U.S. Students Riot With Nazi Band

CHICAGO, Dec. 3 (AP)—Seventy-five American male and a group of students who heckled their way into a pushing and shoving riot in the Sheraton Hotel in Chicago's loop.

Police arrested 11 men and youths for disturbing the peace who identified themselves as Nazis were seized on charges of inciting to riot.

Authorities said the brawl broke out after the Nazi group picked up a young man and a woman, against the showing of a movie by Manuel Termini, member of a pro-Nazi youth organization, taken on his recent trip to the Soviet Union.

The pickets carried signs reading "Communism must be smashed," "Red traitors speaking here tonight," and "Communism oppresses."

Air Death Toll Soars In November

By United Press International More than 200 persons lost their lives in commercial aviation crashes during the last week of November.

Twenty-five persons died last night when an Eastern Air Lines DC-7B "over-cranched" on takeoff from New York to Washington, D.C., crashing into the Potomac River, raising the total dead in six disasters since Friday, Nov. 23, to 204 passengers and crewmen.

Twenty-six other persons aboard the Eastern flight perished when the plane crashed in the "mud" at Idlewild. Last March 1, an American Airlines 707 crashed shortly after takeoff, killing all 49 aboard.

The worst crash during the week was the crash of a Boeing 707 jet, slammed into the South American capital.

Three separate crashes, one in Paris, one on the island of Sao Tomé off Portuguese West Africa, and one near Rio de Janeiro, killed 56 persons last Friday.

Monday, 28 persons lost their lives when a Brazilian Vesp airplane and a light private plane collided while flying near Sao Paulo, Brazil.

"It's far and away the best-selling special stamp ever issued," said James F. Kelleher, information aide to Postmaster Gen. J. Edward Day.

Kelleher said advance demand for the stamp was so great that Day ordered a record first printing of 800 million. The previous high for a special issue was 300 million for the Mercury astronaut stamp commemorating John H. Glenn, Jr. space flight.

"We've already upped the Christmas order to 800 million," said Kelleher, "but now we face the possibility that we might not be able to print enough."

"This is the kind of problem the department anticipated when it announced last May that it would issue its first special Christmas stamp.

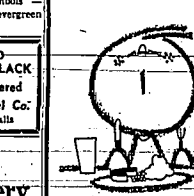

Tiny Republic Learns How To Make Lot From Little

SAN MARINO, Dec. 3 (AP)—This oldest and tiniest republic has learned to make a lot out of a little.

There is no public debt or unemployment. There hasn't been a murder in over a century. With postage stamps and its fingernail country has no troubles that a good tourist season doesn't solve.

San Marino claims one of the few European countries ever won back from communism.

According to San Marino historian, a persecuted Christian statesman fled here from Dalmatia and founded the republic 1,000 years ago. He later became pope. The 24-square mile country has no troubles that a good tourist season doesn't solve.

That started when Mother Superior Veronica Berti reopened a Catholic school at a convent which the communist government ordered closed.

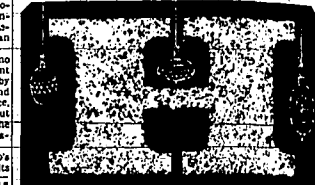

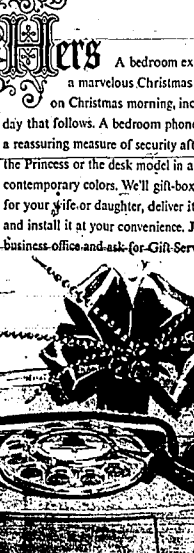
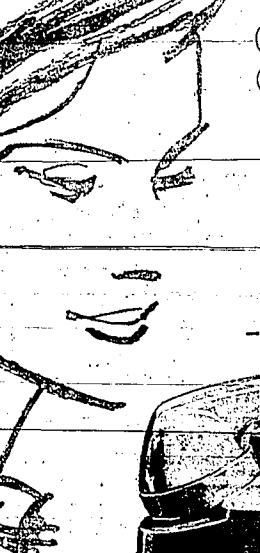

Bella Nabs Terrorist Of War Days

ALGERIA, Dec. 3 (AP)—One of the leading Muslim terrorists in France during the Algerian revolution was arrested yesterday for espionage to Premier Ahmed Ben Bella, it was reported.

The 40-year-old Algerian, identified as Mohammed Hachem, was arrested by Algerian soldiers, supported by Moroccan and Moroccan paratroopers, in a rooming house in Algiers. He is being held in a military prison. He is accused of being the "socialist" party of the revolution which opposes the National Liberation front of Ben Bella. The socialist party has been accused of establishing a "parallel" structure to the FLN and of sabotaging the FLN's efforts to win independence.

Author Calls for Federal Look Into Judges' Finances

WASHINGTON, Dec. 3 (AP)—A former government official urged today that the supreme court help in the business activities of all federal judges to assure public protection from judicial corruption.

Joseph Borkin, chief economist in the justice department's anti-trust division during the Roosevelt administration, made the proposal in "The Corrupt Judge," which is scheduled for publication tomorrow.

Borkin, a lawyer and author of two other widely read works, says he has compiled information on the financial activities of judges over "written" on the subject of judicial corruption in America.

"There have been comparatively few corrupt judges in the past," he said in an interview, "but the effects of their corruption has reflected on the character of the whole bench."

He said, however, "These are trying times for judges' weak character and bad investments. The stock market crash earlier this year was exactly the sort of economic crisis that tests a judge's honesty in the face of financial disaster."

The pattern of the past, he wrote in the book, has been for "unsettled economic conditions, particularly those associated with a depression, coupled with a deteriorating state of a judge's financial condition, (to produce) a climate in which judicial corruption can flourish."

He said "inequality and financial difficulty — resulting from falling investments — are the worst diseases than can afflict a judge. The pressure of creditors, plus attempts to recoup, have led to deeper involvement."

"Not only were these judges easy marks for corruptors," he wrote, "but they themselves were driven to place their judicial function on the market — for susceptible husbands and lawyers."

To prevent the emergence of such corrupt judges, he said, the supreme court should step in under its rule-making power and require statements from all circuit and district judges regarding their extrajudicial business activities.

Borkin suggested that these reports, of course, should remain confidential, available only to the supreme court and a special master, to be appointed with the power to call for further data if necessary.

The supreme ruler of the Roman Catholic church made his first public appearance in a week Sunday.

He stood for four minutes at the open window of his apartment, unsheltered from cold gusts sweeping St. Peter's square, to give his usual Sunday blessing to the crowd below.

In a strong clear voice carried by loudspeakers he said "Good health, which threatened to leave us, is about to return. Much more, it does return."

The 67-year-old pontiff looked a bit pale but rested and in good spirits. He raised his arms in his usual vigorous gesture of benediction.

"There have been comparatively few corrupt judges in the past," he said in an interview, "but the effects of their corruption has reflected on the character of the whole bench."

He said, however, "These are trying times for judges' weak character and bad investments. The stock market crash earlier this year was exactly the sort of economic crisis that tests a judge's honesty in the face of financial disaster."

The pattern of the past, he wrote in the book, has been for "unsettled economic conditions, particularly those associated with a depression, coupled with a deteriorating state of a judge's financial condition, (to produce) a climate in which judicial corruption can flourish."

He said "inequality and financial difficulty — resulting from falling investments — are the worst diseases than can afflict a judge. The pressure of creditors, plus attempts to recoup, have led to deeper involvement."

"Not only were these judges easy marks for corruptors," he wrote, "but they themselves were driven to place their judicial function on the market — for susceptible husbands and lawyers."

Slow Learner Can Be Helped By Parents

BY HAYWARD NEFFICK
Many individuals appear to have difficulty with the regular school program. The student may be a slow learner, of the category of the handicapped or retarded. He can be educated but needs a special approach and realistic goals.

Parents can be especially helpful with these children, who need individual attention. The children need patience, confidence, and understanding. They should not be pressured. Slow learners respond quite well to the proper approach.

The first step is to identify the child as a slow learner. Maximize his difficulties are not due to other causes. A delayed growth rate, psychological problems and physical handicaps can be different from specialized approaches. The school can do most helpful, as can your doctor or a local guidance clinic.

Once the problem is identified, you can be realistic about your expectations. The slow learner often loses confidence. He tends to give up easily. Help build up his picture of himself. Encourage him. Let him know that you will help with his problems. Do not over-protect him. He will become too dependent.

You can be particularly helpful in the area of instruction. Individual help is needed. A tutor is fine, but may be unaffordable. Work closely with his teacher. Your aid should be carefully planned to supplement the school.

Above all, do not become disappointed in a child who is a slow learner. Do recognize that he will have difficulties in school work. He can learn his skills very adequately, but may have increasing difficulty with the abstract. As the child grows older, his ability may increase. This may be due to the "maturational individuality" that the child remains a slow learner. It does not mean that he will be unproductive. It does mean that his talents lie outside the school area. Do not treat him differently. Discover and build upon his interests and skills. Show him that he has many reasons to respect himself.

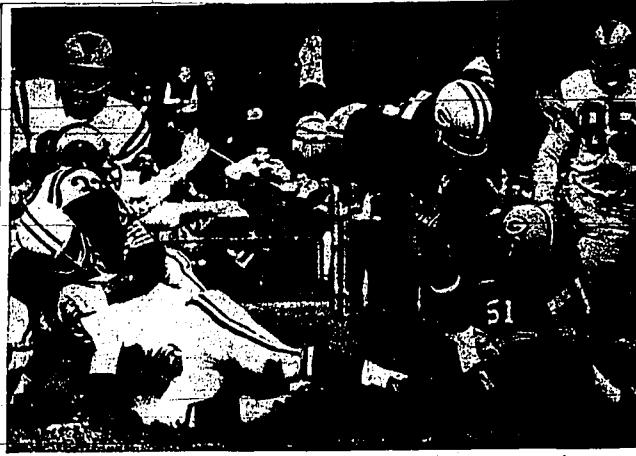
