# Indian-Chinese Shooting Ends; No Settlement

NEW DELHI, India, Nov. 22 (AP)—Shooting has stopped along the Himalayan frontier but informed sources said today India is not planning to accept Red China's offer of a settlement of the month-old unending border war. Prime Minister Nehru told parliament: "So far as we know there has been an effective cease-fire." He made no mention of the Indian reaction to the offer, which would be to withhold its fire against Chinese troops who are observing a self-imposed ceasefire. The full impact of the prospect of more fighting remains obscure in New Delhi said.

## Traffic Tragedies Marring Week-End

The nation's traffic deaths mounted steadily today as the first hours of the long Thanksgiving holiday saw 10 persons killed in two violent crashes in Texas. The number killed in motor vehicle accidents since 6 p.m. local time Wednesday was 48. The count will continue until midnight Sunday. Five persons were killed in one-on-head-on-crash of two cars. The dead included three 19-year-old sailors stationed at the Memphis, Tenn., Naval air station. The crash with the Houston residents were injured. State police said the driver, a 21-year-old man, was killed in a two-car crash, were being taken to a hospital in Houston. The driver of the other car, Weldon Martin, Welton mortally injured his wife, who was driving the car. The driver was hospitalized with injuries.

The National Safety Council today is warning of a traffic deaths for Thanksgiving. A spokesman said the holiday is a recent non-holiday period getting only one day off and comparatively few of them making it. The spokesman said traffic fatalities for a Thanksgiving-Sunday period at the end of year number about 48.

A survey of traffic accidents for four days was made by the Associated Press. The survey showed that 49 deaths were caused during Thanksgiving.

# Virginians Have Leading Position in "Thanksgiving"

**BERKELEY PLANTATION**, has celebrated Thanksgiving only once. It was on Dec. 14, 1619, and the small band had just arrived in the struggling colony of Virginia after a two-month journey aboard the ship Margaret from Bristol, England.

With breastplates glistening in the low autumn sun and halberds at the ready, the colonists were welcomed by Capt. John Woodespeck, who read the company's charter and read the instructions.

"They were drinking that day of our ship's arrival at the place assigned for the plantation in the land of Virginia shall be yearly and perpetually kept as a day of thanksgiving to the Almighty God."

This is the view held in Virginia, a state rarely known to be modest about its history.

In proclaiming Thanksgiving this year Gov. Albert S. Harrison, Jr., ignored the long-accepted Plymouth rock version and said the day would serve as a memorial to the Virginians who gathered at Berkeley near Richmond in 1619 to observe America's first Thanksgiving ceremony.

Virginia's claim on the first Thanksgiving has been raised only in recent years, although the landing and the services at Berkeley are documented.

# New "Shared Time" Plans May Bring Support of Taxes

By The Associated Press  
 In a number of communities scattered throughout the land, pupils from Roman Catholic parochial schools for years have been attending occasional classes in public schools.  
 From Connecticut to Oklahoma, public schools here and there have opened their doors to parochial students for classes that require special equipment — for the most part home economics and industrial arts.  
 The system lately has acquired the designation "shared time." Now a Pittsburgh suburb is expanding this idea in what may be the first wholesale attempt of an unopposed school by public and parochial students.  
 "Some think the outcome may have an crucial impact on current national debate over federal aid to parochial schools, and perhaps point to a way out of the impasse."  
 The experiment is being made in Monroeville, about 10 miles

west of Pittsburgh. Some 33 boys from the 11th grade of a Roman Catholic high school are spending half of each school day in advanced science classes at the New Forbes Trail Area Technical school.  
 The rest of the day they study religion, social science, English and related subjects at their parochial school. The St. Thomas school in North Braddock borough.  
 So far, the program has met with little publicized resistance. Of the 2,778 "non-public" Pennsylvania school children who used public school facilities part time last school year, 873 were located in Allegheny (Pittsburgh) county, 574 of them in the city of Pittsburgh.  
 In Connecticut, major cities in the state have been opening public schools to students from Catholic schools for some classes, for some time, as long as 20 years in Hartford.  
 In Oklahoma, the German community of Okarche has a similar plan. For years Holy Trinity school has sent four classes—a day-ahop and home economics—to Okarche high school.  
 The shared time idea has been discussed in other cities including St. Louis and San Francisco.

# U. S. Military Returns to 'Middle Ages' on Catapult

NEW YORK, Nov. 22 (AP)—The ordinary vehicles and where they are used to under rise.

 The "Grasshopper" will take troops in a hurry many places and fold up into a small trailer that cannot be penetrated by

 Yet this many catapult will throw a 250-pound object 450 feet forward or up and over a hill almost 250 feet high. This great power is obtained from a modified 37-millimeter explosive cartridge. Instead of driving a projectile from a cannon barrel, the explosive fires a piston mechanism.  
 The piston actuates an ingeniously designed system of strong covers and springs that built the load just as the ancient catapult did. But with a range and accuracy the medieval engineer didn't dream of.

## Americans in Viet Nam Learn Trade of Frontier

**SALON, South Viet Nam, Nov. 22** — Americans in South Viet Nam are learning some lessons their forefathers knew by heart when the Indian and white man clashed for control of the North American continent. Just a few miles from the remote, jungle-covered highlands of central Viet Nam are hundreds of small hill forts and outposts, where Vietnamese troops and their American advisers operate. These operations are not intended to kill. They are to make friends and influence people. Outside the forts are dangerous tribesmen who dread in brilliant, hand-woven fabrics of loin clothes. They are alert, alert people who hunt with spears and cross bows. Their arrows are tipped with deadly strychnine-based poisons extracted from native plants. Some are fighting on the side of the Saigon forces. Some are fighting for the Vietnamese communist rebels. Most are content to be left alone by all outsiders. There are 700,000 of these highland mountaineers, divided into about 34 main tribal groups and dozens of sub-groups. Few of the tribes speak common languages. Only a minority speak Vietnamese, the national language. Yet they are the dominant inhabitants of a sparsely populated area making up about two-thirds of South Viet Nam's land area. As such, they are key elements in the deadly war between the Viet Cong and the government.

Kalanchoes will do best in a sunny window. Keep the faded blooms pinched off so they will not set seed and new buds will continue to develop and open for many weeks. For robust growth, feed a soluble plant food once every month.

### Let Your Children Construct Their Own Holiday Presents

The pre-Christmas season can be a busy and constructive time for children. As they make-up their gift lists, remind them that growing and young children find delight in receiving presents of their own making. And it's a relatively easy way to have their gifts personalized. Gifts are easily fashioned. Place a glass of oil cloth or rubber cement or glue can be used to make many, many very pretty gifts. Let the young artist decide which gifts they want to make. Help in estimating the amount of oil cloth and the few other things needed.

The seasonal card is a relatively new development. It has evolved from the penmanship cards issued at school during the Christmas season. To test the student's proficiency with his pen, some were so well done they took the place of other gifts.

By the custom of sending these cards was well established in England. It became so popular in this country in the 1870's that L. Prang and Company, Boston, broke the British monopoly and began manufacturing cards in America. Greens for decorations came as from the Romans, who used them during the winter holidays of Saturnalia. At this time of year, late December, the druids of ancient Britain gathered mistletoe for their sacred rites. The plant was held to be so powerful that enemies meeting under it would lay aside their weapons and embrace. Hence our custom of kissing under the mistletoe.

Make place trays by cutting out rectangles, circles or flower shapes from red or green oil cloth. From a contrasting colored or patterned oil cloth, cut circles to resemble Christmas tree ornaments. Gifts are easily fashioned. Place a glass of oil cloth or rubber cement or glue around the bottom of the glass for a guide line, and cut. Make an outline of the animal's legs on the plate mat. See that the children look through some coloring and reading books for pictures of animals and select the ones they want to use. Make an outline of the animal with tracing paper and pencil. Cut out and use as the pattern. Place a pattern on oil cloth and cut two identical pieces. Sew edges together with yarn, using an overcast stitch. Leave enough room open at top to fill animal with cotton. After cotton is inserted, sew rest of edges together.

Christmas cards will be truly personal when they are the result of the children's handiwork. Use card board (save some from Dad's shirts when they come back from the laundry), construction paper or something similar for the cards. Cut out Christmas trees, wreaths, a Santa Claus, reindeer, poinsettia, tree ornaments, stockings and so on from various colors and patterns of oil cloth. Mix and match shapes and designs and paste on the cards. Have the youngsters add their greetings in crayon or paint.

### Popular Evergreen Types Listed for Shopping Help

Perhaps you are one of the wise folk who already have decided what kind of tree you are going to have this Christmas. You may even be going out to the woods to cut your own.

Or, you may plan to buy one and the nursery to transport outdoors after the holidays.

No matter whether you have your tree transported in a truck, there's a run-down to some of the more popular and attractive Christmas greens.

Douglas fir: A fragrant and long-lasting tree, this evergreen is a favorite on the West Coast and in the Plains states. The dark yellow-green or blue-green needles striped on the underside are flat and pointed, and are attached along the branch.

White pine: Not as popular as Scotch pine, but many folks prefer this species because its rich blue-green color, its long needles (three to five inches) grow in clusters of five, and are slender and flexible.

As with most other pines the long needles give the branches a bushier appearance than fir or spruce.

Other pines (Virginia, Red or Norway, Pitch, Austrian, etc.) can also be recognized by their long needles growing in clusters.

Black spruce: Like other spruces (Norway, White, Blue, etc.) "bluish" spruce is best for an outdoor tree or decorations because it sheds its needles after a few days indoors and needles are one-fourth to three-fourths of an inch long, male blue-green, stiff and sharp pointed, and are attached all around the branch. (One way to distinguish a spruce is to pull out a needle—spruce has a bump.)

Often it has rounded cones about an inch long, spruce is not as fragrant as fir or pine.

Eastern red cedar: This tree is most popular in the South. It has short (about one-half inch) awl-shaped or "needle-like" needles, which are yellow-green. Sometimes it has small, dark berries. The famous cedar aroma is reflected only when the wood is cut; it's very fragrant otherwise.

This, say many fur salesmen, is the way Santa shops for the gift that of all the gifts from him to her is still one of the first on the Christmas list.

While furriers naturally are glad when Santa chooses fur, they sometimes wish he'd make his choice in a somewhat different way and chances are Mrs. Santa agrees.

Mink still holds top popularity, but another fashionable fur such as leopard, beaver, sable, broadtail or seal might be preferred.

There are many ways Santa can be sure his precious gift of fur will be absolutely right. Simplest of all is to let Mrs. Santa in on the secret and let her select the fur and its design herself.

However, if he's yearning to surprise her, that, too, can be done. He can, for instance, make sure what fur and style she prefers by a few "casual" questions (she may suspect, but she won't know.) If she has an extra cloth coat, perhaps he can slip it out of the house and hold it to the traffic as a size guide.

Santa can also, with the furrier's cooperation, select the style to be sent in the coat and these can become a giftwrapped bundle under the tree. Delighted Mrs. Santa can choose her own design later.

Another plan is a gift package that symbolizes the completed coat, with one fur skin and a sketch of a design, white thread-stitching, cash, change, size waist.

The fur department of her favorite store will often be able to furnish "them" their departments needed information about size and style preferences.

First, and most important of all, mail gifts and cards early to ensure delivery before Christmas.

After the expiration of this period, the use of airmail and air parcel post is recommended to ensure delivery by Dec. 25.

All Christmas cards for out-of-state delivery, and all domestic Christmas parcels, should be mailed prior to Dec. 10. Mail cards for local delivery before Dec. 10.
