

Traffic Fatalities Soar to Record 705 Over Holiday

At least 505 persons were killed in traffic accidents during the nation's four-day Thanksgiving week-end. The highest toll for the holiday period in recent years was the highest toll and 150 fatalities in other types of accidents including plane crashes, brought the total toll killed in all types of accidents during the 102-hour period to 705—also the highest number during the past 10 years of record-keeping.

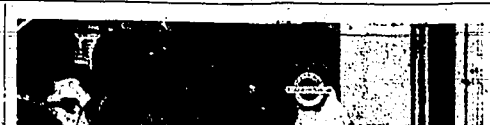

Idaho Second In Alfalfa Seed Harvest

UNIVERSITY OF IDAHO, Nov. 26 (Special)—Idaho has harvested its largest crop of alfalfa seed in 1962, an estimated 10 million pounds, according to the Idaho extension service.

The harvest of 18 million pounds was one-third larger than the crop of 14 million in the last five years.

Idaho is second in California. Most of the Idaho crop is grown in Owyhee, Canyon, and Twin Falls counties.

This national harvest is declining. Royance said, the Idaho crop is larger because of the higher yields. In California, the leading state for several years, seed much larger than Idaho seed is being used for alfalfa purposes.

Over 10 million pounds of the Idaho crop is certified seed which is marketed at a premium.

Growing conditions were favorable in Idaho this year. Royance said weather was good as well as soil. Irrigation by hand and leaf-cutting bees was used to increase production. Portions of the bees have been increased.

Building up Washington, Nov. 25 (U)

The commerce department forecasts another record year for construction in the United States in 1963.

In a forecast issued Sunday by the department, it says that money spent for building next year will total \$10 billion, an increase of about 2.1 billion dollars over the estimated output this year of \$9.2 billion dollars. This year is expected to set a record, running about 2.2 billion dollars ahead of 1961.

Two Americans, Canadian Scale Yosemite El Capitan

Yosemite NATIONAL PARK, Calif., Nov. 26 (U)—Two Americans and a Canadian have become the first to climb the treacherous 3,000-foot, south-west precipice of Yosemite's granite-faced El Capitan.

Wesley and Ed Cooper, 24, of Seattle, the elmba's brother, summed it up as they climbed his way over the 3,000-foot, high summit Sunday afternoon: "This is enough climbing."

Busby-born Jim Baldwin, also 24, Prince Rupert, B. C., exhibited a big toe struck through a worn-through leather climbing boot, and swollen joints. His hands bore rope burns—some of them deep. "I was down the face before his companions could check his descent," Baldwin declared, "and luckily I didn't freeze my toe."

Wesley Denny, 25, a San Jose State college student from Livingston, Calif., said: "We had to climb about 100 feet before we started. But halfway up we began running low and were limited to one man at a time."

German Leader Before Hitler Turns 77 in U. S.

NONWICH, Vt., Nov. 25 (U)—An old man now, alone with his memories in a simple cottage on a knoll overlooking this picturesque Connecticut river town. "Thirty years ago Dr. Heinrich Brüning, soldier, politician and scholar, held in his hand the destiny of a mighty country," Brüning, 77 years old today, was chancellor of Germany during two uneventful years when he led an unsuccessful struggle to maintain a democratic government in that strife-torn country.

His restoration was forced on May 30, 1932, during the last desperate months of the German republic.

Seven months later the chancellorship was entrusted to the man who would bring an end to a 13-year attempt to make democracy work in Germany—Adolf Hitler.

NEW YORK, Nov. 26 (U)—Americans are eating more candy than ever, consuming 200 million pounds per capita in the last three years, threatens the makers of sweeteners.

Since World War II, Americans have eaten more candy on a sales basis than ever before. They're too after getting in step with the nation's economic growth rate for which the candy industry is just a part.

Their biggest reason is just a part of the candy is a big business. Americans live more dangerously during the holidays.

Confectioners admit they still have a tough fight ahead with the "no-candy" countries—and those who associate sweets with enforced trips to the dentist.

But some 2,000 confectionery manufacturers in the United States expect their total output this year will come close to 2 1/2 billion pounds, with a sales value of more than 2.5 billion dollars.

The per capita consumption figure that most pleases the Candy, Chocolate and Confectionery Institute, set up in January, 1961, to try to get the business moving ahead again.

Output per capita is 114 pounds in 1961, according to available records, at 204 pounds per person a year, and total output grew only at the same pace as did the population. In 1960, consumption was put at 109 pounds per person.

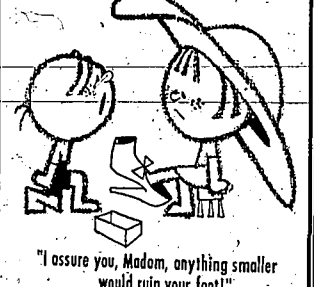

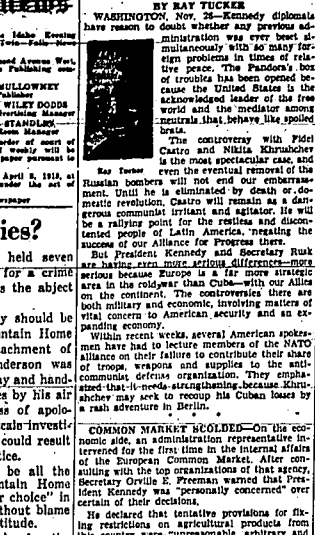

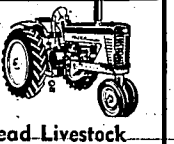

Giants Near East Title, Rematch With Packers For League Championship

Those so-called "old" New York Giants are up to their even older habits today in the Eastern conference of the National Football League. The Giants, whose alleged old age is more often a misnomer for proved experience, all but stashed away their last seven years with a record of 42-21 victory over the amplituous Washington Redskins, who dropped from second to third in the eastern race.

New York needs only a victory in one of its final three games to get the title, and it is expected to win at least one. A long-awaited, title rematch with the Green Bay Packers.

Green Bay, whose 37-10 victory over the Giants in the title game last year made them long odds underdogs, may try to repeat to hold a one-game edge over Detroit in the Western conference. Both were idle yesterday following the Lions' remarkable 21-14 victory over the Philadelphia Eagles. And both also have three games remaining.
