Overhaul by Salazar Hits Key Posts

WASHINGTON, Dec. 4.—Prime Minister Antonio Oliveira Salazar yesterday overhauled his administration to bring new men into key posts controlling Portugal's domestic and African policies.
The 73-year-old premier remained firmly in control of the government although he stepped down from the post of defense minister he had been holding since the Angola crisis began last year.
The changes announced affected six cabinet posts and a number of jobs at the secretary and sub-secretary level.
New ministers were named for defense, the army, overseas affairs, economy, education and health. The incoming men have all given the Salazar government loyal service in previous posts.

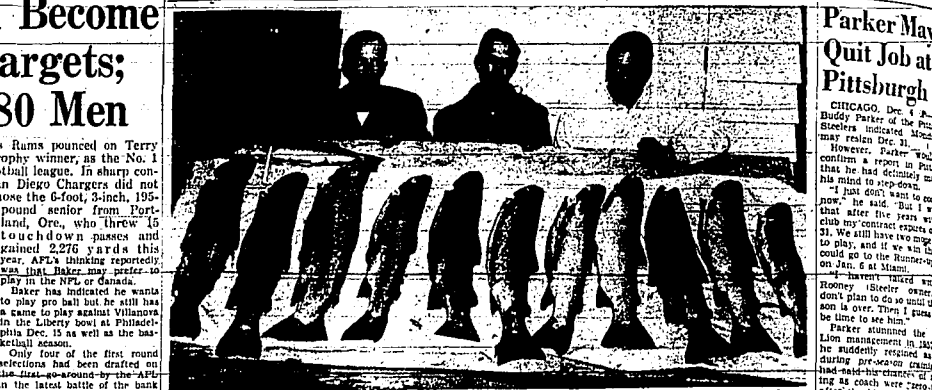
