11 New Magic Valley Highway Construction Projects Planned

SHOSHONE, Dec. 20—Eleven new construction projects are planned in Magic Valley by the state highway department in 1963, officials report. The construction in district two, which includes Magic Valley area from Almta west to Gooding and extending north to Challis, is part of a statewide program estimated to cost 40 million dollars. This figure does not include forest highway projects and projects estimated at two and one-half million dollars on county federal-aid secondary roads or 100 per cent public state and expenditure which are required for routine and special maintenance work on the state highway system.

Type III Anti-Polio Vaccine Gets Okay

WASHINGTON, Dec. 20 (AP)—Communities were urged on the go-head Wednesday to use the Sabin oral vaccine against polio—despite a "very small risk" among adults, especially those over 30 years old. Particular emphasis should be on treating children and young adults, where the danger of polio is greatest. Surgeon General Luther L. Terry of the U.S. public health service said. Terry made the announcement after a special advisory panel concluded three months of pondering whether one strain of the live virus might cause paralytic polio in some adults.

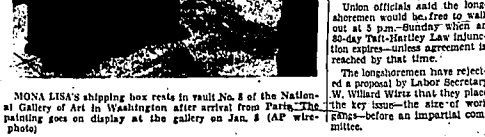

News Around Idaho

BOISE, Dec. 19—Idaho's 1962 road construction program, outlining \$147 million in highway projects, amounts to \$12 million dollars including freight highway projects. A total of 42 million dollars has been allotted for freight highway projects. Of this, \$25 million dollars is earmarked for Idaho's interstate system. The rest is for primary, secondary and urban road projects.

BOISE, Dec. 19—Sen. Len B. Jordan, R. Ida., has questioned the advantages of an extension of Bonneville power administration authority to southern Idaho. He said there are no public hearings on the proposal and that he would oppose at this time any bill to provide for transmission lines to carry BPA power to the southern Idaho.

BOISE, Dec. 20—A trial will be held to determine the legality of a contract for constructing a new heating plant at the University of Idaho. Judge J. Ray Durich refused Wednesday to grant summary judgment in a motion which challenges the contract awarded to the Blumhagen Mechanical and Metal Products, Inc., of Idaho Falls.

BOISE, Dec. 19—The Idaho department of commerce and development reports Idaho is oil-ranked only by Utah among the 48 states for the basic efficiency of its residents. The department said a nationwide survey shows that only 32 percent of Idaho's population 25 years of age or older have had less than five years of schooling.

IDAHO FALLS, Dec. 20—Demand for Idaho russet potatoes is expected to be strong during the next few weeks, but some growers are being closed and many operated on a part time basis only, John A. Kennedy, representative of the federal-state market news service, said today. He said Idaho russet prices are expected to rise in the next few weeks. He noted the weather is moderate for this time of year. Prices are quoted at \$170-12 and \$180-12 for No. 1 and No. 2, respectively. Prices are up \$2.00 from the past three months. Prices at one time reached \$2.25 for the best quality of No. 1's but they had since then have leveled off.

LEWISTON, Dec. 20—Abolishment of Idaho's runoff law is sought by the north-central Idaho district of county commissioners and clerks. The law, enacted in 1953, gave a runoff if no candidate in a race receives 40 percent of the vote.

IDAHO FALLS, Dec. 20—Christmas caroling tailored especially for Idaho Falls residents of German descent and residents who have visited Germany, will fill the night air tonight from 7 to 9. The program will be given by the German instructor at the Idaho Falls Senior high school and O. E. Boll of Central Junior High school have arranged a caroling tour for a group of 60 or 70 of his students and former students.

IDAHO FALLS, Dec. 20—In most cases, metals are engineered by metallurgical engineers and physicists and hardware department, Phillips Petroleum company, advised members of the American society of mechanical engineers meeting Tuesday night at the Hotel Bonanza. He reported the results of a study which gave a detailed explanation of the effects of radiation on properties of the metal by making the material stronger.

Judge Fred M. Taylor ruled in favor of the Atlas company, which discovered an earlier restraining order filed in the first district court in Shoshone county. The federal court order also directed the Lucky Friday company to stop interfering with Atlas exploration work in the area.

IDAHO FALLS, Dec. 20—Officers in district six of the Idaho state police made a 2000-mile patrol in the area around the Idaho Falls area, according to Lieut. Ervin Dunn, district commander. He said that of the 231 arrests, six were on charges of driving without a license. Dunn reported 110 citations for 35,243 miles traveled by patrolmen throughout the sprawling east Idaho area.

BOISE, Dec. 20—Frank Freeman, commandant of the Idaho soldiers home, was critical yesterday of a \$22,000 renovation project at the institution. He said the renovation project was being done by the Richardson Construction company of Boise was the only bidder on the project. Freeman said the work involving electrical and plumbing systems and interior remodeling, "you couldn't find this whole place up for \$22,000," Freeman said.

200th U.S. ICBM Aimed At Russians

WASHINGTON, Dec. 20—The United States slipped intercontinental ballistic missile at the Soviet Union on Tuesday. The missile, which provides the nation with at least twice the capability of the Soviet Union's ICBM force.

This mark was reached when the missile was turned over to the military air command, 12th military squadron of Alaska at the Plattsburgh air force base in upstate New York.

The Plattsburgh squadron completes the planet's Atlas force and winds up the final phase of the U.S. missile armament program slightly ahead of schedule.

Just a few years ago, critics of defense policies under the Eisenhower administration were forecasting a major gap would develop about this time, with the United States on the short end of a 4-1 or 3-1 margin.

But most qualified authorities believe the Russians have only between 75 and 100 ICBMs at this time.

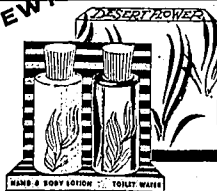

School Committee Chairman Richard Hooper last night flatly said, "I will not call an emergency meeting to force Christmas trees into three schools."

His decision was announced after a heated two-hour public hearing attended by more than 750 townfolk.

The hearing was called after about 1,000 residents signed petitions urging the committee to rescind the ban.

But Hooper indicated that the school committee probably would go along with the recommendation of a special interfaith committee which will study the problem and report next Oct. 15.

Communists' Addresses Are Refused

ALBANY, N.Y., Dec. 20 (AP)—An avowed communist has no right to lecture at a state university or college in New York, a state supreme court justice ruled yesterday.

Justice Russell G. Hunt, citing FBI director J. Edgar Hoover as his authority, ruled specifically that Herbert Aptheker, U.S. Communist party national committee member, could not deliver a speech at the University of New York State at Buffalo.

A spokesman for the state university said the ruling probably will be taken before the appellate division of the state supreme court.

Aptheker was scheduled as the final speaker in a series of lectures on contemporary politics which began last May before the University of Buffalo merged with the state system. The four previous lectures covered fascism, socialism, liberalism and conservatism.

A taxpayer's suit by William M. Egan of Ballston Lake, an unsuccessful Democratic candidate for congress last month, prevented Aptheker from speaking at the university Oct. 31. Just two hours before the lecture was to begin.

Warden Olin Blackwell of Alcatraz said both convicts were still being treated at the prison hospital for exposure. No date for their arraignment was set by U.S. District Judge Oliver J. Carter.

The two men got out through a window in the basement of their kitchen unit. Scott was the first to escape in the history of the island penitentiary to reach the mainland.

Just before serving, place piece of ice in bowl and mix in 4 pts. pale ginger ale with chilled juices. Float thin slices of 1 orange, 1 lemon, 1 lime on surface. Drop or surround bowl with frosted grapes.
