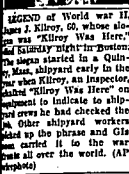



The largest number of cases was filed against Carter Jones Drilling company of Kilgus, which faces 18 suits in Upshur, Texas, and Greer county, Wood county is the fourth-most. Texas county where violation of railroad commission rules and illegal oil production through drilled wells is charged.

Wilson said that more suits in the hot oil scandals would be filed.

Boeing Rolls Out Newest 3-Engined, Short-Haul Jet

SEATTLE, Nov. 27.—(AP)—Boeing today rolled out the nation's first three-engine jetliner, the Boeing 727, in its new 270,000-pound configuration.

It bore about as much resemblance to the 25-year-old predecessor as a hurricane does to a house fan. Boeing's latest jet-er carrier, carrying a 43 million dollar price tag, has two engines mounted on each side of the rear fuselage and a third in the tail assembly. One engine alone costs three times as much as the entire 250,000 Ford T1000.

- 1 cup sugar
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 cup cup of margarine
- 1/2 cup oil
- 1 cup rolled oats (quick or old fashioned, uncooked)
- 1 cup chopped dates
- 1 cup water
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1 tablespoon lemon juice
- 1 cup chopped nuts

For moist softness, yeast in lukewarm water for dry yeast. Pour yeast into lukewarm water and butter. Cool to lukewarm. Beat in 1 cup flour and eggs. Add coffee treat and nuts. Stir in enough more flour to make a soft dough.

Turn out on lightly floured board or canvas; knead until satiny, about 10 minutes. Round dough into ball; place in greased bowl; brush lightly with melted shortening. Cover and let rise in a warm place until double in size, about 1 hour.

While dough is rising, combine filling ingredients in saucepan. Cook over low heat; stir occasionally until thickened. Cool. Punch dough down; turn out on lightly floured board. Cover; let rest 10 minutes. Divide dough in half. Roll each half to form

Radium-Dial Watch Sales Are Ended

NEW YORK, Nov. 27 (AP)—The city board of health has placed a ban on sales of radium-dial pocket watches in New York City, effective Feb. 1, on the ground that they are a radiation hazard to persons who carry them.

The action does not affect radium-dial wrist watches.

Dr. George James, health commissioner, explained that pocket watches normally are carried near the waist line, with the face toward the body, while wrist watches face away from the body and have metal between the radium dial and the arm.

Announcing the ban Monday, the health department said a study shows a radium-dial pocket watch emits 75 units of radiation a year, or 150 times more than the permissible 5 units a year set by the department.
