Rescuers Sight 16th Body In Struggle for Missing Miners

CARMICHAELS, Pa., Dec. 10 (AP)—Rescue teams probing an explosion-roked mine tunnel, where 37 miners were trapped, located today an increasingly higher number of bodies. The ninth body of the day was sighted shortly after 11 a.m., bringing to 16 the number of miners accounted for and leaving 21 still missing. The bodies were in an area 810 feet in advance of a fresh-air base located 1,750 feet from where a tremendous blast occurred Thursday afternoon at the U. S. Steel corporation Robins No. 3 mine at a depth of 650 feet.

Special Tests Are Taken by 65 Students

About 65 Twin Falls high school students have been given a variety of aptitude tests. Tests included the navy reserve officers training corps tests (NROTC), college entrance exam (CEEB), test administered by the American College Testing Program (ACT) test.

About 20 boys took the NROTC test Saturday morning. The test given by Kenneth Kells, high school guidance counselor, enables students to take part in the ROTC program at any of the 32 ROTC schools in the United States. Test results will be entered for each boy by Jan. 15.

NROTC schools in this area include the University of Idaho, Oregon State University, University of Utah and University of Washington.

CEEB and ACT tests were taken by 45 seniors. Both tests included one section which was identical—the school aptitude test.

The three-hour scholastic aptitude test included verbal and mathematical sections. The CEEB tests covered history, science, English composition, literature, intermediate and advanced mathematics and other subjects. Students were allowed to choose a maximum of three subject tests, each an hour long.

Each ACT test was 45 minutes long and covered four general areas—English, social studies, mathematics and the natural sciences.

Area schools requiring the CEEB tests for entrance include the University of Washington, University of Utah and Whitman College. Those requiring the ACT tests are Boise Junior College, Northwest Nazarene college, Tulee college and University of Utah.







WASHINGTON, Dec. 10.—One of the most dangerous dreams of American politicians is that the Russians and the mainland Chinese may some day lay claim at each other's throats.

Our state department, I have learned, dreams not of this. It knows that the differences of opinion can be exploited to create cleavages between the Reds. Although it expects as it can find, even expect armed warfare between the Chinese and the Russians.

The hope of such a split is nourished by the finger-pointing, espionage charges and Stalin's alleged persecution plans.

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

Power Company to Release Trout in Oxbow Reservoir

OXBOW, Dec. 10 (Special)— Idaho Power company announced Saturday that some 175,000 hatchery-bred rainbow trout will be planted in Oxbow dam's reservoir in the next eight months under a joint utility-agency program aimed at establishing a native strain of the game fish in the musmade lake.

About 12,000 rainbow trout in size, will be planted this week as the first phase of the large-scale program being conducted by the company in cooperation with the Idaho fish and game department and Oregon, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Commission, according to H. W. Moore, Idaho Power company vice president.

Other plants of trout ranging from 1-1/2 inches are scheduled to be made in February and June, with 60,000 being released in the reservoir in June alone.

Reapportionment Problem Darkly Faces Legislators

BOISE, Dec. 10 — Legislators (ab) legislative reapportionment as one of the major problems in 1953 but one says flatly the issue can't be solved equitably.

"I can see no way," said Sen. Lloyd F. Barron, Camas county Republican, "reapportionment can satisfactorily represent Idaho's many divergent areas."

Legislators contacted in a survey by the Associated Press said they do not choose to be pulled into reapportionment by a threat of court action.

"If the federal courts are going to write our Constitution and laws," added Rep. Harold Snow, "we just as well know it now."

A suit pending in U. S. district court, Boise, asks an order preventing any future legislative election until the United States Supreme Court has reapportioned on a basis of population.

Rep. Karl A. Kungler, Madison county Republican, referred to that lawsuit in saying "The legislators should solve this problem on a population basis or the courts or federal government will do it for us."

The Associated Press survey showed that 47 per cent of the legislators responding believe reapportionment will be one of their major problems. Fifty-two per cent said they favor reapportionment.

Twenty-eight per cent said they are opposed to any change in legislative membership but some of those listed the problem as one of the major ones ahead of them. The remainder expressed no opinion.

At present the senate is made up of one member from each county, regardless of population. The house has one member from each county and larger counties get one additional representative for each 10,000 population over 10,000.

To apportion membership equally and get five each county one legislator would require house membership of 607. That's because the smallest county has about 1,000 residents and the state's population is 857,171.

Alternative to achieve equal representation would be to lump a "number of counties—perhaps in one district, with one representative for all of them.

A freshman legislator, Rep. L. Owen Anderson, Bonneville county Republican, undoubtedly spoke the views of many lawmakers by saying the question "should be studied more thoroughly before a stand can be taken on it."

feared of the larger counties—Sen. J. Burns Seal, Boise county Republican, urged enactment of reapportionment legislation.

"Extreme care" should be exercised in reapportionment, he said, "in order to prevent extreme error in the opposite direction."


