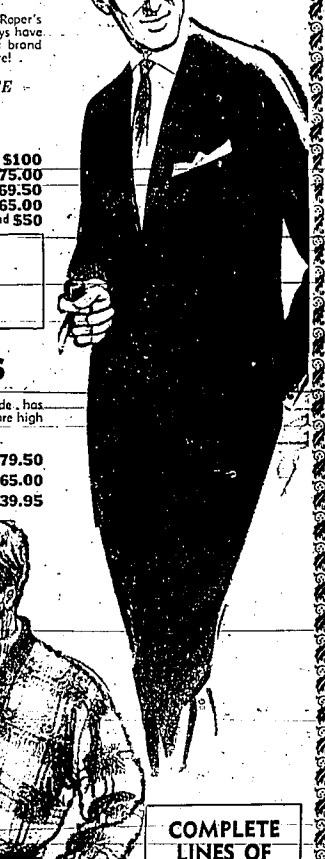

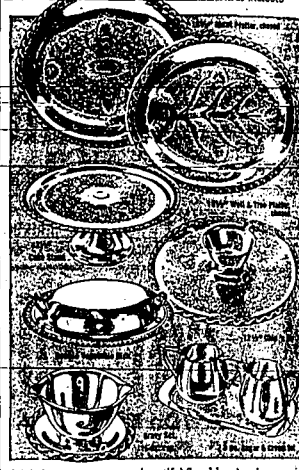

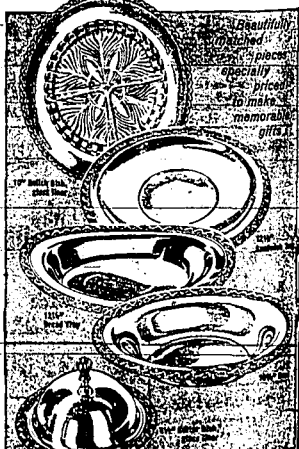

Baker Adds Heisman Trophy to Growing List of Grid Awards

NEW YORK, Nov. 28 (AP)—Phenomenal Terry Baker, the Oregon State honor student who played football 100 percent, was named winner Tuesday of the Heisman trophy as the outstanding performer in the college game. The T-formation quarterback and mechanical engineering brain was in a close race with Louisiana State halfback Jerry Stovall. The poll of 1,100 accredited sportswriters and broadcasters gave Baker 707 points to 618 for Stovall. Baker is a 6-foot-11, 225-pound southpaw passer and a deceptive runner with long, looping strides who has climbed to second place in the all-time career total offense leaders, 115,436 yards for three years of varsity competition. He topped only Johnny Bright of Drake, a star of a dozen years ago, who gathered 59,923 yards.

Baker had topped the poll of athletes every single season for the great athlete with exceptional intelligence. Baker came to Oregon State on a basketball scholarship after starting in three sports at Jefferson High in Portland, Ore. He did not even turn out for freshman football. Passing by the promoter field the spring of his freshman year, Baker got a year for football and decided to give the college game a try.

He shared the same winter track assignment as a sophomore and last year finally switched to the T which he felt was better suited to Baker's many talents. Baker was also one of the state's better punters. Linemen got their share of recognition in the balance, too. Minnesota tackle Bobby Bell and Alabama center Leo Roy Jordan were 2-1 in the voting last year.
