**SYNOPSIS AND AGRICULTURAL SUMMARY**  
High pressure over Idaho, over the western United States. The storm system over the week-end was carried in the southern flow of air to the south and as a result the entire southern United States—westward, southward, and eastward—was under a storm system moving across the southern Rockies Monday morning and is expected to dump large amounts of moisture from the Gulf of Mexico and southeastern states as it moves over the Idaho area. The air has pushed into the Pacific Northwest and has caused the threat of rain in the Idaho area. This low pressure center is expected to move northward through Idaho this week-end. As a result, southern Idaho is enjoying a temporary clearing of weather and a more stable atmosphere. A temporary clearing is expected to persist over the western states together with another storm system working its way into southern Idaho on Thursday and Friday. Snow showers are expected to occur in the mountain areas on southern Idaho Tuesday with little if any precipitation expected in the valleys. Afternoon temperatures will show a change with maximum readings in the 40's and 50's nighttime temperatures will be a little cooler in most valleys with readings in the teens and 20's.

## FIVE-DAY FORECAST

The forecast upper air pressure pattern indicates the formation of a low pressure trough over the far western states during the next five days. ## Farm Bureau

### At Gooding Meets Friday

**GOODING, March 18**—The Gooding county Farm Bureau will meet at 8 p.m. Friday at the Lincoln Inn, Gooding. Percy V. Charlman, will report on a talk about the wheat referendum scheduled by Dr. Warren E. Collins in Twin Falls Tuesday.

Dr. Collins is assistant director of the commodity division of the American Farm Bureau Federation. He has worked with the United States department of agriculture and as representative of the Illinois Agricultural Association.

### Progress for Broadford Mine Listed

**BROADFORD, March 18**—Joe A. Foster, president of the Idaho Farm Bureau, said today that progress for the Broadford mine being developed here, reports encouraging progress for Federal Resource Corporation.

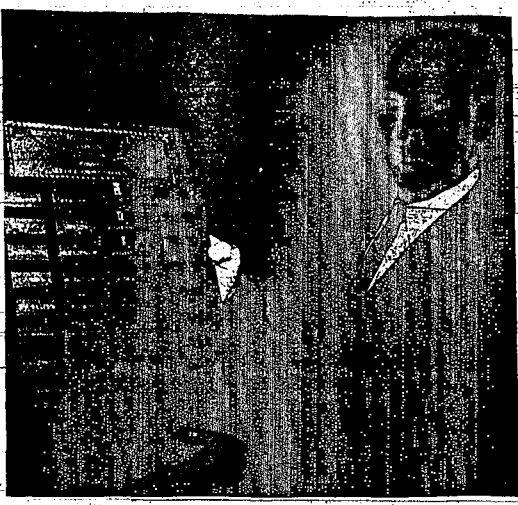

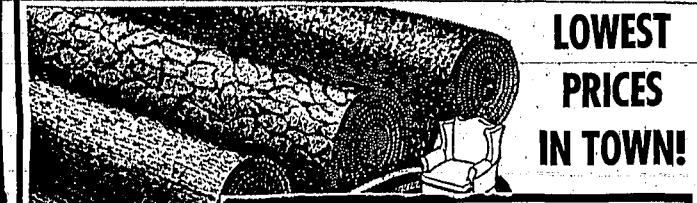


