dangers In "Dual Fishing"

NEW YORK, Nov. 20 (AP)—Alaska Gov. William Egan warned yesterday of a "very definite possibility of violence" if the Japanese are permitted to fish alongside Americans for Bering sea halibut.

"Make no mistake about it. There are no good feelings between American and Japanese fishermen," said Egan who is in New York with a group of Alaska business leaders to discuss the young state's economy with possible investors.

Egan said he was deeply disappointed with the North Pacific Fisheries commission's recommendation that the east-Bering sea halibut fishery be opened to the Japanese.

Ship Sinks After Swirl Of Charges

NORFOLK, Va., Nov. 20 (AP)—The East Star, the Canadian freighter whose captain accused Cubans of filling its fuel tanks with water, sank in the Atlantic Friday. The captain and a crew of 12 abandoned the ship Sunday in stormy seas.

The coast guard here reported that the vessel went down about 73 miles northeast of Bermuda. The sinking was witnessed by the coast guard cutter Mendota.

The ship's captain, Edward Clark, 61, and his crew were rescued from the helpless 155-foot freighter on Sunday and brought to Bermuda.

Upon arrival, Clark made his charge that Cubans had filled the freighter's fuel tanks with water instead of fuel oil.

BURLINGAME, Nov. 20 (AP)—A family of seven from Olemiss Perry, a gasman from Los Angeles, a St. Louis, Mo., resident, and an unidentified driver figured in a chain-reaction traffic accident attributed to slick roads on Interstate 80N nine miles east of Burlingame on Sunday.

Railroad Files Suit on Strike

DENVER, Nov. 20 (AP)—The Denver and Rio Grande Western railroad filed suit Monday against 10,000 strikers against the Brotherhood of Railroad Trainmen which the company said staged an illegal 8-hour strike in 1960.

The complaint filed in U. S. district court claimed the railroad lost that much revenue when the strike forced suspension of operations and caused shippers to divert traffic from the Rio Grande.

Band Plays

LONDON, Nov. 20 (AP)—There was bad news today for television viewers who have been spared listening to musical commercials. The four-month-old television industry strike has been settled.

Musicians, who had refused to record tunes for television commercials and movie-house advertisements, won a 100 per cent increase in pay.

The musicians, who were paid \$18.00 for an hour-long session, will now get \$33.00. They had demanded \$67.20.

Union Sets Strike at Lockheed

BURBANK, Calif., Nov. 20 (AP)—A negotiating committee yesterday set next Monday for a strike against Lockheed Aircraft Corporation by International Association of Machinists members employed by the aerospace giant.

The walkout was set after thousands of union members voted overwhelmingly at mass rallies Sunday to authorize a strike.

A union spokesman said pickets would be set up at all Lockheed operations including Cape Canaveral and Honolulu. He said other unions were expected to honor the pickets.

Lockheed officials indicated earlier that operations would continue if the pickets were stayed.

Miss Powie was with Markham more than two hours before Spokane police arrested him a few feet across the Idaho state line.

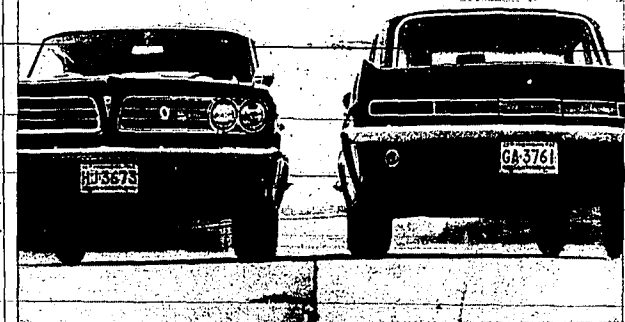
