Weather Use As Weapon Is Studied

WASHINGTON, Jan. 1 (AP)—Vice Adm. William F. Raborn said Monday the navy is planning a 10-year study of weather control including its possible use as a destructive weapon.

"The capability to change the direction of destructive storms and guide them toward enemy concentrations may exist in the quiet arsenal of the naval tactical commander," he said.

Writing in the Monthly Naval Institute proceedings, Raborn added, "An ability to control the world's weather could introduce greater changes in warfare than those which occurred in 1945 with the explosion of the first nuclear weapon."

The three star admiral, who is deputy chief for research and development, also said that weather control might be used to cause extensive flooding, "or even to bring a new 'ice age' upon the enemy."

Other possibilities include interruption of the enemy's communications, destruction of ships at sea, interfering with the operation of radio-guided or remotely controlled vehicles, creating fog cover for friendly forces, and neutralizing sea mines.

CAB to Halt Upswing of Air Subsidy

WASHINGTON, Jan. 1 (AP)—The Civil Aeronautics Board will take several steps soon to halt an upward trend in the subsidy paid to the 10 local service airlines for carrying mail to the smaller communities.

To clear the way for the air-mail rate increase, the board will open, effective Jan. 1, the subsidy class rate it established a year ago.

The board said a new rate will go into effect immediately, on a tentative basis, on Jan. 1.

The board estimated that the revised class rate would yield \$45 million more in revenue, a net gain of \$1 million.

The CAB estimated that under the new subsidy scale annual gross subsidy payments to the airlines by next July 1 will include:

- Banana, Las Vegas, Nev., \$2,327,000;
- Frontier, Denver, \$1,250,000;
- West Coast, Seattle, \$1,100,000.

Nevada Eases Up Notch in Population

CARSON CITY, Nev., Jan. 1 (AP)—Nevada, the fastest growing state in the union for the past two years, percentage-wise, Monday claimed to have moved past Wyoming as the nation's 46th-most-populous state.

Gov. Grant Sawyer said current population estimates show Nevada at more than 400,000 with Wyoming at 370,000. He said the Nevada estimate is based on a pupil to population ratio determined during the 1950 census.

"This is a happy occasion for us," Sawyer said. "And I'm especially pleased that our personal income, employment and other areas of economic activity are keeping pace with this population surge."

Sawyer said Nevada is gaining an average of 3,000 new residents a month. At the same time, Sawyer issued a warning to Vermont, the 47th most populous state.

"Nevada may have already passed Vermont," Sawyer declared. "And if that, as is certainly will in the next 100 or two."

Nevada has been the fastest growing state from the time it became a state in 1864 until Alaska was admitted to the union in 1959.

Tunis Leader Recovering After Illness

TUNIS, Tunisia, Jan. 1 (AP)—Tunisian President Habib Bourguiba has been critically ill with a focal infection but is on the road to recovery now, it was announced Monday night.

Doctors attending the 59-year-old chief of state at his palace at Le Kef, 100 miles west of Tunis, described the infection as a form of focal phlebitis which produced painful carbuncles on the upper lip and nose.

Chiropractor Use of X-Ray Is Ruled Out

ALBANY, Jan. 7 (AP) — The court of appeals Monday said 5-3 in upholding a controversial health regulation barring chiropractors in New York state from using X-ray equipment in the treatment of patients.

The majority opinion was written by Associate Judge John Van Voorhis. It followed much of the same stand taken by State Health Commissioner Herman P. Hillboe.

Chief Judge Charles DeLoach took a strong dissent in which he was joined by Judge Marvin Dyck.

Target of the court action was regulation 19, which was added to the New York state sanitary code in 1957 and which became effective July 1, 1958. The chiropractic association, the Ernest E. Quatro, Inc., Rochester, challenged the regulation.

It was not until January of 1961 that the regulation was upheld in 1961 former Chief Judge of the Court of Appeals Albert Conway, who had been hearing the case as a referee, dismissed the action.

Pronounced after three years of study, regulation 19 states that "no person shall apply radiation to a human being unless such person is licensed or otherwise authorized to practice osteopathy, dentistry, podiatry or osteopathy under provisions of the education law of the state of New York."

Van Voorhis explained that testimony by scientists as well as his own study indicates such a reference and the appellate division that the "effect of x-ray exposure in the vertebral column is deleterious, additive and cumulative."

The judge said that "expert testimony was virtually uncontradicted."

It is not for the courts to determine which scientific view is correct in ruling whether the use of x-rays is properly exercised, Van Voorhis said.

RICHMOND, Calif. Jan. 7 (AP) — A sympathetic telephone operator helped reunite a young Montana man with his father, whom he had not seen in 12 years.

Don Christopher, 24, Millet City, Mont., had been hitchhiking in California and found himself in Bakersfield, nearly broke. He decided to try to contact his father, Donald Eugene Christopher, whom he knew lived somewhere in the state.

Checking telephone directories in the public library, Christopher discovered listings for Don Christopher.

But he explained his plight to an operator last Friday. She began placing collect calls to persons named D. E. Christopher, asking those who answered, "Do you have a son, Don, whom you have not seen in 12 years?"

A Sacramento woman accepted the call. She had a son who was missing, and she hoped that it was he who was calling.

U. S., Japan Sign Tariff Agreements
WASHINGTON, Jan. 7 (AP) — The United States and Japan signed two long-term trade agreements Monday. It was announced by the state department.

The agreements granted compensatory tariff reductions to Japan for U. S. increases in carpet and glass duties imposed last summer.

The concessions involve three items which Japan sold 7 million dollars to the United States in 1961—file-handcarcuffs, and handfiles valued at more than \$2 million per dozen, alkali soaps and toy musical instruments.

In the other agreement Japan granted tariff concessions to the United States in compensation for previous Japanese tariff charges. This list included 24 items amounting to some five million dollars in trade.

The state department also announced signing of a tariff agreement with Spain in Geneva.

The United States agreed to reduce "10 duties on seven commodities amounting to 11.8 million dollars in trade in 1961—the main items are bulk, olive oil and sherry-type wines.

Spain granted tariff reductions to the United States on 59 commodities which represented in 1961 29.3 million dollars in U. S. exports to Spain.

MILWAUKEE, Wis., Jan. 7 (AP) — The federal bureau of investigation said Monday it was cooperating with authorities in 11 Wisconsin communities where attempts were made to bilk companies.

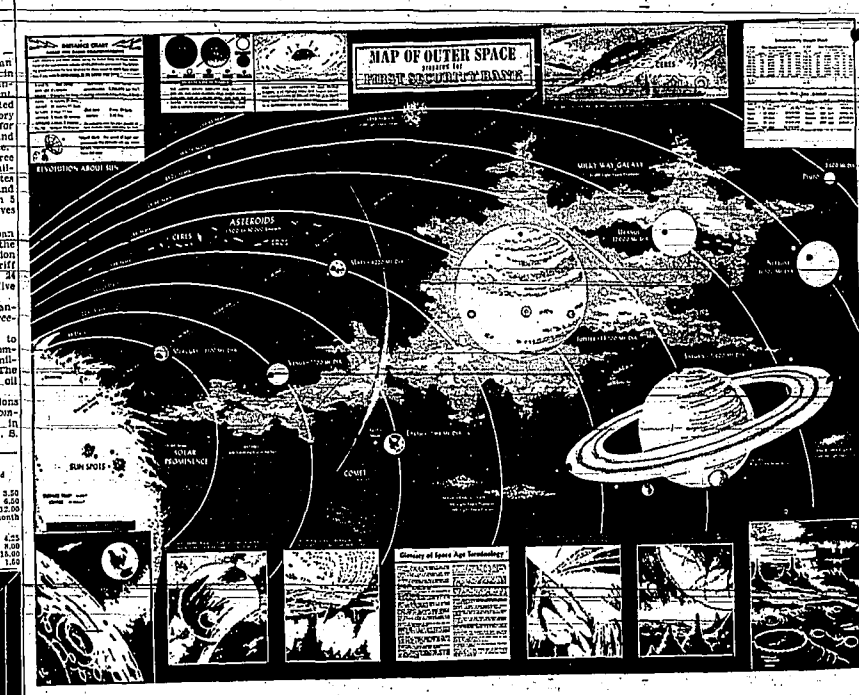
