# Narcotics Bring Arrest Of Eight Men

PORTLAND, Jan. 16—Eight men were arrested late Tuesday night charged with violating narcotic laws. All had been named in a grand jury indictment returned in court.

# Negro Draws Big Florida Ballot For Commission

DEERFIELD BEACH, Fla., Jan. 16 (AP)—Emanuel Knowles, 28, the first Negro ever to run for the Deerfield Beach city commission, drew more votes than any of the six white candidates in the primary election.

Knowles, a contractor, and the next five ranking vote-getters Tuesday's primary will contend for three commission seats in the regular election Jan. 20.

Deerfield Beach is a small East coast town about 23 miles north of Miami. It had 2,277 registered voters, including 813 Negroes.

Knowles pulled 124 votes. The runner-up was Robert Crisp, who took 880. Third was an incumbent, Commissioner James Mitchell, who got 684.

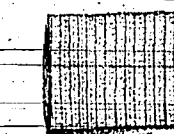

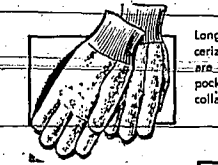

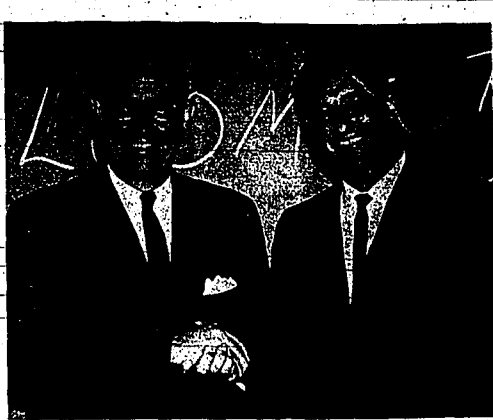

## Governors Take Posts Across U. S.

Here are highlights from inaugural addresses made by six governors sworn in Tuesday:

Gov. Orval E. Faubus, Democrat of Arkansas—proposed a constitutional amendment for city and county taxes and endorsed a proposal to increase truck weight limits in his first term inaugural address to the Arkansas legislature.

Faubus, 53, who was the central figure in Little Rock's 1957-58 integration crisis, did not mention integration in his inaugural speech.

Frank O. Clement, Democrat of Tennessee—"When state govern-

ment remains stagnant, it becomes state, inept and inadequate."

Carl Z. Sanders, Democrat of Georgia—"We are faced with both the greatest challenge and the brightest promise of our history... We shall apply as the test of our progress not whether we add to those who have much but whether we provide larger opportunities for those who have little."

William W. Scranton, Republican of Pennsylvania—"Our Commonwealth has the resources, the human strength, the set-up and good from which greatness is made."

Donald S. Russell, Democrat of South Carolina—"Of course, financial needs will not be the only problem for education. There will be other and varied difficulties. But we shall meet with courage and vigor the tasks which hold for us and we shall work out our problems conscientiously."

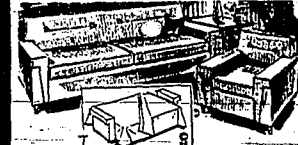

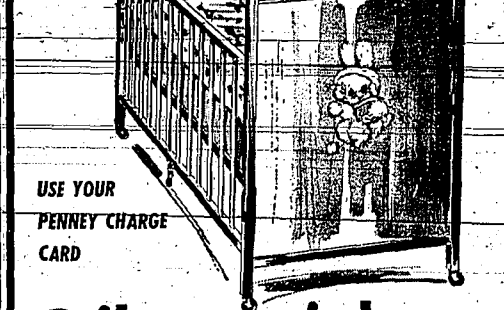

## Space Safety Device Seen For Car Use

DETROIT, Jan. 16 (AP)—A leading device designed for the Apollo spacecraft may some day be used as a safety feature in automobiles.

This opinion was expressed in a 10-page report presented to a Society of Automotive Engineers convention by Howard Gardner, an official of the MIT research institute.

The device is called a frangible tube entry absorber. A series of tubes attached to the Apollo will shatter on impact, allowing the craft to hit ground safely at an impact speed of 40 miles an hour.

Such a device could be attached to cars to protect people in accidents, Gardner suggested. He said the system could "twice as well" on your whole automobile.

Or, he added, "it could take some of the impact out of train wrecks, and it should be better than the emergency springs now found at the bottom of elevator shafts."
