## Air Force Faces Deadline, Probe In Anderson Case

MOUNTAIN HOME, Dec. 6 (AP)—Air force authorities faced today both a court-ordered deadline and the prospects of a congressional investigation of their handling of an airman, held on a military murder charge after he was freed by a civilian judge. The legal deadline was set Wednesday in U.S. district court in Boise, which gave the air force 20 days to prove its authority to hold Airtel Gerald M. Anderson.

Anderson, 25-year-old Snm (D-4) was held in a state court after another man confessed to the killings for which he was charged. Sheriff Earl Winter said investigation supported the statement by Theodore Thomas that he had killed it was he, and not Anderson, who killed a young Mountain Home housewife and her son last April.

On the basis of Winter's statement, Judge Marjorie S. Young ordered in a third district court hearing here last month that Anderson be held in custody. Dickie, 22-year-old itinerant laborer, is held in jail in Boise on a \$10,000 bond. He is charged with the killing of a 10-year-old girl. He also has been arrested by Boise police on charges of kidnapping the child's sleeping mother.

## Quiz Set for Suspect in T.K. Murder

A California man imprisoned in Lompoc, Calif., for car theft, will be interviewed next week by Twin Falls county Sheriff James H. ## Navy Reports Jet Bombers Leaving Cuba

WASHINGTON, Dec. 6 (AP)—Navy patrol planes have sighted 27 Soviet jet bombers about 200 miles off the coast of Cuba, the defense department announced today.

The Soviet ship Kastorniy is under way from the port of Mariel with five bombers in board. Navy spokesman Deputy Assistant Secretary of Defense told a news conference.

In addition, the Soviet ship Okhotsk is now east of the Bahamas with 12 of the jet bombers on board. Lennarson said the Okhotsk, which was seen on Monday with three bomber fighters on her deck, had made another stop to pick up nine more before heading out for its eastward course.

The Pentagon spokesman said earlier on the Kastorniy-carrying bomber fighters were voluntarily opened for U.S. air inspection by the Soviet crew.

Soviet diplomats have reportedly told U.S. officials at the United Nations that more than 40 bombers will be withdrawn from Cuba. They were said to have indicated this would be completed by Dec. 7.

### Idaho State College May Assume University Status

BOISE, Dec. 6 (AP)—Idaho State's 16th anniversary of the college appears almost certain to win university status during the next session of the legislature convening in January.

Sixty-nine per cent of the legislators responding to an Association Press survey say they favor the change and only 18 per cent oppose it. The others expressed no opinion.

The proposal passed the house in 1961 but failed by a close vote in the senate in the closing hours of the session. Its defeat was blamed on "horse trading" by both Democrats and Republicans.

Opposition to the change is centered in the northern Idaho counties where some legislators fear it would detract from the stature of the University of Idaho.

The State Board of Education announced its endorsement of the change earlier this year. A number of legislators indicated their support of the proposal is conditional on state bond backing.

Advocates argue during the 1961 session that Idaho State has a number of separate colleges, entitling it to university status. State colleges in many states have been reclassified universities in recent years.

Idaho State, formerly the southern branch of the university, became a four-year college in 1947. If university status is approved in 1962, it would fall on

### Chinese Red Blasts Russ, Yugoslavia

VIENNA, Dec. 6 (AP)—A Chinese communist official today attacked Yugoslavia by name and Russia by implication in a speech to the Czech Communist party congress. The 150 delegates lauded their fellow-in-progress, the Czech news agency reported.

Chunse deirats Wu Hsu Chan called Yugoslav President Tito "a brazen traitor to the working class" at a time when Tito was engaged in friendly talks with Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev in Moscow.

He implied that Russia retreated during the Cuban crisis when he said "these modern revisionists, these brazen traitors represented by the leading group of Yugoslavia, are submitting to imperialist pressure."

But at the end of Wu's message of greeting from the Peking central committee, the news agency said the delegates leaped up shouting "long live Czech-Soviet friendship."

He also defended China's European satellite, Albania, which often is attacked by critics aiming at China itself. He said these attacks "damage proletarian internationalism."

At this point, the agency said, there were "expressions of discontent on the part of congress delegates."

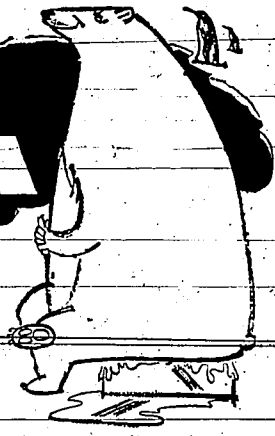

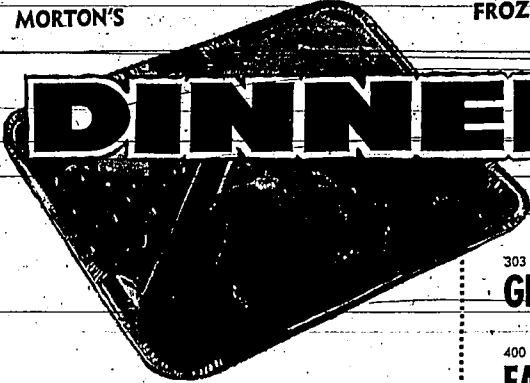

This brings the all-year rate of such spending to \$14 billion dollars and it continued to the end of the year would eclipse the previous high of \$13 billion dollars in 1941.

Government and private economists rely heavily on the survey because it shows, in addition to the amount of job-creating investment being done, what business executives think if they are confident, they expand.

The survey of future spending plans indicates a decline in the first quarter of 1943 to a \$1.7 billion dollar annual rate.

But some government economists note that industry itself underestimated its third quarter investment expenditures by about \$50 million dollars, speculated the gain will continue into next year.

**IRS Issues Denial Over Deductions**
